, ECCC has issued a <u>Heat Warning</u> effective today and they expect it to be in place until Friday or Saturday. The City has activated its extreme heat plans and cooling centres have been opened today. They will remain open during published hours until the Heat Warning is lifted. \~All officers, be aware of all the Cooling stations available for public in the COV.

The Fire Chief has issued a Fire Order to have the 200 block and surrounding of East Hastings to be removed in the coming weeks. This will start today.

Fire crews, especially 2,1, and 8 hall need to be vigilant on calls and aware there may be some angst among the Downtown Eastside community because of this.

Fire crews should roll up windows and lock doors at incidents near this.

The order is attached, and contains some of the following;

- Having tents/structures and storage on the sidewalks creates a huge risk to the buildings and their occupants, the people on the streets and our firefighters
- Firefighters and first responders need to have clear and unfettered access to buildings and that is not feasible at the moment

- To date this year, we have 860 reported outdoor and structure fires with damage in the downtown areas of our Halls 2,1,8. This is a 103% increase since 2018.
- Many structures/tents are blocking emergency exits and access to fire department connections.
- Open flames and fire hazards have been found throughout the area.
- The BC Fire Code, the BC Building Code and Vancouver Fire By-Law are all in contravention.
- VFRS has been providing fire extinguisher training and fire safety messaging with the community over the past couple of weeks. VFRS and Sanitation have removed over 20 20lb propane tanks from the Hastings Street encampment in the last 2 weeks.
- Fire spreads very quickly, when against a building, it will travel it up the outside and into the roof structure very easily. The church on East Hastings Street was a prime example of this.
- The order requires that the tents, structures and storage are removed from the sidewalks and streets. We will work with the City of Vancouver Engineering and ACCS. We are not saying that people have to leave.

In conclusion, I want thank all our staff for their hard work with the *challenges we face in regards to staffing/overtime. These are trying times, and we do appreciate the hard work by all.

Following the Vancouver Fire Rescue Services (VFRS) initial announcement to Operational Response Adjustments on July 11, 2022, VFRS paused these operational changes in order to again look at alternatives to address some of our capacity and resource issues with BCEHS leadership and allow time for ambulance to communicate to their staff of any changes in order to best serve the citizens of Vancouver.

After re-visiting discussions with BCEHS and looking at alternatives to address capacity and resource issues, we agree that these operational changes to non-life threatening medical calls will increase the valuable resources available for imminent life threatening emergencies VFRS responds to everyday and will increase public safety in Vancouver.

VFRS will be implementing this operational changes effective July 26, 2022 at 0800 as a trial until September 30, 2022.

As originally stated the Department's Inter-hall correspondence on July 11, 2022 we will no longer respond to Orange, Yellow or non-emergency incidents where we do not have a specialty. VFRS will continue to provide medical responses to life threatening calls, red and purple, overdoses and any call involving burns, hazmat or a motor vehicle accident and any call with a clinical or operational need for first responder expertise, such as an environmental or safety risk (e.g. technical rescue).

VFRS and BCEHS have and will continue to continue meet on a regular basis with the continued goal of caring for the citizens and visitors to the City of Vancouver in the delivery of pre-hospital care.

Local 18 and VFRS have collaborated on an initiative to show support for Vancouver's queer community and our own employees who are members of this community in advance of **Vancouver's Pride Parade on July 31st, 2022.**

Engine 6, which serves the West End, inclusive of Davie Village known for its gay history, has been wrapped in the rainbow flag. The rainbow flag has been a rallying sign for 46 years for the queer community. The flag was designed to represent people of all ages, races and genders within the gay community and has been updated here with the chevron which draws attention to trans folks, indigenous peoples, and people of colour. The union logo with rainbow colours is in pride of place and superimposed on the flag.

VFRS and L18 members have participated in The Vancouver Pride Parade for many years.

The parade began as a protest against social and legal persecution and has evolved into more of a celebration. Our current queer community, now often represented by the acronym 2SLGBTQ+ (which stands for two-spirited, lesbian, gay, bisexual, trans, queer, plus other sexual minorities), has experienced a history of persecution and continues to be under attack by various religious and political groups.

Local18 provides volunteers and t-shirts and other merchandise for the parade and VFRS supplies personnel, on-duty apparatus and financial contributions. Together we are working towards a society where people do not have to hide their identities to be accepted.

LOCAL 18 CREST / LOGO

In late 2014 the Vancouver Fire Fighters' Union, International Association of Fire Fighters' Local 18 (IAFF Local 18), located in Vancouver, British Columbia, began a journey to create an IAFF representative crest that was as unique a crest as Vancouver is a City. Three key ideas were consistent in our conversations; we wanted to show our pride in our city, our love of the ocean and mountains that Vancouver lays between, and our respect for the Coast Salish First Nation People. With this goal, we approached the Urban Native Youth Association of Vancouver and began conversations with Marie Wustner, the Graphic Arts and Media Coordinator of their Overly Creative Minds Art Studio (OCM). Both parties quickly agreed that working together on this endeavor would be not only exciting, but also a great opportunity for the OCM youth to gain real world design experience by working with a client in a professional manner.

Our joint decision was to create a distinctive piece of art as well as provide a valuable life experience for up and coming Indigenous artists. We held a design contest with first, second and third place cash prizes. All of the participating youth had an opportunity to receive mentorship and guidance from an established Form Line Artist before they submitted their designs. A little background here, Form Line, also known as West Coast First Nations design, is a celebrated cultural heritage here in British Columbia. Form Line is found on the traditional regalia, totem poles, and longhouses of many Coast Salish Communities. At the hands of skilled artists, these geometric designs come alive with animals, people, and traditional stories. The trained eye can decipher centuries old history within these complicated designs. It was important to the members of Local 18 to represent their community to its fullest and what better way than to incorporate the rich heritage of the First Peoples of this land.

Our initial contest meeting included a table full of excited youth eager to show off their skills, which was very motivating for everyone involved. Their genuine enthusiasm to learn more about Local 18 was evident and by the end of the conversation they understood that "Local" refers to the men and women that make up the Vancouver Fire & Rescue Services. We shared our desire to create a heritage piece that represents us, the city we work in, and the citizens that make it what it is. Local 18 has nearly a century of pride filled history as a founding member of the IAFF and we wanted to work with people that share that pride in their own history and sense of family. The youth learned that the winner would move forward into a professional relationship with us, and gain the experience of seeing a project through to completion with a client. This would include regular communication with Shea Hobbis, our union representative and numerous rounds of tweaks and changes, thus gaining experience working with a Union that has many members and a democratic process of deciding how the logo could best represent our community.

Elvis Chevrefils, a 23 year old Metis and Filipino youth took first place for his cityscape and crest concept. Artist Kelsey Hall was then recruited by OCM's Wustner to design the Raven inside the Maltese cross. Hall is one of Vancouver's up and coming First Nations Artists. His unique style blends the old and new by incorporating traditional Form Line into his Pop Culture designs. Wustner worked closely with Chevrefils, Hall, and Hobbis to finalize the design. Wustner, an exceptional graphic designer herself, then digitally fused the form line, cityscape, and mountain range creating the overall design. The final digital rendering and mountain landscape was completed by Local 18's own John Nicholson.

The completed logo and crest embodies a Form Line Raven representing the protector and the Vancouver skyline reflected in a Pacific Ocean inlet, blanketed by our soaring mountain range. The incorporation of these uniquely Vancouver elements make this logo so special and truly worthy of being called a 'legacy piece'.

The entire experience from beginning to end served to further instill a great sense of excitement and pride for all involved. Local 18 came away from the process with a wonderful crest that captured everything we wanted. The new IAFF Local 18 crest perfectly fuses together the stunning geographical beauty juxtaposed to our modern city and a piece of IAFF history made new by incorporating the cultural legacy of some of the communities we protect.

Fittingly, it is the Raven, the protector that you see in our crest.

Subject: 2022 Celebration of Lights July 23rd, July 27th, July 30^{th -} Overview

The 2022 Celebration of Lights is quickly approaching following a two year hiatus. Once again English Bay and a large portion of the West End inclusive of Kits point will be affected. The three nights of celebration will involve a substantial amount of Departmental apparatus movements and increased radio traffic.

Terminology:

Hot Zone:

Red areas on the attached Map (Mainly the areas highly congested surrounding the Beaches and adjacent streets.)

Warm Zone:

Beige areas on the attached Map (Mainly an extension of the warm zone, less affected, but still with limited access.)

Traffic Closure Zone:

No vehicles, except residential after 1900 hours (Alberni - south to the Beach and Thurlow - West to the Park)

AREA Command:

This is a Unified Command that will have direct control over all VFRS/BCAS inside the "Hot Zone" of the event. AREA Command will be located at Lord Roberts School 1100 Bidwell St. using the VFRS Mobile Command Unit.

Mobile Command Unit (Command 4):

This is VFRS' Command/Special Operation Vehicle. It has state of the art technology including; All radio capability, computers, and can capture CCTV live feed for situational awareness using agile mesh remote cameras. It will be located at inside the hot zone to assist with live video feeds of the event and other technology needs. Video feed captured will be feed to EOC via WebEx with assistance from VFRS Communications and VFRS EM staff.

De-Confliction:

A unified approach to deal with all movement in the general area (Kits point, Downtown core), not yet inside the "Hot Zone" - This is staffed at AREA CMD by VFRS (BAT 4) and BCAS (Event Commander) with direct link to VPD (Silver Commander) at VPD DOC if required.

Emergency Operations Center (EOC – Fire OPS):

Overall City wide view of resources and issues that impact the entire City - It is located at ECOMM and staffed with many stakeholders including VFRS/VPD/BCAS/ VEMA/ Park Rangers

Quick Response Technicians (QRT's:)

We will have 5 Sectors with 1 QRT Lieutenant in each sector. Their role is to be an immediate assessment and size up of all alarms within the Warm or Hot Zone and directly communicating with AREA Command. They will not be tactically involved in any Firefighting and can only enter buildings to see the annunciator. (QRT's will monitor PFA CMD 2 and switch to Assigned Tac Channel once dispatched to investigate an alarm) ECOMM Fire Dispatch will have dedicated fire dispatcher assigned to the COL Event for continuity. QRT's will perform an initial size up on the assigned Tac Channel to inform responding apparatus of status of the alarm activation. AREA Command (Fire) will be in communication with both responding apparatus as QRT during initial response and investigation phase of fire alarm incident.

Apparatus movement:

Entered into the FDM and reflective of the list below. (Late changes may occur due to unforeseen issues with Apparatus)

Officer are to review FDM at start of shift to ensure awareness of apparatus movement and Fill In assignments. VFRS Operational Planning Documents for each COL night will be sent to individual shifts involved.

Once at the staged locations, apparatus will remain at that location until assigned to an incident or released by AREA Command. (Apparatus are to monitor VFRS Dispatch 1 and PFA CMD 2 until assigned to an incident) Inform Fire Dispatch and AREA Command once at location.

Please reference FDM and Operational Planning Document for apparatus movement. These are:

As in past years, there is to be <u>no unauthorized movement</u> of apparatus. If dispatched into the **Traffic Closure Zone** (west of Thurlow and South of Alberni) even though dispatched Emergency, there are to be no sirens / air horns unless directed by AREA Command who will contact the apparatus on tactical channel assigned to the response.

Drivers:

If you are dispatched on an Emergency Call within the traffic closure area, drivers are reminded that they can drive with lights only, providing they follow all traffic laws. Please use proper judgment in travelling in these areas.

There is to be <u>no apparatus driving</u> on Robson, Denman, Davie or Beach unless directed by AREA Command. **NO EXCEPTIONS.**

Procedures on alarms:

If you are dispatched into the Hot or Warm Zone, Officers must be available for additional information on the assigned Tactical Channel. All Officers in and adjacent to the affected zones should contact AREA Command on the assigned Tactical Channel as soon as they are en route from 1830 until AREA Command stands down (approximately 2359 hours)

Please see below for secondary apparatus (second in) staging parameters when dispatched to fire calls within the West End:

- Fire calls south of Burnaby Street and west of Thurlow Street, supporting apparatus to stage at Pacific & Thurlow or as otherwise directed by Event command.
- Fire Calls south of Pendrell to Burnaby Street and west of Thurlow Street, supporting apparatus to stage at Davie Street and Thurlow Street or as otherwise directed by Event command.

 Fire calls north of Pendrell and west of Bidwell, supporting apparatus to approach via Robson Street and Denman Street, then stage at Denman and Nelson Streets or as otherwise directed by Event command.

TAC Channels Utilized During the event:

- Apparatus Noted above who will be staged to Support the COL Event will monitor Dispatch 1 and PFA CMD 2 with the exception of the Fireboat which will monitor VFRS TAC 15 as well as their appropriate Marine Channel.
- The PSU will monitor PFA CMD2 and VPD assigned EVENT Channel.



Dear Representatives of the City of Vancouver

RE: July 25 Order Issued by Vancouver Fire & Rescue Services

We write as a member of the #StopTheSweeps Coalition and a member of the Vancouver Street Sweeps Working Group, ostensibly created to develop an alternative to the harmful practice of street sweeps.

#StopTheSweeps

Since last fall, Pivot alongside other members of #StopTheSweeps have highlighted the harmful impact of "street sweeps," referring to the daily practice of City Engineering Workers and Vancouver Police Department (VPD) officers moving throughout the Downtown Eastside seizing possessions, notionally in order to 'clean' City property.¹ In June 2022, VPD announced its withdrawal from the street sweep, effectively ending the practice on July 1, 2022. In the subsequent 24 days, the City of Vancouver has displayed its absolute incompetence and inability to meaningfully respond to the needs of people who rely on public space. Members of the Street Sweeps Working Group have received requests to assist City Engineering to displace people in order to wash the sidewalks, we have been advised of health and safety hazards, and on the afternoon of July 25 we were made aware of an order issued by Karen Fry, Fire Chief, Vancouver Fire Rescue Services. From August 3 onwards we understand that "city staff will be available to support removal of structures," and the City has expressed plans to return to daily sweeps the following week.

In response to this order and planned decampment, we request a meeting with Chief Karen Fry and Assistant Chief David Meers from Vancouver Fire & Rescue and relevant decision-makers within the City of Vancouver on August 2, 2022.

In advance of that meeting, we require the following information. Please advise:

- what evidence you are relying upon to conclude that those evicted from Hastings Street will be safer overall camping alone, away from Hastings Street;
- what evidence you are relying upon to conclude that those evicted from Hastings Street will be more fire safe camping alone, away from Hastings Street;
- how you have ensured that those evicted have somewhere to shelter in public space, off of Hastings Street;
- how you have addressed the increased risk of drug poisoning deaths because people are being dispersed;
- how you have have addressed the impact of extreme heat on those people being dispersed.

Continued acts of interference, displacement, and targeting of people who rely on public space constitute hostile decampment efforts and are completely at odds with the human rights of folks who shelter on public space. These hostile activities have been aided by stigmatizing news coverage²,³,⁴,⁵ and the pro-displacement politics that characterize the majority of municipal politicians and candidates in Vancouver. Notably, they offer no solutions or effective interventions, just calls to disappear visible poverty.

Addressing Decampment

This week, we learned of the Fire Chief's Order from a City of Vancouver Information Bulletin. The Chief's order calls for the immediate removal of tents and structures along East Hastings Street. Despite this far-reaching order, neither the City of Vancouver nor the Province of BC has stepped in to provide immediate emergency shelter. When we asked "where will people go?" not a single government official could provide a response.

Concerns raised by Vancouver Fire Rescue Services (VFRS)

Rather than enforce this order against people who rely on public space, we request the following:

- 1. **Rescind the orde**r issued by the Fire Chief on July 25, 2022.
- 2. **Eliminate the enforcement** of *Street and Traffic By-Laws* against people who rely on public space, including anti-sheltering bylaws which prohibit people from spacing out as required.
- 3. **Repurpose street space** between Zero-300 Hastings Blocks for sheltering, walking, rolling, and vending activities.
- 4. Work with Our Streets, residents, and allied organizations such as Overdose Prevention Society to develop and implement a **harm reduction approach to fire safety** on Hastings.
 - a. Provide resources which concretely support fire safety on Hastings, including regular fire safety trainings for community members and Block Stewards, the

regular distribution of fire extinguishers to appointed community Fire Captains and Block Stewards

5. Operationalize **City responsibilities regarding decampment**, as outlined in the 2021 MOU between the City and province of BC.

Fire safety has been driving displacement and banishment for decades with no evidence that it keeps people safe. Using fire safety to displace people from Hastings will increase overdose & fatality risks by driving isolation. Displacement does not increase fire safety, and certainly does not increase overall safety, for those forced to live outdoors in this ongoing housing crisis.

Based on reporting by BC Coroners Services, tent fires are a tiny part of the "accidental deaths" that kill unhoused residents. Tables 1 & 2 are taken from the Coroners Service report: "Reportable Deaths of Homeless Individuals, 2007 -2016." While no one should ignore the seriousness of fire safety, fires remain an infinitesimal portion of the mortality risks faced by unsheltered people. The first shows that accidental deaths make up 56% of the total number of deaths among unhoused people. The second shows that, of accidental deaths, only 2% are related to fire. In direct contrast, drug poisoning is an immediate and extreme risk, only increased by isolation.

Fire is a Constant Fear in SROs

Concerns about fire safety do not end if people are moved indoors or forced to reside in unsafe SROs. A spate of recent fires in the DTES illustrate this - including the fatal Winters Hotel Fire.⁷

According to the Office of the Fire Commissioner's (OFC) annual reports, between 2019-2021, fire-related deaths in BC rose from 27 to 59—a 119% increase.8 OFC data shows that most fire-related deaths and injuries occur in residential structures. Since the pandemic began in 2020, there was a significant increase in injuries and deaths. Ignition by "smoker's material and open flame" showed a large jump from pre-pandemic 2019 (498 fires and 4 deaths) to 2020 (529 fires and 12 deaths) and 2021 (653 fires and 8 deaths). With increased isolated drug use indoors, the risk of deadly fires also increases. The same harm reduction logic of overdose prevention (don't use alone) applies to fire safety (don't live alone).

The reports also emphasize that working smoke alarms and sprinklers remain the most effective way to prevent injuries and deaths. In the DTES, SROs and shelters are notoriously neglected and often don't have working fire alarms or sprinklers. The consequences of a fire in these structures are severe, with death, injury, and displacement almost guaranteed (as demonstrated by the Winters Hotel fire). Forcing people into these fire-prone buildings is the opposite of decreasing 'fire risk'.

Harm Reduction, and Multiple Safety Struggles

Being unhoused means being forced into unsafe conditions, and often having to weigh multiple competing safety risks. All too often, municipalities weaponize these safety concerns to justify eviction.

The National Protocol for Homeless Encampments in Canada, discusses how "municipal governments deploy bylaws, local police, and zoning policies that displace people in encampments, in turn compromising the physical and psychological health of people who have no place else to go and who rely on encampments to survive, absent accessible alternatives." 9

A harm reduction approach to outdoor sheltering is long overdue. An open letter signed by over 100 members of the local public health community was released in August 2018, at a time when the provincial government was actively engaged in the attempted evictions of tent cities in Nanaimo, Maple Ridge, and Saanich.¹⁰ The letter discussed how safety concerns are weaponized to displace unhouse people supposedly for their own safety, with the end result that people are no safer. The letters specifically spoke to fire safety, and how "Overemphasizing fire safety can obscure and exacerbate other harms."

Fire Departments across the province have been used to perform "ethical evictions" of unhoused people supposedly for their own safety. While these evictions may be well intended, they ignore the greater context of homelessness, and the competing safety concerns people face every day.

- Daily displacement itself causes "impaired sleep and serious psychological pain and stress and creates a risk to their health."¹¹
- Repeated displacement "often leads to the migration of unhoused individuals towards more remote, isolated locations as a means to avoid detection."
- When people are isolated, they are less likely to be noticed when they are in crisis, whether due to an overdose, fire, or other safety issue. This is especially critical given that drug/alcohol poisoning makes up 72% of accidental deaths among the unhoused.

While the realities of fire safety cannot be ignored, fire safety is one of many competing safety concerns facing those sheltering outdoors. Even David Meers, assistant chief with Vancouver Fire and Rescue Services, recognizes that displacement through a fire order does not ensure people will be more fire-safe elsewhere. Instead of using broad and heavy-handed tools such as Fire Chief orders, we ask the City to engage with residents in a spirit of collaboration and harm reduction on this issue. We note that VFRS has never done a study on tent fires and cannot offer clear guidance from a realistic perspective that acknowledges there is insufficient housing and people are forced to live in informal shelters.

Supporting Community-Based Fire Safety

Our Streets is building out community and safety, but we need concrete resourcing to support this process. We support the demands outlined by Our Streets:

- 1. The City of Vancouver and BC Housing must provide livable, dignified, and accessible housing to all.
 - a. As well, both institutions must take accountability for the inhumane living conditions currently present in Single Room Occupancies (SROs).
 - b. If the City and BC Housing fail to provide any housing options, there must be alternative locations provided for folks to tent without threats of eviction.
- 2. The City of Vancouver must provide an adequate number of appropriate hygienic facilities such as bathrooms and showers to residents of the DTES, whether housed or unhoused.
- 3. The Fire Department must acknowledge the unique set of needs our community faces with the overlapping toxic drug supply, lack of adequate housing, daily police violence, and effects of intergenerational trauma resulting from colonization
 - a. To reflect this, they must adopt a true harm reduction approach to fire safety
 - b. Fire Chief Karen Fry must reverse the fire order.
- 4. The immediate end to enforcement of bylaws created to criminalize poverty.

City Commitments to Nondisplacement

Courts have explicitly recognized that "if the occupants of the encampments are enjoined from using those encampments, they will present the same risk of fires, wherever they move to, unless they move to alternate shelters." While this statement was made in the context of winter, the same reasoning applies: if people are moved without their underlying needs being met they will suffer the same risk of fire safety wherever they go. We recognize that tent/shelter spacing is important to increase fire safety. The #StoptheSweeps coalition is working on educating residents on this issue and supporting them in increasing spacing where possible.

People with lived experience are the authorities on their own health and safety and must be listened to. People who are unsheltered are the ones who have to navigate myriad safety challenges on a daily basis. We have to listen to them when they tell us how to support them in staying safe. They are not calling for their own eviction to nowhere.

The order issued on July 25, 2022, is effectively an order to decamp residents sheltering along Hastings. We ask that the City cease its constant displacement activities and actually provide concrete support to address the public safety issues that are affecting Hastings Tent City residents. While there are several reasons people are sheltering on Hastings, we know that crowded conditions are primarily a result of government legislation prohibiting people from camping in other locations. People cannot space out if they have nowhere to space out to. When the status quo is constant displacement, people will naturally gravitate towards wherever they can find a measure of stability. If the City wants to decrease crowding in order to increase fire safety, then they need to advise people where they can set up tents without facing constant eviction.

A review of existing by-laws and legislation makes clear that there is only one location in the entire City of Vancouver where unhoused people can rest on more than an overnight basis. That location is a small portion of CRAB park which is already at capacity. Every other space is barred by various pieces of legislation – whether federal (such as the Port), provincial, municipal, regional, or parks. In addition, the City has no alternative housing or shelter plans in place for unhoused people and their possessions during the day. Even if it is raining or there are other extreme weather conditions, and all the indoor spaces are at full capacity, you are violating by-laws if you set up a tent to shelter yourself and your belongings from the elements.

Evicting outdoor shelters because of their crowded conditions ignores the role government actors, including the City of Vancouver, play in creating crowded conditions. It is the City's (in conjunction with the Park Board's) own policies of daily displacement which make it impossible for unhoused people to space out.

Even recent reports authored by the City of Vancouver, such as the MMIWG2S Response Report includes a recommendation to "end the criminalization of homelessness by eliminating bylaw infractions and criminal charges for sleeping or tenting in public spaces and end the displacement of tent cities." ¹⁴

Support for Unsheltered Vancouver Residents

We refer to the March 31, 2021 "Memorandum of Understanding on Support for Unsheltered Vancouver Residents," signed by the Parks Board, City and Province. This MOU outlines commitments that the City has endorsed, yet in the leadup to the Fire Chief's order the City has failed to operationalize anything.

In this MOU, the City made the following commitment concerning responding to future encampments: "When suitable spaces are available for people to move indoors, to provide enforcement of City of Vancouver by-laws" (emphasis added).¹⁶

Per the terms of this MOU, the City of Vancouver should not be enforcing by-laws which displace unhoused people unless there is "suitable space" for them to move into. BC courts have recognized that in the context of tent cities, spaces must not simply exist, they also need to be "accessible".¹⁷ For example, a bed is not "accessible" if it requires residents to follow rules they cannot reasonably follow or if they cannot afford the rates.¹⁸ In Vancouver, there are not only an insufficient number of beds but those that exist are frequently inaccessible. These reasons range from rules banning pets, partners and substance use, through to feeling unsafe in these spaces, and having had negative experiences including bedbugs and being turned away. These reports accord with the City of Vancouver's own data in the most recent Vancouver Homeless Count 2021.¹⁹ People who stay outdoors instead of in an emergency shelter are not making an arbitrary 'choice.'²⁰ In addition, several of Vancouver's shelters are closed during the day, increasing the numbers of people sheltering outside during daytime hours.

According to the City's own commitments, the City and the VFRS should abstain from enforcing bylaws which displace people in the absence of proper housing.

Conclusion

As long as there is inadequate, accessible housing there will be people sheltering in tents and makeshift shelters outside. We ask that the City, and the VFRS specifically, work with Our Streets and the residents on Hastings to ensure fire safety is approached from a harm reduction lens, not in a way which ignores other safety concerns and ultimately causes more harm.



FIRE SAFETY RESOURCE: Homeless encampments

Fire safety is a common concern at any campsite including homeless encampments. While encampments can offer those experiencing homelessness a sense of community and security compared to living in isolation, there may also be health and safety hazards present. Preventing and mitigating these risks is best addressed through a collaborative approach from local partners. This approach should be grounded in the principles of harm reduction, health promotion, and respect for the dignity and rights of people living in encampments.

Without access to heat, cooking facilities, or fresh water, people living in encampments may have to choose between safety and survival. Campers may use or store flammables in or near tents and in vehicles, use candles, propane heaters and cook with fire often in enclosed spaces. Substance use, health and mental health issues, and poverty may also impact a person's ability to shelter safely outdoors. These dangers can increase in extreme cold when people are desperate to stay warm and in hot, dry weather when wildfires and grassfires are a concern. *Keeping people in encampments safe and healthy is the priority, namely when safe and suitable housing are not available.*

The Fire Safety Resource includes basic fire prevention information and considerations for community partners when developing and implementing **local action plans** to address fire safety, prevention and response in homeless encampments. Plans should detail roles, responsibilities, engagement and communication strategies, and key activities to reduce risk and promote safety for those living in encampments. Partners may include:

- Local fire departments and prevention services;
- Local government (including bylaw, police, sanitation/waste disposal);
- Health authority, public and environmental health officers;
- Local First Nations and other Indigenous leaders and service providers;
- Homelessness outreach and service providers; and
- Community groups, volunteer organizations and people sheltering in encampments.

Strategies for fire prevention and fire protection:

Engage outreach providers and communicate with people in encampments:

- Service providers and first responders should engage and communicate with campers to identify, explain, and mitigate potential risks and hazards:
 - Develop a rapport with campers, communicating potential risks or hazards and explaining how they represent a danger to life
 - o Consider implementing regular 'walk-throughs' to assess for and address hazards
 - Ensure accessible information (i.e. signage) is in place, with fire safety tips, such as the proper handling and storing of flammable materials, liquids, and gases (e.g. firewood, kindling, gasoline, propane, etc.)Work with the occupants to find ways to safely address the hazards and what to do in case of a fire (fire safety plan, call 911, etc.)
- If providing training on fire safety and response collaborative engagement with campers is unsuccessful, fire services and community partners may:
 - o Discuss the use of inspection authority under the local bylaw or the Fire Services Act
 - Discuss having the local fire chief issue an order under the bylaw or the Fire Services Act to the owner or occupier to remove the hazard(s) (see local bylaw or Section 21 and 22 of the Fire Services Act)
 - Contact the local Fire Service Advisor from the Office of the Fire Commissioner for advice or assistance: 1-888-988-9488

General Safety for Encampments:

- Ensure tents and structures (i.e. lean-tos) are separated by at least two metres and have a clear path of exit out of the encampment to a safe area
- Ensure encampments are clear of combustible material, clutter and debris that could impede exits or contribute to the rapid spread of fire. Remove such material and keep it away from tents or structures.
- Plan for regular garbage and waste disposal and assist with removing clutter or debris.

- If generators are used in the encampment, ensure adequate clearance from combustibles and adequate air circulation to avoid carbon monoxide buildup in or near tents and enclosed structures.
- Where appropriate, some campsites may include sacred fire ceremonies for Indigenous peoples; all
 participants, including local authorities and Indigenous liaisons should work toward the accommodation
 of safe fires for spiritual purposes.
- Consider the following interventions when developing and implementing an encampment safety plan:
 - Suitable fire protection/response equipment, such as fire suppression blankets, smoke alarms for RVs, portable fire extinguishers, or buckets of sand
 - First aid kits to treat minor injuries
 - o Central cooking area that includes adequate clearance from combustibles
 - Electricity/charging stations for electrical devices whenever possible to encourage their use over open flame devices

Non-combustible ashtrays and cigarette disposal pots provided in designated smoking areas can help prevent smoking in tents.

- **Tents:** If tarps are used to cover the tents, they should be flame resistant, secured, and do not to cover more than one tent.
- No open flames should be used inside tents for heating, lighting, or cooking (i.e.: candles, propane stoves, propane heaters).
 - Battery powered lanterns should be used whenever possible but may not be cost-effective
- **Campfires:** ensure any outdoor wood burning open flame fires are supervised and are downwind with adequate separation from a tent or stored combustibles
 - Fully put out fires before leaving a campsite or before retiring for the night. Water is best
 - Keep campfires to a small, manageable size no more than 1 metre (3 feet) high by 1 metre (3 feet) in diameter and don't let it get out of hand
 - o Refrain from burning garbage. The smell is unpleasant and may attract animals to your campsite
 - Keep all combustible materials, including flammable liquids, propane cylinders, lighting fluid, etc. away from the campfire
- RVs and Vehicle Sheltering:
 - o Install at least one smoke alarm and a carbon monoxide alarm
 - o Have a fire extinguisher on hand
 - Regularly check the safety of all fuel-burning appliances, gas cylinders and pipes, and mechanical hook-ups – especially after driving on bumpy or bushy roads
 - Store all flammable liquids away from the vehicle

I am hoping that you are still meeting regularly with the cross ministry encampment team. In the past couple of weeks, the area known as the downtown eastside, primarily Hastings St resembles an

encampment on the sidewalks.

This has escalated to the point of 2 solid blocks of tents/structures and tarps against buildings and blocking doors.

While I appreciate that there are advocates for many of these vulnerable people. I am extremely concerned with the safety in this area. The BC Fire Code is strict on combustibles materials against buildings Tisk of fire Tand under the BCBC Division B: Part 2, Section 2.4 Fire Hazards. Whether a building is sprinklered or not, a fire starting on the outside may quickly travel up the side of the building, under the sheaths and into the roof structure. We quickly saw this last week in this exact neighbourhood. We have had over 770 structure and outdoor fires in our downtown area (Halls 8,2,1) this year already. Fortunately, the response of our fire department and those buildings with sprinklers have reduced the impact from many of those fires.

Apart from the risk to the buildings, and what can potentially happen to the hundreds of housing units located in the DTES, those living in these tents, structures are at a grave risk from being able to escape in the event of an emergency. Access to the buildings is also an issue for our firefighters and other responders.

I am hoping that the ministries, especially BC Housing, the OFC and mental health and addictions can come together ASAP to step up and assist in assisting with either housing options, removal of the structures/hazards and/or treatment. I would be more than happy to speak to the committee, but also recognize that immediate action needs to occur. I do not have all of the answers but we need a team approach and all hands on deck for this one. As you know, removing tents, propane, belongings can be very traumatic and challenging.

I am available most of this week (except Friday morning) if there is something that may help in addressing this. I would like to recommend that your cross ministry team come and understand firsthand what we are concerned about.



Tara is going to continue to work with the community on this to try to move the tents away from these identified areas. I also told her that our area of greatest concern were the tents outside of the Regent Hotel as it is under Fire Watch and currently the Fire Department has no access at all to this building due to the tents out front. She is going to make this a priority to try to get these tents moves ASAP.

I am hoping that you are still meeting regularly with the cross ministry encampment team. In the past couple of weeks, the area known as the downtown eastside, primarily Hastings St resembles an encampment on the sidewalks.

This has escalated to the point of 2 solid blocks of tents/structures and tarps against buildings and blocking doors.

1~

While I appreciate that there are advocates for many of these vulnerable people. I am extremely concerned with the safety in this area. The BC Fire Code is strict on combustibles materials against buildings 'risk of fire' and under the BCBC Division B: Part 2, Section 2.4 Fire Hazards. Whether a building is sprinklered or not, a fire starting on the outside may quickly travel up the side of the building, under the sheaths and into the roof structure. We quickly saw this last week in this exact neighbourhood. We have had over 770 structure and outdoor fires in our downtown area (Halls 8,2,1) this year already. Fortunately, the response of our fire department and those buildings with sprinklers have reduced the impact from many of those fires.

Apart from the risk to the buildings, and what can potentially happen to the hundreds of housing units located in the DTES, those living in these tents, structures are at a grave risk from being able to escape in the event of an emergency. Access to the buildings is also an issue for our firefighters and other responders.

I am hoping that the ministries, especially BC Housing, the OFC and mental health and addictions can come together ASAP to step up and assist in assisting with either housing options, removal of the structures/hazards and/or treatment. I would be more than happy to speak to the committee, but also recognize that immediate action needs to occur. I do not have all of the answers but we need a team approach and all hands on deck for this one. As you know, removing tents, propane, belongings can be very traumatic and challenging. 1~ I am available most of this week (except Friday morning) if there is something that may help in addressing this. FIRE SAFETY RESOURCE: Homeless encampments

Fire safety is a common concern at any campsite including homeless encampments. While encampments can offer those experiencing homelessness a sense of community and security compared to living in isolation, there may also be health and safety hazards present. Preventing and mitigating these risks is best addressed through a collaborative approach from local partners. This approach should be grounded in the principles of harm reduction, health promotion, and respect for the dignity and rights of people living in encampments.

Without access to heat, cooking facilities, or fresh water, people living in encampments may have to choose between safety and survival. Campers may use or store flammables in or near tents and in vehicles, use candles, propane heaters and cook with fire often in enclosed spaces. Substance use, health and mental health issues, and poverty may also impact a person's ability to shelter safely outdoors. These dangers can increase in extreme cold when people are desperate to stay warm and in hot, dry weather when wildfires and grassfires are a concern. *Keeping people in encampments safe and healthy is the priority, namely when safe and suitable housing are not available.*

The Fire Safety Resource includes basic fire prevention information and considerations for community partners when developing and implementing **local action plans** to address fire safety, prevention and response in homeless encampments. Plans should detail roles, responsibilities, engagement and communication strategies, and key activities to reduce risk and promote safety for those living in encampments. Partners may include:

- Local fire departments and prevention services;
- Local government (including bylaw, police, sanitation/waste disposal);
- Health authority, public and environmental health officers;
- Local First Nations and other Indigenous leaders and service providers;
- Homelessness outreach and service providers; and
- Community groups, volunteer organizations and people sheltering in encampments.

Strategies for fire prevention and fire protection:

Engage outreach providers and communicate with people in encampments:

- Service providers and first responders should engage and communicate with campers to identify, explain, and mitigate potential risks and hazards:
 - Develop a rapport with campers, communicating potential risks or hazards and explaining how they represent a danger to life
 - o Consider implementing regular 'walk-throughs' to assess for and address hazards
 - Ensure accessible information (i.e. signage) is in place, with fire safety tips, such as the proper handling and storing of flammable materials, liquids, and gases (e.g. firewood, kindling, gasoline, propane, etc.)Work with the occupants to find ways to safely address the hazards and what to do in case of a fire (fire safety plan, call 911, etc.)
- If providing training on fire safety and response collaborative engagement with campers is unsuccessful, fire services and community partners may:
 - o Discuss the use of inspection authority under the local bylaw or the Fire Services Act
 - Discuss having the local fire chief issue an order under the bylaw or the Fire Services Act to the owner or occupier to remove the hazard(s) (see local bylaw or Section 21 and 22 of the Fire Services Act)
 - Contact the local Fire Service Advisor from the Office of the Fire Commissioner for advice or assistance: 1-888-988-9488

General Safety for Encampments:

- Ensure tents and structures (i.e. lean-tos) are separated by at least two metres and have a clear path of exit out of the encampment to a safe area
- Ensure encampments are clear of combustible material, clutter and debris that could impede exits or contribute to the rapid spread of fire. Remove such material and keep it away from tents or structures.
- Plan for regular garbage and waste disposal and assist with removing clutter or debris.

- If generators are used in the encampment, ensure adequate clearance from combustibles and adequate air circulation to avoid carbon monoxide buildup in or near tents and enclosed structures.
- Where appropriate, some campsites may include sacred fire ceremonies for Indigenous peoples; all
 participants, including local authorities and Indigenous liaisons should work toward the accommodation
 of safe fires for spiritual purposes.
- Consider the following interventions when developing and implementing an encampment safety plan:
 - Suitable fire protection/response equipment, such as fire suppression blankets, smoke alarms for RVs, portable fire extinguishers, or buckets of sand
 - First aid kits to treat minor injuries
 - o Central cooking area that includes adequate clearance from combustibles
 - Electricity/charging stations for electrical devices whenever possible to encourage their use over open flame devices

Non-combustible ashtrays and cigarette disposal pots provided in designated smoking areas can help prevent smoking in tents.

- **Tents:** If tarps are used to cover the tents, they should be flame resistant, secured, and do not to cover more than one tent.
- No open flames should be used inside tents for heating, lighting, or cooking (i.e.: candles, propane stoves, propane heaters).
 - Battery powered lanterns should be used whenever possible but may not be cost-effective
- **Campfires:** ensure any outdoor wood burning open flame fires are supervised and are downwind with adequate separation from a tent or stored combustibles
 - Fully put out fires before leaving a campsite or before retiring for the night. Water is best
 - Keep campfires to a small, manageable size no more than 1 metre (3 feet) high by 1 metre (3 feet) in diameter and don't let it get out of hand
 - o Refrain from burning garbage. The smell is unpleasant and may attract animals to your campsite
 - Keep all combustible materials, including flammable liquids, propane cylinders, lighting fluid, etc. away from the campfire
- RVs and Vehicle Sheltering:
 - o Install at least one smoke alarm and a carbon monoxide alarm
 - o Have a fire extinguisher on hand
 - Regularly check the safety of all fuel-burning appliances, gas cylinders and pipes, and mechanical hook-ups – especially after driving on bumpy or bushy roads
 - Store all flammable liquids away from the vehicle

VFRS is involved in the process of dealing with the tent city clean up on Hastings street and there is a noticeable negative reaction of some of the community toward VFRS which is a concern for FireFighter safety. In the event alarms bell ringing or a structure fire calls \in in the hall 2 response area the driver of the first in Fire apparatus will be alone and left in a vulnerable situation when asked to connect into the FD connection. Help for the driver would not be readily available while the other Fire apparatus are staged at a hydrant and preparing to possibly lay a supply line. After consultation with VPD Sgt Mehrban Sidhu & VFRS Chief Cooper the following temporary process will need to take place.

Upon creation & dispatch of an alarm bells or structure fire event type in the hall 2 response are Fire dispatch will:

The management call over to VPD to assist fire by responding routine along with their Fire crew as per the tent city policy.

The Police call taker will create an Assist PFA event type and advise the VPD CD.

This is only for the hall 2 response area. Once the call is dispatched the fire dispatcher will advise the responding apparatus that VPD is responding routine and to advise fire dispatch if the current situation escalates (i.e. hostile people at the scene) and Fire dispatch will call VPD back and ask them to respond emergency. PSI placed a policy on EOPPS for Police call taker on this temporary ask.

Vancouver Fire Rescue Services has responded to 770 fires with damage this year within proximity to the downtown eastside, a 12% increase from last year. At risk populations occupying in large numbers of tents and structures along East Hastings Street and against buildings creates a high life safety risk for the individuals occupying these tents as well as the fire risk to adjacent buildings.

VFRS continues to work with multiple internal and external agencies on short and longer term strategies to reduce the risk to occupants inside these tents as well as the risk to buildings in the area.

- There is significant concern for the well-being of unhouses people in the area as well as to businesses and structures in the area.
- We have recently seen the devastating impact that an exterior fire can have on a building as was seen on the Church fire at 169
 E hastings Street.
- So far this year, in the area, we have had 860 outdoor and structure fire with damage, 103% increase from 2018.
- There are a significant number of tents blocking entrance ways and that have open flame and cooking going on inside.
- The BC fire code, Vancouver Fire By law and Vancouver building code are all in contravention.
- Chief Fry Issued a Fire Chief's Order Yesterday to the City of Vancouver to address the serious life safety concerns with the tents and combustibles on the north and south side of the 100/200 block of E hastings street. To be completed by July 27th at 1700
- This Chief's Order identifies serious risks from these structures and provides corrective measures to reduce the risk to the people and buildings in the area.
- Specific areas of concern are blocking exits and entrances to buildings, blocking fire department connections, blocking firefighting activities, large amounts of propane cylinders and storage of combustibles against buildings.
- This is a step in ensuring that risk factors that are known to cause significant death, damage and injury are reduced as much as possible.
- Fire prevention and public education have provided fire extinguisher training as well as fire safety messaging to community block wardens.
- Removed over 20 20lbs propane tanks in the last 2 weeks.

I am hoping that you are still meeting regularly with the cross ministry encampment team. In the past couple of weeks, the area known as the downtown eastside, primarily Hastings St resembles an encampment on the sidewalks.

This has escalated to the point of 2 solid blocks of tents/structures and tarps against buildings and blocking doors.

1~

While I appreciate that there are advocates for many of these vulnerable people. I am extremely concerned with the safety in this area. The BC Fire Code is strict on combustibles materials against buildings is sk of fire and under the BCBC Division B: Part 2, Section 2.4 Fire Hazards. Whether a building is sprinklered or not, a fire starting on the outside may quickly travel up the side of the building, under the sheaths and into the roof structure. We quickly saw this last week in this exact neighbourhood. We have had over 770 structure and outdoor fires in our downtown area (Halls 8,2,1) this year already. Fortunately, the response of our fire department and those buildings with sprinklers have reduced the impact from many of those fires.

Apart from the risk to the buildings, and what can potentially happen to the hundreds of housing units located in the DTES, those living in these tents, structures are at a grave risk from being able to escape in the event of an emergency. Access to the buildings is also an issue for our firefighters and other responders.

I am hoping that the ministries, especially BC Housing, the OFC and mental health and addictions can come together ASAP to step up and assist in assisting with either housing options, removal of the structures/hazards and/or treatment. I would be more than happy to speak to the committee, but also recognize that immediate action needs to occur. I do not have all of the answers but we need a team approach and all hands on deck for this one. As you know, removing tents, propane, belongings can be very traumatic and challenging.

I am available most of this week (except Friday morning) if there is something that may help in addressing this. I would like to recommend that your cross ministry team come and understand firsthand what we are concerned about.




