Background and Purpose of this Memo

On June 15, 2022, Council received <u>a memo</u> from Staff outlining the results of the annual storefront inventory field work for 2022. The memo included a staff commitment to produce area specific profiles for the City's 22 Business Improvement Areas (BIAs).

Area-specific storefront profiles have now been created and published on the City website.

This memo provides Council with an overview of the data contained in the profiles, website links to the profiles and an overview of how the information is important for long range planning and programming decisions for the City and our community partners.

Annual Storefronts Inventory and Report

The Storefronts Inventory, conducted annually in March, tracks changes in the city's retail-commercial areas, and forms the foundation of the annual Storefronts Report. The Inventory and Report are key resources for the development of City programs and policy to support small businesses and business districts. Community partners also benefit from the annual inventory



and reporting process. For example, the data can provide BIAs with important insights into business and customer trends in their areas, providing important information for programming, marketing, and business retention /recruitment.

The annual City-wide Storefronts Report, released online to the public each Spring, is the first step in the annual reporting cycle. The second step is the release of the 22 BIA area-specific profiles in the fall. The updated report published November 25, 2022 includes area-specific profiles appended to the city-wide report published in the spring.

New Area Specific Content

Figure 1 outlines the area-specific content that has been published as part of the November 2022 reports. Area-specific content will continue to be a feature of the annual Storefronts Report going forward. Potential additional indicators may be added in future as needed to better understand the health of retail-commercial districts and their storefront businesses.
