Please see below updates on the launch of a public engagement activity on the new Commercial Tenant Assistance Program (CTAP) website. The following email is a brief summary and overview of this work, including next steps.

As part of ongoing Employment Lands and Economy Review (ELER) implementation, staff have developed and launched a new Commercial Tenant Assistance Program (CTAP) website to support commercial tenants with real estate decision making and relocation planning (www.vancouver.ca/CTAP).

The CTAP website includes six resource guides developed with industry experts, including: commercial real estate brokers, landlords, owners, developers, business operators, BIAs, UDI, BOMA, NAIOP and Small Business BC.
The guides are available in 6 different languages (English, traditional and simplified Chinese, Punjabi, Tagalog and Vietnamese) and focus on the following areas: 1. Commercial Tenant Basics What is a commercial tenant? Are there legal protections / regulations? Commercial Lease Negotiation Notification Period, Renewal, Termination Other common clauses and best practices Relocation and finding a new space Best practices and first steps Options, timing, step-by-step guide Finding a new space: Making sure it is a good fit Renovating your new space
 4. Redevelopment Process: Timeline and Process □ Rezoning, zoning, development explained □ The redevelopment process and timeline as a graphic □ Information on building and development permits 5. Navigating City Processes □ Information on business permits and licences as they relate to relocation
