The PAFNW Indigenous Women Council is hosting the Red Dress Day Gathering on May 5th, 2022 at 12:00-2:00pm for the MMIWG2S National Day of Action. This event will take place behind City hall on the grass. Please see the attached poster.

Staff have been advised that Council will receive an invitation to attend the event from PAFNW. Likely it will be sent tomorrow.

Mayor and Council will not be asked to speak at this event but if you do attend, you may/will be called as a witness. Witnesses are given coin offerings and are tasked with sharing what happened during the event so that the story will be told and people will be made aware. If you are asked to witness, this is an important task and will require you to be present for the duration of the ceremony. It is also important to note that it is possible the ceremony may extend beyond 2 pm so holding some additional time in your calendar would be prudent.

This is an important event for the community and staff would recommend that there be some members of Council in attendance.



Dear Mayor and Council,

As you are aware, an event hosted by the Pacific Association of First Nations Women (**PAFNW**) and in partnership with a community planning committee, a Red Dress Gathering event is taking place tomorrow on City Hall grounds as a public reminder and collective call to action to support the implementation of recommendations from the Missing and Murdered Indigenous Women and Girls Inquiry. Staff have confirmed that the event is being Livestreamed via Facebook for those who cannot attend in person.

In addition to the Red Dress Gathering, the City's Engineering Department is assisting PAFNW and the planning committee in the installation of a Red Dress display on the Burrard Street Bridge. The display was designed by artist **Manuel Strain** to commemorate the National Day of Awareness for Missing and Murdered Indigenous Women, Girls, and Two-Spirit People. The installation will feature a number of red dresses and banners that will be suspended at various points across the bridge.

Engineering staff will work with PAFNW and community Elders to install the display in advance of the Red Dress Gathering taking place at City Hall later in the day. The display on the Burrard Street Bridge will remain up at the organizers request until the morning of May 6th, 2022. As well, the Burrard bridge will also be illuminated in Red on the evening of May 5th.

I appreciate the leadership of the Indigenous staff in ACCS (Rachel Wuttunee) and Engineering Services (Neesha Pooni), along with other staff, for supporting these efforts.
