Dear Mayor and Council,

On Monday, the Provincial government introduced legislation which targets taxation relief on development potential. As you know, Council has advocated for action in this area for a number of years. The details are available at the link below:

Bill 28 – 2022: Municipal Affairs Statutes (Property Taxation) Amendment Act, 2022 [leg.bc.ca]

Below are some key points regarding this legislation:

	This is a piece of new and complex legislation and staff is working through the details.
	At a high level, this will enable municipalities to charge a lower tax rate on unbuilt density on commercial properties, which was the intent of the original sub-class recommendation that Council had recommended to
	the Province
	It is permissive in nature, which means municipalities can set their own criteria and decide whether or not to use the legislation
	It is time-limited so it will not discourage development over the long term (delivery of much needed hsg & jol space)
	It is timely ©depending when the legislation receives royal assent, it could be implemented as early as 2023 to provide immediate relief to eligible properties
