Summary of Incident and Actions Taken
(in chronological order)

May 7th, 2020

Good Afternoon:

Rangers s.15(1)(f) 64) and s.15(1)(f) (36) monitored several major Stanley Park sites that had been occupied recently. The day commenced at 08:30 hr when Rangers s.15(1)(f) and s.15(1)(f) (84) travelled into a small camp (in the woods between s.19(1) , with Carnegie Outreach Coordinator John Norton, to talk with s.22(1) . s.22(1) has been living in this location for the past s.22(1) initially s.22(1) claimed to be avoiding Covid -19 infection. s.22(1) camp is small and neat, but regardless s.22(1) has to go... Mr Norton and s.22(1) s.22(1) had a pleasant conversation. John Norton believes he can make arrangements for s.22(1) within the next week.

Rangers s.15(1)(f) then pushed on to relieve Park Ranger checkpoints, after which they resumed activity in the forest. First up was the removal of a small camp near the s.19(1) in Stanley Park. The owner, an s.22(1) s.22(1) was informed s.22(1) could not stay in the park. s.22(1) appeared to be compliant, and commenced taking down s.22(1) small structure.

Next on the list was the removal of items associated with the s.22(1) Camp which was attended yesterday. The camp owner s.22(1) had left when Rangers arrived. However there was a moderate amount of debris, along with the obligatory 7 or 8 bottles of urine and other camp remnants too disgusting to recollect. The individual had planned on staying for some time from all appearances. s.22(1) was in the process of creating a wooden fence around s.22(1) camp area. It appeared s.22(1) has had several fires at this location, with a small fire-pit near to the tent location. All human debris was removed from the site. This is another location that provides a graphic example of the damage that these human "camps" do to the natural environment. The woods surrounding the area of camp use are bathed in soft velvety green mosses under a lower lit tree canopy. The camp area is a bare ground scar, seemingly hacked out of the forest floor... No vegetation, only twisted branches and manipulated logs...recovery will take a long time if left to occur naturally. Upon leaving, Rangers attempted to close up the entry trail at the point where it meets with s.19(1) . Rangers carefully shifted a few smaller branches and forest material to try and disguise the entry point to the camp. Rangers will monitor any further activity . This may be a worthwhile place for active restoration work by Urban Forestry or SPES.

At 12:00 Noon, Rangers checked sites in the s.19(1) area (part of the s.19(1)), but were pleased to find no return camp activity. They then moved on to inspect the relatively pristine woods off s.19(1) . This is an area accessed by a smaller trail which leads to the s.19(1) area for Stanley Park). Rangers walked the length of the trail, checking small side trails for signs of human activity. There were small piles of torn paper along one of these trails, indicating possible route marking. However, no camps were found. It does appear that mountain biking activity may bear watching in this area.

Rangers returned to the Service Yard at 13:15 hr.

May 8th, 2020

Good Afternoon:

A very productive day which included several activities. There was considerable variety to our work, including:

Rangers s.15(1)(f) and s.15(1)(f) initially checked in on an unusual situation in which a well known transient from English Bay s.22(1) was found sleeping in one of the AAA horse stalls in the Stanley Park Service Yard..complete with Horse. s.22(1) may have been fortunate to avoid being trampled. VPD were called by the owner to remove s.22(1) Later Rangers shepherded s.22(1) out of the waste disposal compactor area. s.22(1) whereabouts in the park are currently unknown but s.22(1) was aimlessly checking bins when last seen.

Rangers then proceeded to check cleared camp areas on the west side of the park. A new moderately sized dump site was located in a relatively pristine area off s.19(1). Camp areas along the s.19(1) corridor were all found to be empty, with small amounts of debris removed as we moved through.

Rangers then assisted with traffic barricade removals in the long straight stretch of road past the s.19(1) (a road mapping exercise required this).

Then back into the forest, to remove the s.19(1) debris pile. (1/3 truckload – awkward to remove, partially buried plastic dump area, but now complete.)

A call was received to assist in the search for an injured eagle near the Hollow Tree at this point. Rangers attended , and met a member of the public who pointed out the bird. It was a mature eagle, likely at least 5-6 years, on the ground in the woods, wings stretched out, not going anywhere. Rangers waited until Orphaned Wildlife Society (OWL) arrived with crate and net. Ranger s.15(1)(f) participated with the OWL volunteer in successfully catching up the eagle safely and placing it in the transport crate. All went smoothly with the capture.

Rangers then responded to a call re a camp in the woods near s.19(1). A moderate amount of garbage plus tent was found. The camp was active. Rangers s.15(1)(f) removed the tent, carts and other debris from the site. (1 Full truckload).

From this location Rangers continued to a second location along s.19(1). Ranger s.15(1)(f) had removed a small camp from the woods on the north side of the road.. The trucks were full to overflowing when Rangers finally turned for home, and Lunch.
