

This location is right next to a Library where a lot of children and youth will be visiting, not to mention Captain Cook Elementary that is located a 2-min walk away. Kids that go to the school live in the neighborhood and walk to school, passing by the proposed cannabis store. Young parents take their young toddlers and children to the library. There's also a tutoring place in the plaza where young people attend. It is a family oriented neighbourhood and it's not a place to be selling cannabis. The location is within a medical professional office building with dental and optometrist offices and the cannabis store is out of place among these surrounding businesses. The space should be saved for family and youth friendly businesses such as tutoring or after school care/day care. I do not want my kids to have to pass by the cannabis store and be exposed to the environment whenever the visit the library or go see the optometrist. Champlain Square has always been a quiet residential neighbourhood mall / plaza, with a sizable amount of customer traffic being senior residents from the nearby area. The VPL Champlain Heights branch is foot steps away from the proposal location, and this branch has traditionally enjoyed a strong children programme. The East 54th & Kerr intersection is also a common walking route for children going to and from school, whether it is for Captain Cook Elementary (and kindergarten) to the east, or Killarney Secondary to the north. Furthermore, Captain Cook Elementary is less than 300m away from the proposed cannabis location, which means it is practically right next door. Killarney secondary is also only about 1km away, so it is within easy walking distance.

For these reasons alone, I think it is entirely inappropriate to have a cannabis store set up shop at Champlain Square.

Why do we need this kind of business? Are we better off to have another business there? So, I am opposing it

- 1. The building is primarily a medical building with majority of the patrons seeking various kinds of medical services. The introduction of a weed store will potentially bring adverse health effects to this vulnerable population.
- 2. Introduction of a weed store will inevitably bring about more canabis smoking in the area, resulting in ingestion toxic ammonia which is know to result in neuorbehavioural impairments and much more. This effect will bemore prominent in this particular neighbourhood with a high percentage of young families and seniors, both more likely to be affected by the contamination associated with increase in smoking cannabis.
- 3. There is a primary school right next to the proposed location. It's absolutely unacceptable. Don't disturb our life. This is residential area, not commercial area. Keep Canabis store away from this area please.

I opposed to have a cannabis retailer at this location because:

- A. There are already two existing cannabis retailers within 3 km of this location:
- 1) 4 Twenty Cannabis, 3441 Kingsway, 1.7 km, 20 minutes walking distance. (East of this location)
- 2) Weeds, 2580 Kingsway, 2.7 km, 5 minutes driving. (North West of this location)

"Increasing cannabis retail access was associated with increased current and frequent use" (Everton, Dilley, Maher & Mack, 2019). There is no need to open another cannabis retailer at this location to encourage the use of cannabis.

- B. There are two schools nearby this location:
- 1) Captain James Cook Elementary School, 3340 East 54th Avenue, 280 m, 4 minutes walking distance. (East of this location)
- 2) Killarney Secondary School, 6454 Killarney Street, 950 m, 12 minutes walking distance. (West of this location)

A cannabis retailer and a storefront advertisement could have detrimental effects on youth and naive users at heightened risk for poisoning and emergency visits. There are massive youth and elementary students walking along this section of East 54th between home and schools on daily basis. It is definitely not a suitable location for a cannabis retailer.

Strongly oppose. This is a quiet, family oriented neighborhood. Schools, day care, single mothers center, senior facilities within a block to 2 blocks radius. Hours of operation till 11pm.???? Not OK. NoT Responsibile. Not welcome in As an individual who frequent the area of E54th Ave (Champlain Square Strip Mall), I oppose the above-noted cannabis store application: - Cannabis retail stores should not be allowed to operate near elementary schools. In this case, the distance between the 3158 E54th Ave and Captain James Cook Elementary School is only 280m (Google Map) which is very troubling. Risks include having an increased amount of marijuana users in the area frequented by children; edible cannabis products (eg. candies) could be located by children and ingested inadvertently. In addition, children/teens will have easier access to cannabis products.

- The dispensary might lead to higher crime rate in this neighborhood due to its long hours of operation.

- Marijuana odor affects the daily lives/health of residents (non marijuana users, elderly, children) in the neighborhood. For instance, it would be very difficult for residents to enjoy themselves in their front yards or backyards having to put up with marijuana odor. Non users would also need to put up with the unpleasant smell when their windows are opened.

This is a family friendly area with a library, school, and residential are all nearby. There are many other useful services or venues that could be provided in this area and a weed store is not one of them.

I think it is a bad idea to put it nearby a school because there will be children and youth, who walk by. In the same building, there are also medical offices and are most likely people who have substance abuse issues who have appointments. Walking by a weed shop won't help.

Totally disagree with the application as it is near an elementary school and not far away from Killarney Secondary school. Would like to retain the area as an family friendly environment.

This mall is surrounded by residential homes where there is a large population of young families. The elementary school is 280 meters east which is inside the 300 meter limit. The Vancouver public library is about 100 meters away which is within the 300 meters required for a community center (yes, libraries are community centers). The professional building has doctor's offices of which children frequent. Although 54th Ave is a main road it is not a major arterial route. This is not a location where a cannabis store should be located. Having a Retail Cannabis Store literally 2 blocks away from an elementary school is ridiculous and an unsafe choice for development. This is a familyfriendly neighbourhood where lots of kids are always around- some who are typically developing, some who are immunocompromised, some who may be struggling at home, some witnessing the horrible effects of drug-use, etc. Although I recognize that cannabis is a legal drug, the province is still struggling with a high rate of drug overdoses every day. Children are not sheltered from this fact and having a cannabis store would only drive up addiction and druguse rates if the province has yet to commit to programs of safer drug use. Until we can see the results of a decrease in drug overdoses, a School of Selfimprovement in a FAMILY-FRIENDLY neighbourhood seems to be more idealistic than a retail cannabis store. The city doesn't need to have another cannabis store that's accessible to children and teens. The city needs a place to help support the mental and emotional health and well-being of people especially children and teens. I ask that you reconsider this development plan for the sake of all the young families around our neighbourhood, trying to ensure that our children and teens will be safe and healthy, and not lured into the drugaddiction spiral.

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

Several years ago, a cannabis retail store applied for a location on Tyne Street, near the Champlain Community Centre, where many student programs operated daily. The business application was rejected due to being within 300 metre of a school, along with a petition and media attention.

Cook Elementary School, Ecole Anne Hebert Elementary School, Gingerbread Daycare, Champlain's Preschool, and Champlain Library are all very close to Champlain Mall. Many young students walk by themselves through Champlain Mall or along 54th Avenue on weekdays. Champlain Elementary, Killamey Secondary and two nearby community centres (Killarney and Champlain) are also within walking distance of Champlain Mall.

Since it's a retail store which strives to be profitable, it may not be diligent in checking ID, unlike the nearby government-run liquor store. I still recall buying cigarettes as a minor from small retail stores, despite the law requires ID. Champlain Mall is a high traffic area of young children and teens due to the close proximity of two preschools, three elementary schools, a children's library, two community centres with many children programs and a high school.

Cook School, Ecole Anne Hebert, Gingerbread Daycare are all within 300 metres from Champlain Mall. If a cannabis store isn't permitted by the City of Vancouver to be within 300 metres of a school, many people are wondering how and why this retail cannabis store application is being considered, when it s.22(1) should have already denied or rejected. 
