This memo highlights Labour Force Survey (LFS) data published by Statistics Canada for the reference weeks from June to September 2021. The LFS provides estimates for the unemployment rate and employment totals by industry and occupation on a monthly basis. The information presented in these memos illustrates the impact of COVID-19 on Vancouver's labour force and economy over the most recent 3-month period since the Pandemic began. This information is meant to be viewed in conjunction with other socio-economic and community statistics to form a cohesive picture of the City's current state and assist with recovery and resilience planning. This information will be posted to the City website and shared with the business community.



Important notes about the data

The statistics presented in this memo are for the Metro Vancouver region as the Census Metropolitan Area (CMA) is the smallest geography level available for LFS data tables published by Statistics Canada. Throughout this memo, the term "Vancouver" refers to the Vancouver CMA. The LFS data used to create the statistics presented in this report are not seasonally adjusted¹.

Changes in employment totals and unemployment rate

Employment in Vancouver decreased from 1,520,000 in June to 1,518,300 in September for a loss of 1,700 (0.1%) jobs. Between June and September, the unemployment rate decreased by 1.2 percentage points to 6.0% in Vancouver. In September 2021, the region had 29,900 (2.0%) more employed workers than in February 2020. This slight increase shows employment numbers have returned to pre-pandemic levels of February 2020. The peak of losses of 251,200 (-17.2%) employed workers was recorded between February and April 2020. Nationally, the unemployment rate decreased by 0.9 percentage points between June and September 2021 to 6.9%.

The fluctuations in employment levels from March 2020 to September 2021 reflects changes to public health restrictions and other measures, including increased limitations on some businesses under "circuit breaker" restrictions in late March 2021 followed by the gradual easing of some provincial restrictions May 25th and June 15th, 2021. The province moved to Step 3 of the Restart Plan June 30, 2021, relaxing a number of major orders related to the COVID-19 pandemic preceding the reference weeks in July and August (July 11th to July 17th, 2021 and August 15th to August 21st, 2021). Subsequently, on September 13th, during the Census reference week (September 12th to September 18th, 2021), the province introduced proof of vaccination at most indoor public spaces. Please see Figure 7 for a full list of announcements and orders starting on March 12, 2020. The next labour force survey memo will be distributed in January 2022 and will include new data for October, November, and December.

As the statistics have shown a sustained return of overall employment to pre-pandemic levels, PDS will suspend further issuance of these memos after the next issue in January of 2022. Staff will continue to monitor economic conditions and will report back to Council as needed.

¹ Seasonal adjustments to labour force data are done to eliminate the effect of seasonal and calendar influences (e.g. seasonal shopping or agricultural work).






Figure 1 – Unemployment rate and monthly employment change in Metro Vancouver

Changes in employment totals and unemployment rate – three-month moving average

The following sections highlight statistics related to employment change by industry and occupation that are published as a three-month moving average for Vancouver; therefore, data published for September is an average of July, August, and September. Using this three-month moving average data, employment in September was 1,524,500 and the unemployment rate was 7.1%. The following chart shows the monthly change of employment and the unemployment rate using three-month moving average employment data.

Industry overview

Employment in the wholesale and retail trade industry experienced the largest three-month gain in Metro Vancouver, increasing by 22,600 workers (10.3%). The second largest sector

employment increase was in the accommodation and food services sector, which gained 20,000 workers (24.6%). The third largest employment gain was in public administration, which increased by 6,100 jobs (10.4%). Between June and September, the largest employment decline was in the professional, scientific and technical services sector, which declined by 8,700 people, a decrease of -4.7% of its workforce. The second most losses were seen in educational services, which declined by an additional 8,400 workers (-8.3%) between June and September. The business, building and other support services sector declined by 3,400 workers (-4.7%) over the three month period.





Figure 3 - Employment change by industry in Metro Vancouver, June to September

Occupation overview

Occupation employment data for Vancouver is published as a three-month moving average; therefore, data published for September is an average of July, August, and September. Employment in business, finance and administration occupations experienced the largest three-month gain in Metro Vancouver, increasing by 34,500 jobs (13.6%) between June and September. The second largest increase was in occupations in sales and services occupations, which gained 18,800 workers (5.5%). The third largest employment gain was in health occupations, which increased by 13,200 jobs (11.6%). Between June and September, employment in trades, transport and equipment operators occupations experienced the largest decrease with 17,300 less workers (-9.6%). The second largest loss was attributed to natural and applied sciences occupations and related occupations, which experienced a decrease of 15,700 jobs (-8.9%). Management occupations declined the third most, with a loss of 8,000 (- 5.6%).

Figure 4 - Employment change by occupations in Metro Vancouver, June to September



The largest increase in employment by detailed occupations was for sales representatives and salespersons - wholesale and retail trade occupations, which increased by 18,100 (+28.0%) workers between June and September. Other occupations with the most employment gains from June to September include:

- Specialized middle management occupations (+14,500; +37.8%)
- Technical occupations in health (+14,000; +58.8%)
- Service support and other service occupations, n.e.c. (+13,000; +22.6%)
- Professional occupations in business and finance (+12,700; +15.9%)

The largest decrease in employment by detailed occupations was for industrial, electrical and construction trades, which lost 10,500 (-17.2%) workers between June and September. Other occupations with significant employment losses include:

- Professional occupations in natural and applied sciences (-9,800; -7.5%)
- Assisting occupations in support of health services (-8,900; -28.5%)
- Middle management occupations in retail and wholesale trade and customer services (-8,900; -17.4%)
- Maintenance and equipment operation trades (-8,600; -20.6%)

Figure 6 - Most employment loses by detailed occupation, June to September


