





Shelter Beds

This data represents the range of shelter spaces available daily. The data will fluctuate as people move in/out of shelters. There are spaces that have been reserved at one shelter for individuals who are currently staying outside on Hastings Street; there are accessed through direct referral from the City's Outreach team. Individuals who are staying in a shelter with reserved beds may stay for a short or long time. Individuals may leave a shelter due to receiving housing, returning to unsheltered homelessness, or many other reasons. There are plans to increase shelter capacity.



The main change for today is that the metrics slide depicting storage information has been temporarily removed as no changes have been made to that data since Sept 7th and work is underway to change the process for reporting that information. Once a new process is worked out storage metrics will be included in future versions of the situation report.

Situation reports will be issued twice per week (typically Mondays and Thursdays). The Monday report will be shorter focusing on brief updates and metrics. The Thursday report will be longer and will contain updates on all the EOC Action Plan items as well as metrics.

Concerns with changes contact the EOC Planning Section: 515(1)(0)



Significant changes/updates

- September 21 Missing, Murdered Indigenous Men and Boys march occurred, which included a sacred fire at CRAB Park.
- 2. Fencing at Aboriginal Land Trust 52-92 Hastings is approximately 80% installed.
- Three individuals have accepted housing.
- 4. Plans for the mobile Washroom trailer at Hastings and Gore are on pause pending discussions with community groups regarding impacts to gender safety.



Outlook & Situational Awareness

- There will be a focus on work to enable the remaining fencing at 52-92 Hastings to be installed by September 30
- 2. Concern is increasing regarding fire risk due to the use of propane tanks and heaters, especially as the weather cools. Fires at CRAB park occurred in the morning on September 21 and 22 and VPB is doing further review as more fires have been occurring. A group from VFRS, VPB and ENG will be connecting to identify an approach in relation to this risk.



Structures map



CITY OF VANCOUVER Housing & Shelter

Since the beginning of EOC reporting on Aug 17th, there are an estimated 210 people identified as living on Hastings Street between Gore and Abbott that potentially need shelter or housing. The outreach team has been connecting with community members since mid-July.

Shelter Beds

This data represents the range of shelter spaces available daily. The data will fluctuate as people move in/out of shelters. There are spaces that have been reserved at one shelter for individuals who are currently staying outside on Hastings Street; there are accessed through direct referral from the City's Outreach team. Individuals who are staying in a shelter with reserved beds may stay for a short or long time. Individuals may leave a shelter due to receiving housing, returning to unsheltered homelessness, or many other reasons. There are plans to increase shelter capacity.

> 18-24 Available spaces each day

This data represents the total number of people who have been connected to a shelter space. Outreach staff contact the shelter, reserve a bed for individuals, and support individuals with intake at the shelter. Individual stays or length of stay are not tracked by City Outreach staff. While a cumulative number is reported, it does not necessarily reflect the number of people currently staying in shelter as people may leave or transition out of shelter.



Hi Everyone

In anticipation of a fire order coming out today, here are our key messages.

We will advise when it is issued.

I am heading to hall 2 to give them a heads up that this may be coming and that they can expect higher anxiousness on the streets towards the VFRS.

- Having tents/structures and storage on the sidewalks creates a huge risk to the buildings and their occupants, the people on the streets and our firefighters
- Firefighters and first responders need to have clear and unfettered access to buildings and that is not feasible at the moment
- To date this year, we have 860 reported outdoor and structure fires with damage in the downtown areas of our Halls 2,1,8. This is a 103% increase since 2018.
- Many structures/tents are blocking emergency exits and access to fire department connections.
- Open flames and fire hazards have been found throughout the area.
- The BC Fire Code, the BC Building Code and Vancouver Fire By-Law are all in contravention.
- VFRS has been providing fire extinguisher training and fire safety messaging with the community over the past couple of weeks. VFRS and Sanitation have removed over 20 20lb propane tanks from the Hastings Street encampment in the last 2 weeks.
- Fire spreads very quickly, when against a building, it will travel it up the outside and into the roof structure very easily. The church on East Hastings Street was a prime example of this.
- The order requires that the tents, structures and storage are removed from the sidewalks and streets. We will work with the City of Vancouver Engineering and ACCS. We are not saying that people have to leave.

Vancouver Fire Bylaw Section 2.4.1 Combustible Materials

4) Combustible materials shall not be stored on a roof or adjacent to any building so as to create a fire hazard to the building or its occupant

Section 3.3.3. General Outdoor Storage

2) Except as permitted in Sentences (3) and (4), a clear space of not less than 15 m shall be maintained between stored products and a building on the same property to reduce the risk of fire spreading from the outdoor storage area to the building.

I have asked Inspector Rob Van Doorn to take some photos today of the tents on Hastings Street and try to get them to me by the end of the day.

Removal of Structures – Hastings Street DTES Key Messages / Q+A

Last revised: August 19, 2022

Where are the people who are being asked to remove structures and move off Hastings St. supposed to go? Are any short-term housing or shelter solutions in the works?

- The City acknowledges that many people do not have other options for housing or shelter—and
 we are working closely with BC Housing to urgently find places for people who are sheltering
 outdoors—the significant fire and public safety risks present on Hastings Street necessitate the
 removal of tents and structures.
- Pending availability of housing or shelter options, the City will continue working to provide a
 number of additional supports to people who are sheltering outdoors in the Downtown Eastside
 neighbourhood. These supports include access to food, laundry services, washrooms and
 storage for their belongings, and this is based on feedback we heard from community groups on
 what immediate needs are.
- As we continue to work with our housing partners to find solutions, the City understands that some people moving off Hastings Street may need to shelter overnight in public spaces. This is an interim /near term option while The City continues advocating with senior government for more housing and support services.
- DURING THE DAY [Final review needed from Chief Fry]
 - O Legally, people can shelter outdoors overnight.
 - O Structures and tents **MUST** be removed during the day
 - Structures such as tents cannot remain during the day to ensure that streets and public spaces are safe, accessible and functional for all.
- OVERNIGHT [Final review needed from Chief Fry]
 - Materials for overnight sheltering must be easily moved and not introduce fire risk. Locations for sheltering overnight that support this and the needs of those sheltering outdoors are those:
 - that provide nearby access to support services, including washrooms, storage, proximity to women focused services and daytime supports
 - where access to doorways and fire connections can be maintained
 - with ample sidewalk space away from major roads/streets where tents can be positioned away from curbs and buildings
 - with sufficient sidewalk space maintained for accessibility

- that do not impact transportation, including pedestrian, bike and motor vehicles routes
- that are open and visible to maintain security and safety for everyone in the area
- that minimize grouping of structures to manage barriers to pedestrian movement, access and potential fire hazardsThe City will continue to provide what we can in terms of supports and services, as well as actively working with our housing partners to find more indoor spaces and housing for people who are sheltering outdoors.
- However, the City cannot solve the housing situation in the area alone. We continue to support
 and advocate to our housing partners and senior government partners with a housing mandate
 for critical investment and rapid deployment of housing options.
 - Critical investment of health, mental health and addictions, and other social supports, including improved income and employer supports from senior government partners are also urgently needed. We continue to advocate for this.

What is the plan and when will you start to enforce the by-law and clear the street?

- As this is a complex and dynamic situation, our plans are evolving and may change on short notice; we are doing our best to keep our partners and the community informed.
- This week, we will continue to focus on compliance with the Fire Chief's Safety Order and Fire Bylaw 12472 through voluntary compliance and cooperation. We have increased staffing and resources to encourage and assist people to voluntarily remove their structures, store their personal belongings and move from the area.
- Our crews continue to attend daily to clean the streets and sidewalks as much as possible and the partnership with community partners has been integral as we work to address the life safety risks as identified in the Fire Chief's Safety Order.
- We acknowledge the fire and public safety risk in the area. The situation is evolving daily, and
 we are evaluating regularly to determine when to move into stronger enforcement of the Fire
 Chief's Safety Order. What this stronger enforcement looks like is to be determined by the CoV
 in collaboration with VFRS and may include the assistance of the VPD.

What other resources, aside from storage solutions, are being put in place to provide support to those that are homeless on Hastings?

 Getting important resources and supports in place on Hastings for those who are sheltering outdoors is a priority for the City.

- Establishing these supports is multi-faceted and can be complicated. We are working with a number of vendors, suppliers and community and government partners to finalize these essential contract agreements. We hope to have many of these contracts in place in the next few days.
- Currently, supports the City is providing and working on include:
 - The City's Homelessness Services Outreach Team continues to engage regularly with individuals experiencing homelessness or at risk of homelessness, to support their needs as related to accessing income, housing and other supports. The Outreach Team works collaboratively with BC Housing's Coordinated Access and Assessment team, bringing forward individuals to be considered for housing. In addition, the Outreach Team also works with individuals to provide rent supplements to support individuals renting in the private sector.
 - Counselling/Mental Health & Healing and Wellness Supports for Indigenous peoples: The City continues to connect with Vancouver Coastal Health and request further assistance. Currently, the City is working with Watari to provide counselling and access to healing circles for Indigenous peoples who are living unsheltered. The City will include in communications/flyers to people along Hastings St going forward, so those living unsheltered will know how to access this service.
 - o **Food Services:** City is providing funding for food services for hundreds of daily meals. Meals are being provided through A Better Life Foundation.
 - Access to Storage: Funded by the City, CleanStart is providing storage access 4 days per week @ 2 hours per day and availability will increase this week as the need for storage grows. Additional information on storage options and process is being drafted in response to community questions.
 - Women's Safety: Due to the increase in violence along the blocks, the City has been and will continue to fund Mission Possible to provide security 13 hours/day, 7 days/week to support safe access to the DTES Women's Centre and to the Olivia Skye residence at 41 East Hastings. PACE is now providing outreach to sex workers who are living unsheltered along E. Hastings.
 - Access to Washrooms: Comfort station hours have been increased so that these will be
 accessible nearly 24 hours/day. The City has allocated funding to operate a new mobile
 washroom and street locations are being identified. A washroom at Pigeon Park that had
 broken down is also being Reactivated. The City is also funding peer supervision at both the
 mobile trailer and Pigeon Park washrooms to ensure safety and access to these critical
 spaces.
 - Drop-In Space: The City has identified start-up funding for a new drop in space that will be operated by an Urban Indigenous service provider. The space will be opened at 390 Main Street (City-owned space) on August 22. This space will also have washroom access and improved access hours to the storage facility.

Can you describe in what respect public safety is deteriorating on Hastings as a result of the decampment and generally? [VPD to provide more information]

- The VPD are best suited to comment on public safety issues on Hastings St.
- However, the City acknowledges the situation along Hastings Street is increasingly unsafe, with
 more fire hazards and large structures, and a decline in cleanliness and accessibility, an increase
 in public safety risks and all individuals experiencing an increase in criminality and violence.
- City staff have been out daily to encourage and support voluntary removal of tents and belongings, and regularly sharing information in person with those sheltering outdoors and will continue to do so at this time.
- We are evaluating the situation to determine when to move into stronger enforcement of the Fire Chief's Safety Order. What this stronger enforcement looks like is to be determined by the CoV in collaboration with VFRS and may include the assistance of the VPD.

What type of progress has been made as it relates to voluntary removal of structures?

- Add metrics we can share about what we are doing to reduce the public safety risk, specifically related to fire:
 - How many people are sheltering
 - How many storage totes provided
 - How many structures have been voluntarily removed
 - How many key priority areas have been dissipated to reduce the fire risk in those areas?
