Hello Ziggy,

Roxanne gave you an e-mail that is only accessible from other DND accounts. That "intern" means it is internal to our DND network. While we do use it when we do not know who will be on staff for our operations it wouldn't have worked for you. Roxanne was not given any hand over and was managing as much as possible. You got caught up in a period with zero full time environment staff for mainland BC.

I cannot tell you what the next brilliant idea for the structure of operations will be, but RP Ops is the landowner as ASU Chilliwack was previously the landowner. The address I gave you is the best method because it has not changed since 1998, though the *person* can change as often as every 2 years. The OC (officer commanding) is the only person with the authority to sign to grant you 'landowner permission' as per the permit requirements. I would only be involved in that I would keep a copy of the permit and authorization, as part of my support to RP Ops. Management of pests is the duty of RP Ops. Once you had authorization you would be required to coordinate with HMCS Discovery staff. Properly, you would plan a time for work to be conducted, the commissioner would be expecting you and have your name, and you would be escorted while on the island.

I have forwarded your e-mail to the OC and the unit env o at Discovery (last month, I just haven't had space to respond quickly myself), so that they are aware requests were made. I can't do much beyond that to ensure follow-up. I had my biologist on site in April to discuss geese management with staff. I believe that an early application next year may be well received, though this year I believe they have chosen to manage the geese through harassment as per the Env Canada recommendations.

Hello Angela,

Sorry I haven't responded sooner. It has been extremely busy and I only work part time so I do all my emailing from home.

So, here is the situation. I sent an email to the email address as below which Roxanne Snook gave me last year. And then tried emailing Roxanne when that email address did not go through. Of course I received no reply. In early march I went to the guard house at Deadman's and did manage to talk briefly to the commanding office, gave him a copy of my permit, a copy of my correspondence below from Roxanne, as well as my business card which has all of my contact info, and asked him to pass that along to whoever was able to give me permission to access the island. I did not have a blank letter of authorization on me at the time but told the CO if someone would email me I could send a copy to be signed.

I did not hear anything back though I returned to Deadman's twice and dropped off a blank letter of authorization, and the guard told me to just wait the request was in process, and no, he could not give me anyone's contact info to follow up with. The last time I went to the guard house, Greg was with me and he mentioned he had a contact and would make enquiries.

If I send a snail mail request to the address you gave me, I think it will be too late for this year's nesting season. Should I send my request next year to that address or will it likely change? Also, may I suggest Deadman's get its own addling permit? The geese only briefly impact the island, but we have a growing population of resident Canada geese in Stanley Park particularly and we are heading towards the numbers we had back in the 1980's to 1990's when we had yearly adult roundups.

Hi Ziggy,

An abandoned Canada Goose nest was recently located on a rooftop at HMCS Discovery during an assessment to replace the roof (see attached). In order to proceed with the work this nest and the eggs would need to be removed and discarded. After contacting Gloria White in the permitting department of Environment Canada she informed that you still hold a valid permit to manage Canada Geese on the property. As the permitting process takes 35 days after submitting the application we were wondering if there was any way that you could assist us in removing this nest so that the work can proceed on schedule.

I am cc'ing WO Keddy and Major Mathisen here who may have more to add on this request and facilitate your participation if you are willing and interested in assisting.

Good morning,

If the City of Vancouver wishes to access the HMCS Discovery property for the purposes of conducting its Canada Goose egg addling program again this year I'd just like to give a reminder of the proper procedures to follow to gain access.

Environmentally the DND BC Mainland Environment Office supports the conduct of this work as an excess of geese causes harm to the environment and thus understand that under Integrated Pest Management control measures may need to be taken. That said, granting access to the property is the responsibility of DND Real Property Operations (RP Ops) Pacific. Once you have a valid permit from Environment Canada permission to access the property must be signed off by Major Mathisen of RP Ops (cc'd here). Once you have the permit and authorization letter you will be required to contact Sgt Prentis (also cc'd here) to arrange for an escort while on the property.



Hello everyone,

As events and tourist season winds down in Stanley Park, we are now getting ready to start Phase 2 of

the Stanley Park Pavement Repair project. The project will be again delivered in collaboration with our colleagues in CoV Engineering.

I have attached a revised plan for Phase 2; as we are now at the mercy of the weather we will be preparing to complete as much of the work that the weather allows. Those of you that will be more directly affected will be contacted separately to discuss strategies to lessen any impact to your operations.

We are monitoring the weather and will start the work at the first good weather window after September 24.

The provisional plan at the moment is:

- **Section 1 – Prospect Point:** this will be the first section and is anticipated to take between 2-3 days to complete. We will be alternating traffic along Park Dr. to allow vehicles to still go around the park. However, we will require closure of the entrance into the park from the causeway for at least two half days (6 am – 1 pm). We have been coordinating with MoTI on messaging and traffic control.
- **Section 2 – Administration Building:** this will be the second section and will start right after Section 1. It is anticipated that the work here will take us another 2-3 days. Access to the park board parking will be through Pendrell St. (with traffic control). During this time:
 - Access to the tennis court parking lots will be through Nelson St.;
 - Traffic will be alternated on Beach Ave. to allow vehicles to still enter the park;
 - Access to Lagoon Dr. (Pitch & Putt and SP Brewing) will be through Barclay St.;
- **Section 3 – Pipeline Road:** this section will be pretty quick (2 half days) as we are just milling the surface and doing an overlay to protect against the heavy bus traffic. Milling will start early in the morning to allow traffic through later in the day. While work is happening, traffic will have to be detoured around the east end of the park and southbound on pipeline road.
- **Section 4 – Georgia St. Exit:** this section will also be quick and will overlap with work on Section 3.
- **Section 5 – Park Dr. from Second Beach to Admin Building:** this work will occur towards the end of the project, based on our budget.

As you will see below, Rich Cornelissen has forwarded your message on to me.

I am the Real Property Custodian for all DND property located within Mainland BC, As such I am also the Technical and Contracting Authority for all civilian contractors who perform maintenance and construction work on those same sites.

At this time DND has assumed the posture of not interfering with the conduct of business by Industry, insofar as work on our bases and installation is concerned, so long as that work is deemed necessary for the preservation of DND's infrastructure capability.

Accordingly, there are current projects, and regular maintenance activities, in progress on the grounds of Deadman's Island (HMCS DISCOVERY) that have been deemed as necessary by my office. In addition, we employ a Facilities Maintenance Contractor for the entire facility who, in turn, will occasionally contract out sub trades work for that site. The very same declaration of necessity applies to those contractors as well.

I am therefore notifying the Vancouver Parks Board with this email that DND will require continuing unfettered access to our facility through the Stanley Park Road network for all DND personnel, DND plated vehicles and for those personnel and vehicles belonging to our contractors and related sub-contractors.

In order to facilitate ease of passage through any roadblocks I am preparing a letter for use by all contractors that will be distributed to them through Defence Construction Canada, that I am hopeful will meet the needs of Vancouver Parks Board in determining the authority for any individual civilian contractors to bypass any access road blocks into Stanley Park.

I would be very appreciative of cooperation with DND by the Parks Board and any City of Vancouver employees in continuing to permit both military and civilian DND members as well as our contractors to bypass any road closures in order to access our facility by presentation to those in authority at the road blocks of either: a DND ID card; or a copy of the letter signed by myself.

I ask that you please also note the following and advise any City or Parks Board staff: due to COVID-19 and the protective posture that DND has adopted for our members, DND ID cards are now universally valid beyond their printed expiry date and will remain so until the expiration of the current pandemic emergency.

Good Morning Richard,

I just wanted to reach out to you in advance of an upcoming SP Stakeholder notification that will be sent out later today.

In response to the C-19 pandemic that is unfolding the Parks Board are undertaking some changes regarding access to the park for the interim but until we have substantially

moved past C-19.

As Stanley Park is a destination location / park the VPB are undertaking road closures to control vehicle access within the park in an effort to increase security as well as better promote social distancing but also further support the Stay at Home initiative.

This will be supported through increased presence by VPD, Park patrollers, Park ambassadors and external security services.

The idea is that only stake holder staff / deliveries will have vehicle access to the park (with the exception of the Causeway and a few other locations).

The causeway will remain open.

From a security perspective, the intent is to better identify who should be in the park after hours and at key locations.

A portion of the roadway system will allow for pedestrian and cyclist to use as we are seeing that the demand is outweighing the capacity of the seawall.

I want to clarify that you and your staff will have access to the park and your facilities however, access points and traffic flow will be minimized.

Please have staff and visitors arrive in a branded vehicle or credentials located clearly on the driver side dashboard (or rearview mirror credential) so that staff can quickly see the credentials without the need for face to face contact.

From your operations would be accessing the park via the roundabout off of the southern off ramp of the Stanley Park Causeway.

Are you expecting contractors or non – military staff

As we are preparing a more formal notice to stakeholders and then the public within next few days, I ask that you please minimize discussion to avoid any external confusion around the process.

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Accordingly, there are current projects, and regular maintenance activities, in progress on the grounds of Deadman's Island (HMCS DISCOVERY) that have been deemed as necessary by my office. In addition, we employ a Facilities Maintenance Contractor for the entire facility who, in turn, will occasionally contract out sub trades work for that site. The very same declaration of necessity applies to those contractors as well.

I am therefore notifying the Vancouver Parks Board with this email that DND will require continuing unfettered access to our facility through the Stanley Park Road network for all DND personnel, DND plated vehicles and for those personnel and vehicles belonging to our contractors and related sub-contractors.

In order to facilitate ease of passage through any roadblocks I am preparing a letter for use by all contractors that will be distributed to them through Defence Construction Canada, that I am hopeful will meet the needs of Vancouver Parks Board in determining the authority for any

individual civilian contractors to bypass any access road blocks into Stanley Park.

I would be very appreciative of cooperation with DND by the Parks Board and any City of Vancouver employees in continuing to permit both military and civilian DND members as well as our contractors to bypass any road closures in order to access our facility by presentation to those in authority at the road blocks of either: a DND ID card; or a copy of the letter signed by myself.

I ask that you please also note the following and advise any City or Parks Board staff: due to COVID-19 and the protective posture that DND has adopted for our members, DND ID cards are now universally valid beyond their printed expiry date and will remain so until the expiration of the current pandemic emergency.

I just wanted to reach out to you in advance of an upcoming SP Stakeholder notification that will be sent out later today.

In response to the C-19 pandemic that is unfolding the Parks Board are undertaking some changes regarding access to the park for the interim but until we have substantially moved past C-19.

As Stanley Park is a destination location / park the VPB are undertaking road closures to control vehicle access within the park in an effort to increase security as well as better promote social distancing but also further support the Stay at Home initiative.

This will be supported through increased presence by VPD, Park patrollers, Park ambassadors and external security services.

The idea is that only stake holder staff / deliveries will have vehicle access to the park (with the exception of the Causeway and a few other locations).

The causeway will remain open.

From a security perspective, the intent is to better identify who should be in the park after hours and at key locations.

A portion of the roadway system will allow for pedestrian and cyclist to use as we are seeing that the demand is outweighing the capacity of the seawall.

I want to clarify that you and your staff will have access to the park and your facilities however, access points and traffic flow will be minimized.

Please have staff and visitors arrive in a branded vehicle or credentials located clearly on the driver side dashboard (or rearview mirror credential) so that staff can quickly see the credentials without the need for face to face contact.

From your operations would be accessing the park via the roundabout off of the southern off ramp of the Stanley Park Causeway.

Are you expecting contractors or non military staff

As we are preparing a more formal notice to stakeholders and then the public within next few days, I ask that you please minimize discussion to avoid any external confusion around the process.

The health and well-being of our patrons, partners and employees is always the top priority of the Park Board and as such, we are monitoring the COVID-19 situation closely. We pride ourselves on providing exceptional recreation and community programming, as well as stewarding and maintaining world-class park destinations in our city. Good afternoon, Maggie,

Thanks for taking my call the other day. Attached are our drawings concerning HMCS Discovery sewage lines/connections. It took a little while to track down the right files. Looks like we have a 100 mm forced sewer main (not 50 mm) exiting the island and following the road, Park Dr., past the yacht club to what I think may be Avison Way at STA 36+40.

So it looks like there is no non-pressurized city sewer line at the entrance to HMCS Discovery, as I had assumed. In which case, there is no request for a secondary hook-up, as that would actually mean kms of parallel pipes and be completely nonsensical. This does bring up another question. Is the city maintaining that line? Did we build it or did you? Did we build it as a Vote 10 project and give over ownership to the city? It looks like there was stub installed to allow the yacht club to connect to the line, so it wouldn't just be for our use. If there is shared ownership/responsibility for the line, where is the split and is it documented? The Yacht club stub also makes me question the feedback I received from my folks about not being able to connect to a pressurized line, clearly there is a way. I'd be interested to know what records the city has on this...

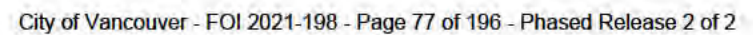

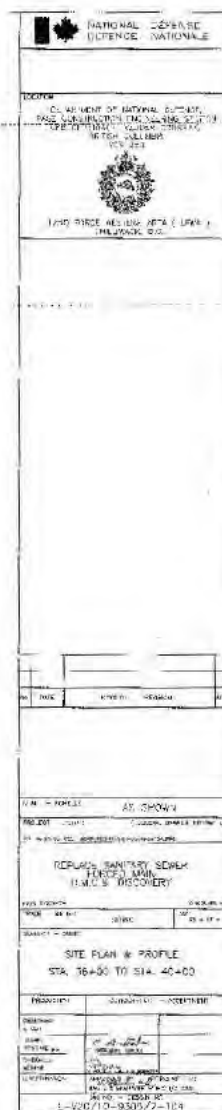

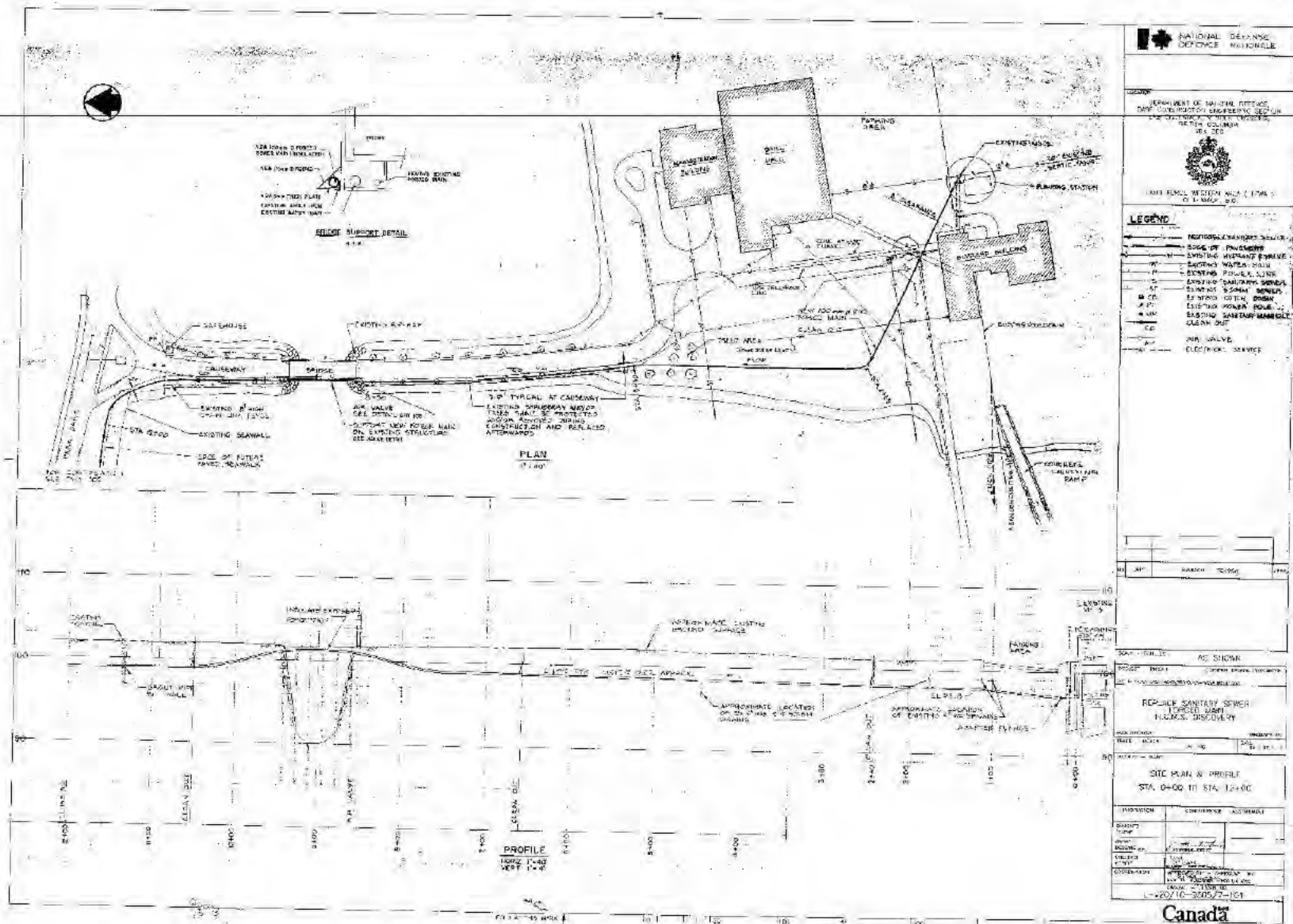

Thanks for the prompt and illuminating response. I am glad to see that the media focus on this is more optics than substance.

There are two specific concerns related to the road network that I would appreciate you passing on to the VPB Planning Department on our behalf.

1. HMCS Discovery Dive Trucks have a height of 3.96m` upon entry to Stanley Park, vehicles need to pass under a bridge, that bridge is marked as 4.0m. However, since in the last few years paving has occurred twice under that bridge so we are not exactly convinced that 4.0m is accurate. Further, the only place the Dive Truck fits under the bridge is through passing under it at the very right hand side of the road. It fits by less than 1 inch. The concern is that if they go down to 1 lane for vehicles and 1 lane for bikes, separated by a hard barrier, then we won't be able to get the truck into the park. Dive truck dimensions are 3.96m height; 10.6m long; 2.98m wide.

Some further observations and concerns that have been raised by the occupants on Deadman's Island (HMCS Discovery) over the few weeks since the temporary lane separation has gone in.

For discussion today for the most part but certainly open to coming at this at a further meeting:

1. General Observations: At various points along Stanley Park Drive the lanes narrow and the only way the DSV/Trailer RHIB combination can drive safely is with the full lane plus a buffer created when the cones are on the other side of vehicle lane white dashed lane markers. Some notable points along the Stanley Park Causeway where this is noticeable are:

- i. Roundabout at the entrance to the park off of the Stanley Park Causeway
- ii. Underpass under the Stanley Park Causeway` see below.
- iii. The long arcing turn by the RVYC parking lot
- iv. The road proximate to the "Woman in wetsuit statue"
- v. Pipeline Road exit – see note below
- vi. Underpass under the Stanley Park Cause way exiting the park – the turn is quite tight and requires a wide berth to turn left onto the entrance ramp to the Stanley Park Causeway. This area is particularly difficult as many bikes consistently disregard the Stop sign and cannot be seen by the driver prior to approaching the turn.

2. The entrance to HMCS DISCOVERY: Any traffic demarcation needs to be open past the green sign on the approach the driveway to the unit gates to allow for the vehicle's turn radius.
3. Underpass under the pedestrian bridge at the entrance to the park: The DSV can fit under the bridge only at its highest clearance point at the south end of the underpass, see attached photo. This must be completely clear of any obstructions. See attached photo
4. Brockton Point cut-off: The DSV with a trailered RHIB PC cannot use the Brockton Point Cut Off without going on to the curb. This is practicable but the likelihood damage to the trailer and/or the DSV is high. When coming out of the Cut Off road back onto Stanley Park Drive, the tow vehicle needs to use a lane-and-half to provide sufficient space for the trailer make the turn. This is practicable with cones. This vehicle configuration should only be driven around Brockton Point and not use the Cut Off, so as not to drive on the curbs and cause damage to the trailer and RHIB.
5. Pipeline Road park exit: When making the left turn from Stanley Park Drive on to Pipeline Road (south bound) while towing, the tow vehicle needs to make the turn wide (using a lane and half to two lanes of Stanley Park Drive) so the trailer does not interfere with oncoming traffic lane (north bound on Pipeline Road) stopped at stop sign. Note: most vehicles stopped at the stop sign usually roll across the stop line making this more important to negotiate the turn).
6. Access to / from Lion's Gate Bridge from Pipeline Road and onto Stanley Park Drive based on online Vancouver Parks Board plans: (Note Points 6A and 6B are absolutely in contravention of the Lease Agreement between City of Vancouver and DND)
 - a. The road that allows access to Lions Gate bridge causeway from the Stanley Park Drive is now a bike only road. Currently there is a "Road closed" sign and cone which has sometimes been blocking the lane and sometimes has been moved to the side. This directly impedes DIS' access to the closest fueling station, which is in North Vancouver. This is also the best / safest method to drive to Chilliwack, bypassing the Vancouver downtown core. The only available option to use this route is to drive into the downtown core, and turn around using narrow side streets to get back on to the causeway and Lions Gate Bridge and into North / West Vancouver. Although practicable it is a difficult driving solution as the streets are narrow, busy and a higher risk of collision is present.
 - b. When returning from Chilliwack or coming in from the Horseshoe Bay ferry, the access from Lion's Gate causeway onto Stanley Park Drive is closed (bikes only). This results in the vehicle having to go into the downtown core and use narrow side street to turn around to come in to the park with the same challenges as having access limited to the Lion's Gate Bridge from Stanley Park Drive.
7. Reverse escorts from the entrance to Stanley Park from the Stanley Park causeway: During the weeks of 22 Jun and 29 Jun 20 PRes Army vehicles were reverse escorted to HMCS DISCOVERY by the Vancouver Police Department (VPD). This is a standard practice for overheight/wide vehicles and was conducted due to the height of the PRes Army vehicles. This went without incident but does illustrate that such an event will be more challenging as the only vehicle access lane will be used when these take place. The constraint using the Brockton Point cutoff will also be exacerbated due to the track being wooded.

8. Pipeline Road Exit to South perimeter Park exit and entrance from Beach Ave along Lagoon Drive: These roads were not driven using the DSV/ Trailered RHIB PC combination as access to the roads was not available.

Hello,
I am writing to inform you that Park Drive in Stanley Park will be open to private vehicles beginning at 1pm Monday June 22nd (tomorrow).

Over the weekend staff have been implementing a temporary Traffic Management Plan (TMP) for Stanley Park that has safely divided Park Drive into two lanes, one for vehicles and one for cyclists.

This plan will ensure vehicle access to key facilities, amenities, businesses and parking in the park while providing dedicated road space for cycling use during the current phase of the COVID-19 pandemic. The attached map provides an overview of the plan park-wide.

Due to high volumes of people on the seawall and the pre-existing pinch points already experienced on the seawall path, the Stanley Park Seawall will continue to be designated as pedestrian-only. These measures will free up capacity on the seawall for pedestrians allowing for physical distancing guidelines that help minimize the spread of COVID-19. This plan is expected to remain in place for the summer of 2020 and may be adjusted, based on feedback, monitoring, and changes to the pandemic response.

We understand that the restriction of vehicles is impacting your business and your operations during an already difficult time. The temporary Traffic Management Plan has been developed using temporary features including cones and signage (with some other traffic calming and management devices) to delineate a lane of Park Drive for cycling use. These materials have been chosen in order to get the park open as soon as possible in response to your concerns, and enables flexibility to adjust and move measures around to accommodate your needs.

We will also be following up with stakeholders on an individual basis in the coming days to review the traffic management plans for your particular region of the park, so you can provide comments and feedback to inform adjustments to the measures over the coming weeks.

Park Board Senior Planner, Emily Dunlop will be following up with stakeholders to schedule meetings to review the plans and discuss any questions or feedback. Accepting this permit from the Park Board constitutes an acknowledgement from the permit holder and/or representative that he/she has read and understands the conditions and undertakings contained herein and further that he/she has the authority to represent and bind the licensee on all matters pertaining to this permit.

The Vancouver Park Board is publicly funded and the use of parks and facilities must reflect this fact. Users must comply with all applicable City by-laws and Federal and Provincial legislation, including the British Columbia Human Rights Code which prohibits discriminatory conduct including conduct that would expose persons or groups to hatred or contempt.

Vancouver's parks and beaches will be smoke-free effective September 1, 2010.

Show Synopsis

Paranormal investigators Zak Bagans and Aaron Goodwin search for the most haunted locations across the globe. As they seek out answers to the afterlife, Zak and crew explore the local culture; research and present historical information; interview locals about the hauntings; and go face-to-face with the spirits who reportedly haunt these locations.

Ghost Adventures is currently the #1 show on Travel Channel with a viewership potential of 97 million in the United States. Each episode airs 18-25 times.

Production

Two small crews of 8 people shoot an episode of Ghost Adventures over the course of three and half days. The two crews operate independently of one another. One crew we call our investigation crew. It has our three hosts and conducts interviews of people that can speak about the history of the haunted location and eyewitnesses that have experienced unexplained or paranormal events. They also conduct the overnight paranormal investigation. They generally spend two afternoons on interviews and then do the paranormal investigation on the third night. Good afternoon LCdr Cornelissen,

Further to my voicemail earlier, please find attached a copy of the traffic management plans for the Park Drive Repaving Project. The package includes an overview map of the locations that we are working on this April.

Work started yesterday on Section 4 (between Beaver Creek outlet and one-way pipeline) and we are currently finishing up the paving for that section.

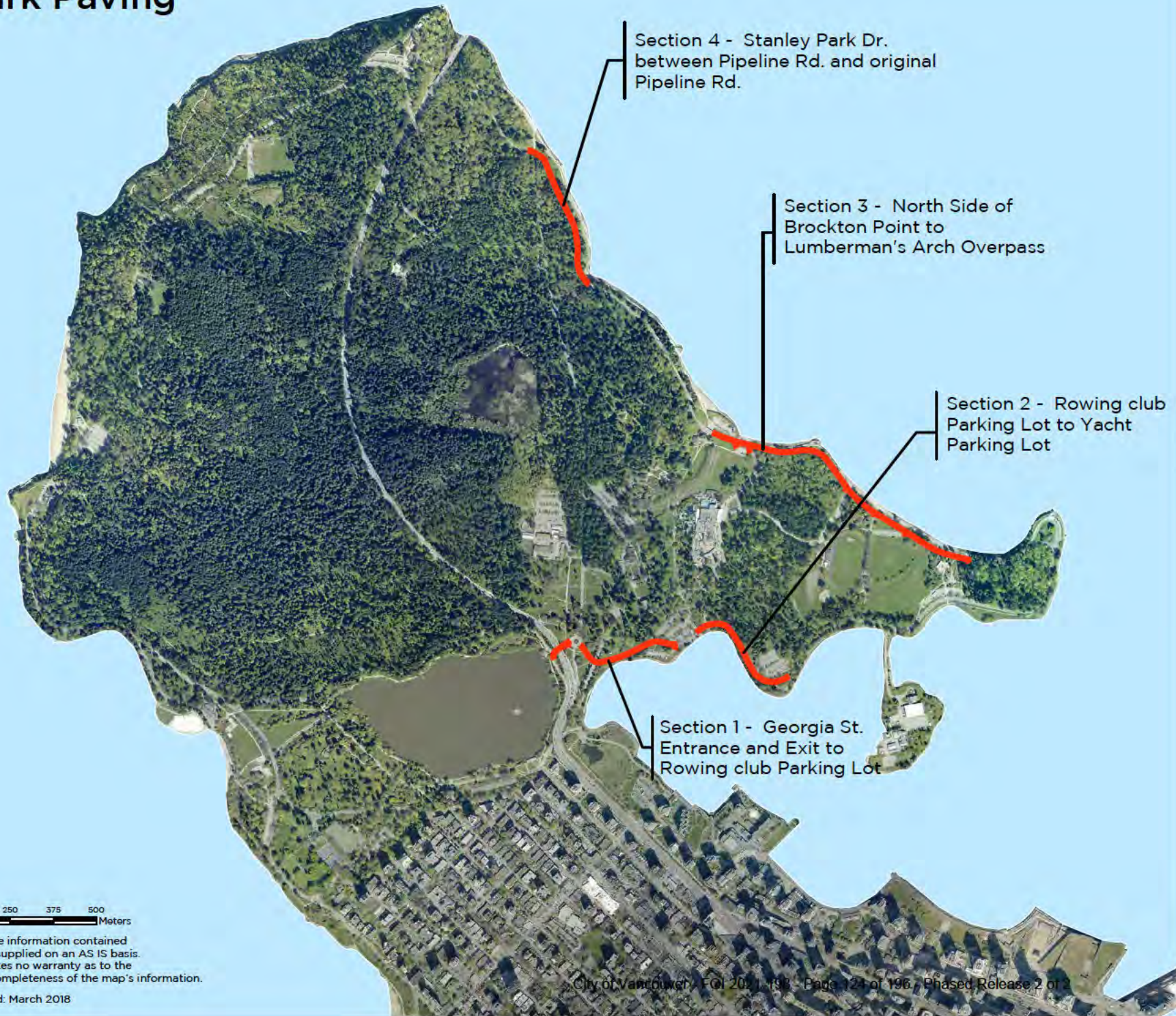
As you saw this morning, we milled Section 1 (from roundabout to just past the Rowing Club) and Section 2 (from Avison Way to the Yatch Club). We will repave this section tomorrow (Thursday April 19), starting at 5 am. The road will be closed until paving is completed for the stretch from the roundabout to just after the overpass. However, we expect this work to be completed by 8 am so that morning traffic can pass through. Should access be required earlier, we can arrange for vehicles to travel with a pilot truck down Park Drive from Pipeline Road. Traffic will be limited to one lane for the rest of the day while we complete the paving on each side.

Based on the weather forecast, we are currently planning to begin work on Section 3 (between the Totem Poles and Lumberman's Arch overpass) on Tuesday April 24 and complete the work by Friday April 27. This work requires full closure of the road from the Totem Poles parking lot to Lumberman's Arch Overpass for the duration of construction. This will mean that the base will still be accessible, however there may be some delays. To allow traffic to exit the park, Park Drive will become bi-directional while the closure is in effect. Please review the attached traffic plan for that section for more details. Should the weather forecast change over the weekend, I will send everyone an update on the schedule.

We have been monitoring the forecast and believe that we may have an opportunity to work on a couple of sections starting next Monday (October 1) and until Friday (October 5).

Hello everyone,

As events and tourist season winds down in Stanley Park, we are now getting ready to start Phase 2 of the Stanley Park Pavement Repair project. The project will be again delivered in collaboration with our colleagues in CoV Engineering.

I have attached a revised plan for Phase 2; as we are now at the mercy of the weather

we will be preparing to complete as much of the work that the weather allows. Those of you that will be more directly affected will be contacted separately to discuss strategies to lessen any impact to your operations.

We are monitoring the weather and will start the work at the first good weather window after September 24.

The provisional plan at the moment is:

- * Section 1 – Prospect Point: this will be the first section and is anticipated to take between 2-3 days to complete. We will be alternating traffic along Park Dr. to allow vehicles to still go around the park. However, we will require closure of the entrance into the park from the causeway for at least two half days (6 am – 1 pm). We have been coordinating with MoTI on messaging and traffic control.

- * Section 2 – Administration Building: this will be the second section and will start right after Section 1. It is anticipated that the work here will take us another 2-3 days. Access to the park board parking will be through Pendrell St. (with traffic control). During this time:

- * Access to the tennis court parking lots will be through Nelson St.;

- * Traffic will be alternated on Beach Ave. to allow vehicles to still enter the park;

- * Access to Lagoon Dr. (Pitch & Putt and SP Brewing) will be through Barclay St.;

- * Section 3 – Pipeline Road: this section will be pretty quick (2 half days) as we are just milling the surface and doing an overlay to protect against the heavy bus traffic. Milling will start early in the morning to allow traffic through later in the day. While work is happening, traffic will have to be detoured around the east end of the park and southbound on pipeline road.

- * Section 4 – Georgia St. Exit: this section will also be quick and will overlap with work on Section 3.

- * Section 5 – Park Dr. from Second Beach to Admin Building: this work will occur towards the end of the project, based on our budget.

THIS INDENTURE made the first day of November,
1908,

BETWEEN

HIS MAJESTY KING EDWARD VII, acting through the
Honourable the Minister of Militia and Defence for

THE CITY OF VANCOUVER,

of the Second Part.

WHEREAS by Order-in-Council of the 7th day of June,
1887, the military property at Vancouver, B.C., known as
"Stanley Park," was authorized to be leased under certain
conditions to the City of Vancouver for park purposes;

AND WHEREAS by Order-in-Council dated 31st of Aug-
ust, 1906, amended by Order-in-Council dated 31st August,
1908, the said the Honourable Minister of Militia and
Defence was empowered to lease the said property to the
City of Vancouver for park purposes for a period of ninety-
nine (99) years, renewable (such lease to be made generally
on the lines of the agreement dated 31st December, 1873, be-
tween the Principal Secretary of State for the War Depart-
ment, of the one part, and the Directors of Point Pleasant
Park, Halifax, Nova Scotia, of the other part, whereby the
said Point Pleasant Park was leased to the said directors
representing the City of Halifax);

AND WHEREAS the said property consists of all that portion of the City of Vancouver (and the foreshore adjacent thereto) bounded by the western limit of District Lot 185, Group One (1), New Westminster District (as shown on the official plan thereof filed in the Land Registry Office at Vancouver), and the low-water mark of the waters of Burrard Inlet, the First Narrows, and English Bay, and being all that peninsula lying to the west and north of said District Lot One Hundred and Eighty-five (185), known as "Stanley Park."

NOW, THEREFORE, it is by these presents consented, covenanted, and agreed, and license is hereby given, that said lands, or such parts thereof as shall not at any time or times hereafter be required by His Majesty or His Successors for all or any military uses or purposes defensive, including the erection of forts or batteries or other buildings whatsoever, for all which the exclusive possession and control shall remain in and belong to His Majesty as heretofore, shall and may henceforward be used, occupied, and enjoyed by the City of Vancouver for its use as and for a public park for the term of ninety-nine years (renewable perpetually on the same terms and conditions as herein contained) subject until their determination to any existing leases of portions of the said land and to the conditions following, that is to say:

1. The rent of One Dollar (\$1) per annum shall be paid to the Department of Militia and Defence for the use of the said park.

2. The Minister of Militia and Defence shall have full power to resume and take possession without compensation of any portion of said lands or any buildings now or

hereinafter to be erected thereon whenever it may be required in his judgment for any military purpose whatsoever, including such portion thereof as may be required to be occupied as gardens for any troops quartered thereon.

3. His Majesty's Naval and Military Forces may, at any time the General or other Officer Commanding require it, march through, manoeuvre, or otherwise exercise on the said lands, or encamp thereon.

4. The existing main road round the peninsula, together with any new carriage roads that may be formed, shall be maintained and kept in order by the City of Vancouver; PROVIDED, however, that the use of any roads, or any portions thereof, may be discontinued with the sanction of the Minister of Militia and Defence.

5. No establishment for the sale of intoxicating liquors, etc., shall be erected on the said lands in any form without the sanction of the Minister of Militia and Defence.

6. The said Minister of Militia and Defence shall have power at any time to exercise the right of quarrying stones or cutting down trees or other obstructions in case of military necessity and also of cutting roads for the repair of earthworks.

7. Any agreement by the City of Vancouver for the pasturing or other occupation of the said lands shall be subject to the right of the Minister of Militia and Defence to resume possession thereof if required for any military use or purpose.

8. The Minister of Militia and Defence and the City of Vancouver shall severally have the right of closing the park one day in each year against the use thereof by the public.

9. No stone shall be quarried on the said property, nor any trees be cut therefrom (except for the purpose of opening out roads thereon), without the sanction of the Minister of Militia and Defence.

10. The City of Vancouver shall, with the consent of the Minister of Militia and Defence, have the right to lay, make, and maintain such reservoirs, pipes, and other apparatus on said lands as may, in the opinion of the Council of the said City, be necessary or expedient for the maintenance, amendment, or extension of the water supply of the said City.

11. The Minister of Militia and Defence may re-enter on the said land on breach of any of the covenants entered into as aforesaid by the City of Vancouver, and thereupon this agreement and all rights and interests of the City of Vancouver and of the public thereunder shall immediately determine.

IN WITNESS WHEREOF the said the Honourable Minister of Militia and Defence hath hereunto set His Hand and Seal; and the City of Vancouver has hereunto set its corporate seal by the hand of the Mayor and City Clerk.

Thank you for the phone conversation this morning. I've talked to my colleague Ali, and was able to get more information on the status of those gates.

First I thought I should clarify that as it turns out, the gates are only in operation on the two exits from Stanley Park onto the causeway (the exits from the causeway into the Park do not have gates). So basically two out of the four access ramps have gates. And yes, as confirmed, they only close during rush hour traffic Monday to Friday from 3:30pm to 6:30pm.

We actually don't have any keys on hand. Our PB operations team might have keys, but they likely don't have any copies. These would be supplied by MOTI or Mainland. We will be contacting MOTI regarding the opening of the Causeway to take place next week, however, when we've previously discussed this with them, we realized that due to the various entities that need emergency access, we confirmed the need for an Emergency Response Plan. This should be discussed and developed with all parties together - DND & HMCS, Parks, RCMP, VPD and MOTI. When we contact MOTI shortly, we can confirm with them the plan for a future potential meeting to kick this off. Does this seem like a logical approach to you? I assume yourself on behalf of DND, and Richard and Bryan from HMCS are the best folks to be involved for this?

Sorry to hear again about the truck damage turning onto Bidwell. I stopped by there on my way back from the Park today, and didn't see any damage to the street elements themselves thankfully but there is a large tree there, hopefully the truck is not in too bad of a condition.

I am writing to inform you that Park Drive in Stanley Park will be open to private vehicles beginning at 1pm Monday June 22nd (tomorrow).

Over the weekend staff have been implementing a temporary Traffic Management Plan (TMP) for Stanley Park that has safely divided Park Drive into two lanes, one for vehicles and one for cyclists. This plan will ensure vehicle access to key facilities, amenities, businesses and parking in the park while providing dedicated road space for cycling use during the current phase of the COVID-19 pandemic. The attached map provides an overview of the plan park-wide.

Due to high volumes of people on the seawall and the pre-existing pinch points already experienced on the seawall path, the Stanley Park Seawall will continue to be designated as pedestrian-only. These measures will free up capacity on the seawall for pedestrians allowing for physical distancing guidelines that help minimize the spread of COVID-19. This plan is expected to remain in place for the summer of 2020 and may be adjusted, based on feedback, monitoring, and changes to the pandemic response.

We understand that the restriction of vehicles is impacting your business and your operations during an already difficult time. The temporary Traffic Management Plan has been developed using temporary features including cones and signage (with some other traffic calming and management devices) to delineate a lane of Park Drive for cycling use. These materials have been chosen in order to get the park open as soon as possible in response to your concerns, and enables flexibility to adjust and move measures around to accommodate your needs.

We will also be following up with stakeholders on an individual basis in the coming days to review the traffic management plans for your particular region of the park, so you can provide comments and feedback to inform adjustments to the measures over the coming weeks.

Park Board Senior Planner, Emily Dunlop will be following with stakeholders to schedule meetings to review the plans and discuss any questions or feedback. Dear Ms Wilton,

I am the officer responsible for management of all Real Property on behalf of the Department of National Defence (DND) on mainland BC. I am writing today as a key stakeholder to request immediate consultation between the Vancouver Board of Parks and Recreation (VPB) and DND, on the matter of continuing guaranteed roadway access to our property located on Deadman's Island.

I note that this matter has lately been forefront in the local media where it has been reported that the VPB is presently considering reducing Park Drive from two lanes to one lane, or indeed, speculation of eliminating all vehicle traffic on Park Drive.

The occupants of our Naval Reserve Division, HMCS Discovery that is located on Deadman's Island, have become increasingly concerned after seeing the media reports and nothing more official from the City of Vancouver and the VPB, that their ongoing operations are going to be suddenly impacted to the point of being unable to access the installation.

On June 9th, 2020, I conveyed our concerns via email to the Supervisor of Operations at the VPB. I did receive a satisfactory initial response from Mr. Collins, indicating that VPB Planning Department would be made aware of our concerns. However the delay in a more formal response or consultation from the VPB, coupled with the awareness I now have that the Board itself is meeting shortly to debate the matter in-camera, has prompted this direct outreach.

Please allow me to once again reiterate our concerns on maintaining unfettered access to our site.

Firstly, as a landowner that would be landlocked in the event that Park Drive is closed, DND would object strenuously to any action taken that would block our ability to access our property.

Secondly, Our Royal Canadian Navy Dive Trucks have a height of 3.96m. It has been noted that upon entry to Stanley Park, vehicles need to pass under a bridge. That bridge is marked as 4.0m. However, in the last few years paving has occurred twice under that bridge so we are not convinced that 4.0m is accurate. Further, the only place the Dive Truck fits under the bridge is through passing under it at the very right hand side of the road. It fits by less than 1 inch. The concern is that if the VPB were to reduce Park Drive to one lane for vehicles and one lane for bikes, separated by a hard barrier, then we won't be able to get the trucks to our facility where they are stored and used. Dive truck dimensions are 3.96m height; 10.6m long; 2.98m wide.

Finally, as a Federal Department it should be made clear that DND personnel, contractors and visitors must not be impeded in being able to access our site, both day and night.

I trust that this request will generate appropriate consideration by the staff of the VPB and the Board and I look forward to participating in stakeholder consultation on the matter with VPB.
