My name s.22(1)

I am frustrated and upset to hear that another architecture firm has applied to open a liquor store (at 3838 Rupert St.) within 150 metres of Renfrew Elementary School. Below are the reasons why it should **NOT** be approved.

1) Within 75 metres, less than a block, is an elementary school (which also includes a before- and after-school care program). This is against Vancouver Park Board's Liquor Store Guidelines as it is within 150 metres of the school grounds. 3838 Rupert Street is not an appropriate location for a liquor store. Hundreds of children, ages 5 through 13 will pass by this location every weekday and it does not contribute to an educational environment, or a wholesome, safe community environment. Moreover, many families and their children use the school grounds on weekends and evenings for recreation and family time. s.22(1) regularly use the basketball courts and playground that are located on the corner of Rupert Street and 22nd Avenue, less than 100 metres from the proposed location. I could not imagine what type of message having a liquor store this close to the school, playground, basketball courts would send to our children as they grow up. Furthermore, I can foresee loiters hanging around the school in the evenings, and broken bottles and empty cans on school grounds--creating a very unsafe environment for children. It is appalling that the developers continually apply to open up a liquor store that is less than 150 metres from the school. It is infuriating and totally in disregard of children and their safety.

2) The city does not want marijuana dispensaries within a certain distance from schools, why should liquor stores be any different? They should be subject to the same scrutiny.

3) There are already several liquor stores in close proximity to 3838 Rupert Street, more than enough to support the growing community. They are:

- i) BC Liquor Store located at 3150 east Broadway (1.5km away)
- ii) Eldorado Liquor Store at 2310 Kingsway (2.9km away)
- iii) Bottle Jockey located at 1899 Rosser Street (3.5km away)
- iv) BC Liquor Store located at 4429 Kingsway (4.4km away)
- v) Cedar Cottage Liquor Store at 3728 Clark Street (4.9km away)

Not to mention several licensed establishments all within 5km of 3737 Rupert.
 I respectfully implore you to deny this proposed liquor store.

I'm don't understand why the City is considering approval of this liquor store again when it has already been previously denied (see attached).

We are <u>strongly opposed to the opening of this liquor store</u> and have very serious concerns about a liquor store being directly across the street from an elementary school.

Major concerns are

- 1. Public safety in a sensitive area with many minor children and youth
- 2. increased risk of liquor accessibility to minors
- 3. nuisance activity
- 4. public drunkenness
- 5. disturbing the peace
- 6. vandalism.

The elementary school already experiences its fair share of vandalism and I have no doubt it will increase with the opening of a liquor store directly across the street. I am also very concerned about the general public safety of the neighborhood as liquor stores generally attract aggressive panhandlers. Frankly, I'm surprised there isn't an existing by-law to prevent liquor stores from operating so close to school like there is for marijuana dispensaries.

I hope the concerns mentioned above are given serious consideration to prevent the approval and strongly urge the Clty to consider creating by-laws to prevent liquor stores from operating so close to school much like there are for marjiuana dispensaries.

Thank you for seeking our input on the above application. I appreciate the job that you are doing.

So, how do I feel about a Liquor Store in the above development? There are many people in our society who struggle with alcohol addictions, I don't think there are too many adults out there who have not had some contact with people who cannot safely handle alcohol. The social and economic cost of alcohol in our society is very high with families being destroyed, innocent people killed or maimed (no, I am NOT exaggerating - a report commissioned in 2010 estimated the cost of alcohol related car accidents in Canada to be in excess of 20B). With smoking, the person who is affected in 99.9% of the cases is the smoker s.22(1)

s.22(1) none of them suffers from smoking related illnesses and they are ins.22(1)

s.22(1) With alcohol there is a wide swath of destruction. So, my view is, the more difficult it is to obtain alcohol, the better it is for our society. While prohibition is not the answer, lowering the availability will probably, in some very very very small way, help some of those struggling have to work a little harder to get their 'drug'.

I also do not like the idea of a liquor store by the school. No, it's not the customers that frequent the store, they are nice enough people. It is the normalization of alcohol into their subconscious (I feel the same way about canabis stores - oh, wait, they are already not allowed to be located close to schools).

While I truly do appreciate that you are asking for how we feel about the application, in my experience this is nothing more than an exercise, I feel that the outcome is already determined, the sending out and collecting of feedback is merely a formality that holds absolutely no weight in the decision (unless there is a 98% response to the negative, that 'might' merit some consideration). We have received a Notice of Development Application regarding 3898 Rupert St and 3309 23rd Ave E (the "property"). We are owners of a residential property s.22(1) blocks of the proposed development.

We very much oppose the change of use of the property to Liquor Store Type 2 for the following reasons:

a) the property is directly facing Renfrew Community Elementary School (3315 22nd Ave E) and the proposed liquor store would be open everyday that the school is in session as the Liquor Store's proposed hours are 7 days a week, 12-13 hours each day.

b) the property is 5 blocks away from Windermere Secondary School at 3155 27th Ave E. where there are many impressionable teenagers being educated.

c) alcohol is both legal and accessible and is related to many health and addiction issues. We need to protect our children from the introduction of alcohol at an early age so that they do not become desensitized to it. School children would pass the store everyday on their way to and from school. There would be no school day/concert day /sports day/conference day that children would not see the liquor store open. From kindergarten to grade 12, the liquor store and all of its parking/panhandling/litter/graffiti issues would be a constant presence in these children's lives.

d) the school grounds are neighbouring the proposed liquor store and may appear to its customers to be an ideal place for people to congregate and drink or picnic, potentially leaving behind broken bottles, graffiti, vandalized playground equipment, litter, condoms, fecal matter etc.

e) the property is surrounded by residential homes. The liquor store would bring increased traffic, public alcohol consumption, public urination and defecation, noise far into the night, panhandlers, vagrants and buskers to the neighbourhood.

Please do not permit the application from DeAngelis Architecture The A Studio for a liquor store. Please help us and other parents and residents keep alcohol away from

young impressionable children.

I am a resident of Renfrew Heights. I have owned property and lived in the neighborhood for over years. I am also a s.22(1) of the Renfrew Park Community Center. I am opposed to the proposed liquor store application for one of the retail units located at 3838 Rupert Street.

I am opposed to the store based on the following reasons:

As proposed, 3737 Rupert Street is across the street from Renfrew Elementary School (200 meters distance to the front door of the school – Google Maps). Elementary school aged children will be passing the store every school day. The playgrounds are also well used during after school hours. If Cannabis Stores are not allowed to be near schools, then why should a liquor store not be held to the same standard.

The neighborhood is already well serviced by a BC Liquor store on Broadway and Lillooet - in walking distance.

The presence of a liquor store in a residential neighborhood will lead to additional negative impacts of increased vehicle traffic, garbage and public consumption of alcohol – especially at night with the close proximity of Renfrew Park and the open (publicly accessible) parking lots at Renfrew Park Public Library and Community Center. The existing liquor stores (BCLDB Broadway and Lillooet – East Broadway - and the Eldorado Liquor Store- Kingsway) nearby are all on main arterial roads (2 lanes each way), the proposed Rupert St store is not (1 lane each way – both Rupert and 22nd).

The neighborhood has been plagued by the garbage dumped on our streets and sidewalks by transients who shop at the Grandview Highway McDonalds and the former 7- Eleven store located at the old strip mall that was formerly at 3737 Rupert/ 3281 East 22nd. I wish to object to the development application by DeAngelis Architecture, perform a change of use of approximately 3,888.4 sq. ft to a Liquor Store – Type 2, of the previous Commercial Retail Units number 6 & 7 (at 3898 Rupert & 3309 East 23rd), including interior alterations, to the existing sixstorey mixed-use building. I submitted my comments via Shapeyourcity.ca. I would like to add few more points. Please accept this email as my submission.

My husband and I are the resident of Renfrew-Collingwood for over ^{S.22(1)} We are the homeowner. We are shocked this plan has been considered. We live S.22(1) From the proposed premises. ^{S.22(1)} goes to school and pass the proposed premises every day.

We object to the application on the following concerns:

Objection 1:

Grounds for objection - Too close to the school.

Reasons for objections:

1. Renfrew Elementary School is situated 130 meters (right across the street) from the proposed premises.

- 2. Windermere Secondary School is situated 800 meters from the proposed premises.
- 3. Vancouver Christian School about 750 meters from the proposed premises.

4. Alcohol is a unique product. While it is a source of pleasure and enjoyment for the vast majority of people and can be part of a balanced, healthy lifestyle, we know from much experience that when it is misused, there are serious consequences.

5. The health and safety risks related to alcohol use, with particular emphasis on the harmful effects of binge drinking by youth and post-secondary students.

6. The young children and youth will get confused while schools are educating them about the risk of drinking alcohol, but there is a liquor store so close to their schools and promoting it is a source of pleasure and enjoyment.

Objection 2:

Grounds for objection – Too close to quiet residential housing. Reasons for objections:

1. The location is extremely close to quiet residential housing.

2. We are concerned about the extra traffic they will generate on Rupert Street and 22nd Ave.

3. The proposed premises whose principal hours of business are late at night is not compatible with this location. Hours of operation are: 10 am – 10 pm – Sunday to Thursday; 10 am to 11 pm – Friday and Saturday.

4. I personally feel that allowing the sale of alcohol and similar activities this late at night will lead to noise and anti-social behaviour in local streets at a time when most respectable local residents are in bed and trying to sleep.

Objection 3:

Grounds for objection – Potential crime increase Reasons for objections:

1. We are concerned about the potential for drunk driving and the dangers this brings not only to our community but the wider area.

2. I witnessed some strangers hang around alleys at night. They were not just littered in our alley. My garage door and a couple of other houses were damaged with spray paints in past while we were sleeping. There is potential to increase strangers in my neighborhood if there will be a liquor store in our neighbor and open late at night.

3. We are concerned about the inherent risk of alcohol abuse in British Columbia today. As per the report in 2011, approximately 350,000 British Columbians are problem drinkers. Please find enclosed a petition from very concerned residents within the immediate community around the proposed change of use at 3838 Rupert St, Vancouver, BC of approximately 3,888.4 sq. ft of commercial retail units #6 and 7 to a Liquor Store -Type 3 in the existing six-story mixed-use building with proposed hours of operation: 10 am to 10 pm - Sunday to Thursday and 10 am to 11 pm - Friday and Saturday.

We are **opposed** to the change of use for the following reasons

The development application is against the city of Vancouver's liquor store guideline and threatens the community's identity. Link to Guideline Page: https://vancouver.ca/files/cov/liquor-store-guidelines.pdfs

-It is across the street from Renfrew Elementary School, Strong Start Early Learning Centre and playgrounds. We are afraid it will have a negative impact on children and the community. Furthermore, the City of Vancouver Liquor Store guidelines amended May 2, 2018 prescribe "4 Separation from Family oriented uses (a) No liquor store should be located within 150 m of a church, park, elementary or secondary school, community centre or neighbourhood house. The Alcohol and Gaming Commission of Ontario (AGCO) defines the distance as follows

"When the school or private school is the primary or only occupant of a building, 150 metres shall be measured from the property line of the property on which the school or private school is located" (https://www.agco.ca/cannabis/retail-store-location).

The Ontario Superior Court's decision on *Sticky Nuggz Inc. v Alcohol and Gaming Commission of Ontario*, prescribed measuring the distance using the "*straight-line*" or "*as the crow flies*" method and affirmed AGCO's definition. This decision was also upheld by the Divisional Court of the Superior Court of Justice. -Renfrew Heights Recovery House is close by and the presence of a liquor store would likely be a negative influence

Alternative businesses should be considered for occupying the space

-We don't see the need for another liquor store as there is an existing government liquor store within 2km away and also three to four liquor stores that are easily assessable

 Instead of a liquor store the community would be better served by allowing a variety of other retail stores and services like a doctor's office, bakery, or other professional services to operate in that space

Having more liquor stores is contradictive to the City of Vancouver's environmental goals

-The City of Vancouver has publicly stated that it wants to be the greenest city for years and has put significant effort to make the goal into reality. In the City of Vancouver's Greenest City 2020 Action Plan

The City's Sustainability Plan, it states the following: "Develop education and enforcement programs to keep recyclables out of the waste stream. This action builds on existing regulations to keep glass, metals, paper, and some plastics from the City's garbage collection. It includes tactics to raise awareness about the importance of waste reduction and recycling, community-based social marketing to overcome barriers, cooperation with community groups, and enforcement of disposal bans at the household and business level." https://vancouver.ca/files/cov/greenest-city-action-plan.pdf

If the city allows this liquor store to pass, there will be an increase of waste due to alcohol consumption which contradicts the City of Vancouver's environmental plan. A significant portion of bottles cannot be recycled due to the material being used to create the bottles. Most of those bottles end up in landfills or sent off to third world countries. Introducing a liquor store will increase bottle and plastic waste which contradicts the city's zero-waste initiative and goals. The city should reject this appeal to uphold its sustainability goals.

Ineffective if not wasteful use of city resources

-the residents of the neighbourhood are disheartened by the use of city resources to review a second development application for a liquor store within the same intersection

The proposed liquor store location is clearly within 150 m of the property line of the property on which Renfrew Elementary School is located.

-Blue Spruce Montessori, Vancouver Christian School, a preschool, and Windermere Secondary School is also close by and would be negatively impacted

Substantially affects the neighborhood's character, use and enjoyment of the adjacent land

-As described by the city of Vancouver Community plan, "Renfrew-Collingwood is a dynamic, family-oriented neighborhood, known for its active community spirit and remarkable diversity." This neighborhood in particular noted for its residential homes with its family and kid friendly culture.

-We have observed traffic at large liquor stores can be relatively consistent and frequent. As the area is a residential neighborhood, the main roads only consist of one lane of traffic for all directions for the Rupert and East 22nd avenue intersection. The alleyway leading into the building is also somewhat tight and requires cars to go through residential alleyways. This creates a high likeliness for extreme congestion for the area, increasing carbon pollution, and traffic jams

- As the area is primarily residential, problems may arise with residents competing with liquor store customer for parking and how large alcohol delivery vehicles will be accommodated and will they cause undue noise

-Renfrew Heights Recovery House is close by and the presence of a liquor store would likely be a negative influence to this place of calm and healing

It will attract interests from underaged persons and non residents creating a busy neighbourhood.

The property is situated on the corner of Rupert and 22nd. Both streets are one lane with a bike lane and a partial left turn lane. The streets are very busy during rush hours in the morning and in the afternoon in all four directions with traffic heading to and coming from Highway 1. Many kids and seniors use this small intersection

The increasing no. of houses with three households in the neighbourhood have so overloaded parking along the streets and in the residential areas that it's hard to get a clear view to make a left or right turn from the side streets. The additions of 100 units from this development and those from the development on 3737 Rupert St (located diagonally across) will further add to the existing traffic and parking burden. Adding a liquor store will bring more traffic to the neighbourhood, creating more gridlocks and conceivably more accidents as patrons drive in and out of the development parking. Liquor store patrons will circle around the neighbourhood for parking and likely park along 22nd in front of Renfrew Elementary School.

The BC Liquor Store is conveniently located within a quick drive on 3150 Broadway. There is no need for another liquor store. A liquor store will attract panhandlers and alcoholics to the neighbourhood, thereby creating concerns for nuisances, health and safety. The school field across the street will likely be used by drinking parties. A liquor store is better situated on a main road with easy access and away from schools and family dwellings.

A Studio applied to change the retail space at 3737 Rupert St (DP2020-00937) to a liquor store in 2020. When the application was refused in May 2021, A Studio submitted an appeal to the decision. A Studio's application intends to use the space as a liquor store from the get go,

refuses to accept the rationale for rejecting the application, and •more importantly, has no respect for the neighbourhood's objections to the liquor store application. This brings serious concerns on how responsible the developer and the operator will be in doing their parts in keeping the neighbourhood safe.
