Just an update for you. We had myself and 3 Fire Prevention Staff attend the Hastings Street Tent Encampment today to try to improve fire safety by getting the folks to voluntarily give up their propane tanks. 3 Sanitation staff assisted with a truck to pick up the propane, $\$ and with the help of Tara Taylor from the Overdose Prevention Site we were able to remove 16 $\$ 20lb tanks and 3 smaller ones.

Tara was able to do a great deal of the pre-work on this by visiting each tent prior to our arrival and asking folks to voluntarily give up their tanks. Having her on scene with our staff proved to be very valuable as she was able to bridge the gap very well between the people on the street and city staff. Tara recorded the people's names and tagged their tanks in case they want it back in the future.

Thanks also to Mike Zupan's staff as well!





Meeting Summary

1. Welcome, Introductions and Action Item Log – Shannon Salter

Deputy Attorney General, Shannon Salter welcomed members with a territorial acknowledgement, then led introductions of new attendees on the call. Kim Brooks, Sandra Singh, Maureen O'Donnell Associate DM Health.

The DAG provided a brief overview of the action items and went through the agenda. Minutes were

approved. Members were asked to provide any comments or feedback on the minutes or on action items that may have been missed.

2. Overview of Materials Shared - Teri Collins

ADM Collins advised that the updated member list was attached with the meeting materials. The column for delegates has been removed. Teri advised that it was being considered final .

Action item – AG to request additional partner comms materials for inclusion in the meeting package

ADM Collins advised that the information note has detailed information included that is now being updated weekly; working to include additional items from partners going forward.

3. BC Housing Update

Dale McMann, VP operations, shared that BC Housing continues to renovate SROs. BC Housing is adding to numbers of additional spaces daily (2-3 per day) and they expect to have more info on the temporary modulars soon. Internally BC Housing is working on procurement of the workforce modulars, but they need details on the site.

The province has asked for a contingency plan should there be a major event (fire etc.) that could disrupt individuals from the encampment.

Allison Dunnett spoke to the contingency plan and shared a draft PPT deck that will be shared after the call. A contingency plan was requested by the province on August 26th. The team has worked to define a major event and have come up with two major response scenarios. The first is a **technical response** to a large fire or VPD critical incident. The second is a response from a **decision to clear encampment for public safety**.

The response to scenario one (1) is a tactical response, and the team would need to move individuals quickly and would not likely include movement of tents and belongings. There would be a COV reception centre (a temporary drop in space) and information on next steps would be provided for tenants on lodging/shelter. An on-call team to support the CoV and BCH would be notified immediately to mobilize.

In regard to scenario two (2), if a decision were to be made by VPD, CoV and/or the Fire Chief, the timing will not be shared wildly. The structures will be removed within 1-5 days. Individuals will need social supports, harm reduction and supports to move inside. Would be a need for temp location to support 20-50 people withBCH as the operational lead.

Dale advised that Vancouver identified two potential sites for modulars.

Stephanie Allen, VP, Strategic Business Operations, communicated that health supports need to be a critical inclusion to support modular housing.

Don Chapman, VPD Commissioner, confirmed that the objective in scenario one (1) is to remove people as quickly as possible and not tents etc.

Action item – to circulate draft contingency/emergency plan (PPT) with material for next call.

Dale advised that numbers on offers made to people are in progress. There are 20 shelter spaces available at Terminal, and uptake on people moving in and out. There has been slower uptake on SRO spaces. Going through a process right now and table evaluations are being done along with assessment with partners to make sure they are connecting people with appropriate spaces, and sensitive to specific needs. There are nineteen (19) offers out, and a handful four to five (4-5) accepted. BCH is anticipating that as weather starts to cool there will be greater uptake on SRO units. There is a total of fifty (50) SRO spaces available and another 50 underway.

Sandra Singh, CoV advised the city is looking to support the Crab Park encampment through this process of allocating City of Vancouver - FOI 2022-516 - Page 664 of 817 available options to move individuals indoors.

4. Partner Roundtable:

City of Vancouver

Paul Mochrie, Vancouver City Manager, provided an update on voluntary removal of structures, there have been 80 plus removed. The city has had some success with removing large structures. The city is fencing a couple of sites that are vulnerable. Crews are power washing which is assisting toward sanitation. The last version of their community mapping showed a total of hundred and thirty-five (135) structures remaining.

Tanya Whysker, Superintendent, provided an update on two (2) fires that took place in Chinatown and advised that VPD assisted with clearing the route for firefighters. They are seeing a lot of violence in area, a number of weapons and increased number of

stabbings compared to this time last year). There have been unreported sexual assaults. A number of significant arrets related to drugs and continued predatory criminals in the encampment.

Vancouver Coastal Health

Bob Chapman advised they have finalized their ask for safe supply for 100 individuals; costing aligns with Strathcona and Oppenheimer sites.

Patty Daly provided an update on the request for safe supply advising it is prescribed safe supply, opioids, managed alcohol, tobacco, and should be helpful to support those in temporary spaces remain indoors.

Stephanie Allen advised she has a number of questions related to safe supply on criteria etc. and will connect with Patty Daly directly to discuss and engage on details.

Action log – AG will facilitate conversation with MoH/BC Housing/Vancouver Coastal to discuss funding proposal related to services for temporary modulars.

Vancouver Board of Parks & Recreation

Betty advised that there remains high compliance in the area. They are noticing the same trends occurring and monitoring other parks also.

Social Development and Poverty Development

Raymond Fieltsch, ADM, reported that they have received fourteen (14) intakes already attached to income assistance and have identified four (4) new individuals. SDPR has heard that some people are leaving to travel to Nanaimo and Victoria and it is hard to tell if it is part of normal movement. Going with data on case files. Community Integration Specialist outreach met with ninety (90) people; most are attached to income assistance, but staff have done eleven (11) new intakes this week. Also, about 10% of individuals approached declined services.

Ministry of Mental Health and Addictions

DM Massey advised that she and Maureen will connect with BCH on safe injection site questions.

Ministry of Children and Family

No updates.

Ministry of Health

Maureen advised that she is aware of the funding proposal from VCH and will take forward for consideration.

City of Victoria

Jocelyn Jenkins, City Manager advised that there are one hundred (100) structures across parks and open spaces. The city's focus is to prevent encampments. The city is experiencing challenges on Pandora, Alice and Queens and have noticed more weapons. The biggest challenge is the ability to get police to attend sites with bylaw officers. The city is concerned about safety. The city has two fully funded police officer spots which have not been filled yet.

Emergency Management BC/OFC

Brian Godlonton, Fire Commissioner. No reports.

First Nation Health Authority

Kim advised that their primary focus is support for urban and rural communities. Good engagement.

FNHA is working on their own health strategy. FNHA has the ability to connect with fourteen (14) First Nations in the area, if needed. They also have a small health and wellness team, which includes harm reduction educators and will support as best they can. Kim sits with CEO and executive team and will communicate messages through from this committee.

5. Communications

Laura Mathews, BCH Communications flagging that when fencing is placed, it could be interpreted as enforcementand attract media attention. They are working on communications with CoV.

Paula advised that she has not received media attention on the issue to date. Action log – AG/BC Housing/CoV comms teams will coordinate messaging related to fencing

East Hastings Encampment Response

ISSUE SUMMARY:

- The number of people sheltering along East Hastings is fluid and fluctuates from day to day. BC Housing and Vancouver-funded Carnegie outreach are working to map out housing and support needs for those without shelter.
- In the week of Sept. 18, a total of 29 people were matched to an allocated housing space, and outreach will start making housing offers to these people this week and, if accepted, move-in plans will commence. This is in addition to 16 accepted offers.
- As of Friday Sept 16, there are currently 50 SRO units that are renovated and available for tenants, with 76 renovations underway or about to start.
- BC Housing and the City of Vancouver are pursuing longer-term housing options, including use of two existing buildings and two sites for temporary modular or workforce housing.
- Fencing and sidewalk clearing is underway around four properties on Hastings Street that are undergoing construction. Communications around these efforts is being planned in partnership with the City, non-profit and Indigenous organizations to provide clarity it is not indicative of a decampment.
- The City of Vancouver is working with BC Housing and partners on contingency planning should a decampment be triggered by fire order enforcement or an emergency event, including plans to support people in maintaining connections to supports and housing outreach.

Background:

- July 25, 2022: Vancouver Fire and Rescue Services (VFRS) issued a Fire Order to remove tents and structures along East Hastings Street due to urgent safety concerns. At this time, the City and VFRS have not indicated they plan to move to a full stage enforcement/destructuring. However, that could change with further assessment or in the event of an emergency.
- At that time, an estimated 460 people were sheltering along East Hastings, of which about half were in need of housing -- according to Carnegie Outreach. Work is underway to understand why people are not staying in housing which may include high indoor temperatures, pest infestations, and threats to personal safety.
- BC Housing is working with partners to identify temporary and permanent indoor spaces. These are being offered people through a person- and healing-centred approach to support people choosing to transition indoors, which can take time and relationship-building.
- Providing critical services for those sheltering on Hastings Street is a priority of the City of Vancouver and BC Housing. This includes immediate needs (e.g., food, sanitation and protection of personal effects) are met while work is done to connect people with housing and supports so they can better sustain it.
- The Province takes a coordinated approach to support unsheltered people in the Downtown East Side, and works across ministries, with BC Housing, the City of Vancouver, and community partners to ensure immediate and longer-term responses are in place.
- Since the Fire Order was first issued in late July, BC Housing has opened more than 75 spaces to support the response in the DTES -- a combination of recently-renovated Single Room Occupancy (SRO) hotel rooms and new shelter spaces. There are currently approximately 50 renovated units that are available for those who wish to move indoors and which have been made available for the City's outreach team to offer those residing on Hastings Street. Vancouver Coastal Health and other community partners will provide health and social services, including a continuation of safe supply pilots, to support people as they move into housing.

• All partners are working to prevent entrenched homelessness and decrease harm and trauma. BC Housing is working with partners to draft a 'supports and moving plan' based on previous experience at Oppenheimer and Strathcona encampments.

Specific to East Hastings: At this time, BCH only has renovated SRO units so offers being made are currently for SROs. However, this will change over time as new units are brought online and partners learn more about the specific needs of residents on East Hastings.

ISSUES/UPDATES:

• BC Housing and Carnegie Outreach (BCH/CoV funded outreach)

• Spaces:

- 20 shelter beds for men only (Lu'ma Native Housing Society). These shelter spaces can be held so that people can come and go without fear of losing their space.
- 25 permanent spaces at The Biltmore Hotel to provide permanent housing (with supports from Coastal Health) for those displaced by the Princess Rooms fire.
- As of Friday Sept 16, there are currently 50 SRO units that are renovated and available for tenants, with 76 renovations underway or about to start.
- BC Housing Real Estate is considering two buildings for their potential utility in response to the East Hastings encampment: s.13(1), s.17(1)

s.16(1), s.17(1)

- Longer-term, City of Vancouver has identified two sites with up to 100 units for temporary supportive housing:
 - 1500 Main Street: Could see 70 workforce modular units across two buildings. BC Housing has sourced the modular units, but they need to be sprinklered for fire safety and additional modifications will be required to meet City Code compliance. Timing to open will depend on the time to install sprinklers and also the development permit/building permit process selected by City of Vancouver.
 - 2132 Ash Street and would accommodate a workforce housing building with capacity of approximately 36 units.

s.13(1), s.16(1)

People:

- BC Housing and Carnegie Outreach housing allocation meetings occur twice a week to assess and match people based on need, vulnerability and other factors, to available housing options deemed a good fit. The process is:
 - 1. Allocation Identifying unsheltered people and matching them with available units based on need, supports, and fit for building. BCH and outreach workers will identify an individual who is camping on Hastings and will "allocate" them that unit. BCH will collect relevant information (from SHR apps, HIFIs, VATs, etc.) and send a referral to the housing operator for confirmation. Once an individual is "approved" for housing, the outreach worker will provide the "housing offer". This process may take a few days to a week.
 - Housing Offer A Housing Offer is made by the outreach worker. It can be accepted or rejected by the individual (often after a period of consideration and a tour of the housing).
 - 3. **Move-in, transition** If an individual accepts an offer of housing outreach workers will support them to transition, which may include time to prepare and can take a few days or a week. A move-in will later be confirmed by the housing operator and outreach worker.
- This past week ending Sept. 18, a total of 29 people were allocated to housing, and outreach will start making housing offers this week.
- As more housing resources come online, the frequency of allocation meetings may increase beyond twice weekly.

• City of Vancouver, VPD and VFRS

- Sept. 9: Vancouver Fire responded to a fire at 222 Keefer St. which later spread to 12 East Hastings. The building where the fire originated, Keefer Rooms, is a privately owned SRO with 45 units. The fire spread to Tellier Tower, which is operated by Portland Hotel Society with funding from BCH, though damage to that building was minor with no evacuations. The fire is believed to have been started by a grease fire in the kitchen of the lower floor restaurant of Keefer Rooms. We understand most residents have been relocated to other housing owned by the same owner.
- VFRS assessed the Hastings Fire Order on September 6, 2022 and made no changes. However, it is important to note that a sudden fire or public safety issue taking place before the area is fully decamped could compel an involuntary decampment which would be extremely disruptive.
- BCH continues to discuss the need for an emergency back-up plan with the City. The City is utilizing new mapping tools for better planning.
- Sanitation has greatly improved due to street cleaning being done by City staff as tents clear. On Sept. 19, City reported no new structures observed and a new record of waste (3,458 kg) cleared.

• Fencing

- City partners are working on a fencing and sidewalk clearing plan for the Hastings Street encampment block around four specific properties. All community engagement will be led by Indigenous and advocacy partners, at their request. No flyers will be distributed.
 - The Aboriginal Land Trust (ALT) Hastings Housing and Health Project (52, 62, and 92 East Hastings) is starting construction. As part of this work, ALT requested City support for a lane closure on Friday, September 16 and have requested they lead the

engagement with people camping near the property. On Sunday, Sept. 18, Aboriginal Front Door Society and Lu'ma hosted a BBQ for the community near the property and informed them about the need to immediately clear the sidewalk. Once the sidewalk is cleared, the City's engineering staff will erect fencing. City staff and government representatives are not invited to the BBQ. ALT and Lu'ma are leading on addressing any media requests regarding construction beginning at this site/fencing.

- Fencing has been erected around the Regent, a vacant City-owned SRO in order to ensure safety as window remediation work commences soon.
- During the week of Sept. 19, a community-designed and stewarded temporary sidewalk mural will be painted in front of the City-owned and vacant Balmoral SRO, and the privately owned and vacant SRO at 109/123 Hastings. Fencing will not be erected around these buildings and community engagement will be led by VANDU, Overdose Prevention Society and Aboriginal Front Door Society. Engineering staff will be informed by these stakeholders when they can move in to clean the sidewalk and paint.

• Services (Storage, Washrooms, Showers, Food)

- Storage is available at:
 - 390 Main Street, operated by Aboriginal Front Door Society. They also offer a drop-in space, washrooms, and programming onsite. Individuals are expressing confidence in Aboriginal Front Door Society which uses a 'food first, culture first' approach, and people are trusting them to store their personal belongings.
 - 987 Cordova. Operated by City of Vancouver.
 - 101 East Cordova. Operated by Atira Women's Resource Society. Currently full.
- An automated washroom has been reactivated and is now available at Pigeon Park.
- City staff are awaiting delivery of a mobile trailer with washrooms and showers at Hastings and Gore. It will be peer staffed and is expected to be available in approximately two weeks.
- Various area service providers are providing water and food as part of their outreach and support efforts.

• Other parks/areas

- Crab Park updates
 - As of September 16, 98 tents in designated area, approximately 80 individuals.
 - There was a fire last week, no injuries.
 - An elder has taken a leadership role in the group, encouraging use of garbage bins and fire safety.
 - Kilala Lelum mobile health services is visiting each Thursday.
 - BC Housing will be funding cultural support services by Lu'ma. Plans are underway for a 'dual support' day with Lu'ma and Kilala Lelum mobile health services providing services on site the same day(s) each week.
 - Emergency phone pole being installed by TELUS.
 - Paperwork still being finalized by COV with contractor (Cedar Brush) for additional portable toilets.

MINISTRY Updates:

- SDPR Community Integration Specialist Hastings update:
 - CIS provides outreach supports to people along Hastings with two dedicated staff and 9 staff based in partner DTES organizations.
 - On Sept 16, case management connect a senior to health clinic, Hastings client to SRO rental, Hastings client to income assistance and sought out two vulnerable clients.
 - As of Sept 9, CIS approached 96 people, spoke with 79 (17 declined), completed 14 new income assistance intakes (including senior with severe mobility issues) and provided 48 crisis grants. Of the people connected with, 17 had rent in pay and 4 were new to Vancouver.

- Co-located staff (9)
 - Carnegie Outreach City of Vancouver
 - Downtown Community Court PSSG/AG
 - Vancouver Intensive Supervision Unit PSSG
 - Sheway (Pregnancy Outreach Program) NGO
 - Downtown Eastside Women's Centre NGO
 - VCH Overdose Outreach Team Health Authority, Onsite NGO

Human-Centered, Intersectional and Trauma-Informed Response

- Partners meet to include a trauma and culturally-informed response, rooted in feedback from people with lived and living experience of homelessness.
- Work is underway to engage other groups such as people with disabilities and racialized groups, people who use illegal drugs/medicines, and local advocacy groups through a Community Table convened by City of Vancouver.
- Women and non-binary people:
 - Partners are working on a gender-based strategy specific to the encampment. More supports including a women and gender-diverse drop in space are expected to be operationalized as part of the strategy, connected to rapid housing planning.
 - Women's only drop-in storage is being provided by Atira (currently full).
 - CoV Engineering Services which is responsible for sanitation, waste removal, etc., has been including more women in their walkabouts, which has led to more connections with women.

• Indigenous Peoples:

- Carnegie staff estimate about 40% of campers are likely to be First Nations, Indigenous, Métis or Inuit.
- Currently Aboriginal Front Door Society, via support from COV and BCH, is supporting community outreach, storage, food provision, cultural supports and partnership development with other agencies.
- Partners are identifying ways to support Indigenous-led outreach teams on Hastings Street and in the surrounding areas that can provide culturally-sensitive and trauma-informed support.
- To date, COV and BC Housing have connected with the following Indigenous partners:
 - Aboriginal Front Door Society
 - Aboriginal Housing Management Association (AHMA)
 - All Nations Outreach
 - First Nations Housing Infrastructure Council
 - Lu'ma Native Housing Society

- Intersectional Community Outreach Including Racialized and Immigrant communities:
 - Watari Counselling and Support Services is providing Indigenous Circles at the Astoria, and they continue to provide Youth Outreach services in the community.
 - Watari as a local organization with deep roots in community, bring a trauma-informed and culturally safe approach to meeting diverse community needs.



Hi there,

I am emailing in regards to the tent city on east Hastings. I will try and keep this short and to the point, as I know the two of you are busy. The tent city was ordered to be taken down awhile ago - and quite frankly there has been zero improvement. I understand there is a housing shortage, but this doesn't lessen the risk of fire. And now that the temperatures are going to start dropping, the risk is increased - as those in the tent city will turn to fires to keep warm.

As a resident in the area this is highly concerning. The situation only got this bad when the police stopped escorting city workers who cleaned the streets. This should have never stopped. We can see the disaster stopping this has caused.

As the call for tent city to be taken down was given a few months ago - the residents have had plenty of time to prepare, and before they start lighting fires to stay warm, it should be taken down.

Oppenheimer park is close by and is rarely used - due to the amount of needles found there. A solution for now could be to encourage tent city residents to move there. This does not solve the housing crises - but limits the risk of structures being burned in the process. And thus reduces the amount of lives at risk. It is also both still close to the fire fighter and police stations for quick response times. Moving there will also open the sidewalks again, and help businesses - while still being conveniently close to stores for tent city residents.

Additionally, structures in the area have come under mass vandalism recently because of tent city. To the point it is shocking police don't stay parked in the area 24 /7 to prevent crime. I understand having a police patrol on the scene 24/7 is not feasible for cost, however the action of the force stopping the sweeps led to this disaster and rise in crime. In which the force should take accountability for this and aid more.




