This note is to apprise you of the upcoming Council Capital Planning Workshop that will take place in two parts, on March 31st and April 7th.

A. Purpose

- To provide an overview of the preliminary draft 2023-2026 Capital Plan, and an opportunity for Council input.
 - Feedback to be incorporated into the subsequent draft Capital Plan brought back to Council on April 26th before starting public engagement.
 - The final 2023-2026 Capital Plan would be brought to Council for approval on July 6th.

B. Procedures

- □ These will be public meetings, streamed online and open to the public to attend.
- □ There will be no public speakers on March 31st and April 7th (speakers will be heard concerning the Capital Plan on April 26th and July 6th).
- □ The Mayor will Chair these meetings.
- □ The meeting will start on March 31st, recess, and then continue on April 7th.

- Council will have opportunities to ask questions of staff in both sessions, and can also submit questions to staff via email.
- If Council wishes to give staff direction in this workshop, this would be done via a motion (ideally on April 7th).
