As per our conversation today regarding 235 Main and 237 Main (Jubilee

Rooms SRO), there is currently egress and access issues with 235 Main.

- 235 Main and 237 Main are separate building with separate fire safety systems. There is a corridor connecting the two buildings on the second floor. This corridor is a shared laundry room, servicing both buildings.
- Currently, 235 Main is undergoing some renovation/construction of the main floor (ground level plus basement level). Due to this construction, the entire front entrance to 235 Main is boarded up and closed off for access and egress. (FDC connection for 235 Main is still accessible).
- Both buildings are currently occupied with SRO tenants, on floors 2, 3, and 4.
- 4. Residents of 235 Main access their building through the front entrance of 237 Main, then climb to the second floor and through the shared laundry room corridor. This is the only way 235 Main is accessible at the moment for residents, staff, and first responders.
- 5. Rear egress for 235 Main is now accessible, however, this egress was also blocked and not accessible for a many weeks.
- 6. Notice of violations were issued to both building for various violations including alarm, sprinkler, and egress issues.
- According to staff on site, all of this construction is done with permits, however, after many weeks, no permits have been produced by building managers, and a search of Posse reveals inconclusive evidence of any such permits allowing access and egress for 235 Main to be blocked off.
- As of today, a Fire Chief^B Order has been issued to both building to maintain 24 hour fire watch, until further investigation is conducted.

- Vacancy Control Hajer Awatta
 - BC Supreme Court overturned the Vacancy Control Bylaw on August 3, 2022 and ordered all data related to the Bylaw be destroyed
 - City is appealing the ruling and have asked for a temporary stay to keep the data during the appeal process
 - o Estimated that the appeal process may take a year or more
 - During appeal process, landlord increases are permissible to the same extent the market allows
 - City is keeping the informational website up with a disclaimer that the Bylaw is currently unenforceable
- Properties being removed from Tactical Team
 - o Arco
 - o 320 Union Street
 - o Cosmo Hotel
 - o Flint Residence
- 123 East Hastings (non-SRA) Rob Renning
 - o Property flagged of concern in regards to the encampments on DTES
 - o City needs to consider fencing in front of the building and VFRS looking to confirm owners
 - o Property vacant with no alarm system, no security
 - Saul has had contact with the owners in past. Owners previously had no plans for building; currently does not meet the threshold for demolition and there is a Heritage component.
 - o Accessibility of building creates an unsafe condition and could require the owners to fence
 - Saul to forward contact information for the owners to Rob
 - 109 East Hastings (non-SRA) also of concern regarding the encampments and consideration around fencing.

Agenda

- 1. Welcome and Land Acknowledgment Welcome and Opening by Sandy Leo We would like to acknowledge that this meeting is taking place on unceded traditional territories of the Musqueam, Squamish, and Tsleil-Waututh peoples.
- 2. Meeting Structures
 - These meeting will be every two weeks with the larger group to talk about current updates and work being done concerning the Hastings encampment.
 - There is no set agenda for today's meeting City and community can provide updates.
 - A reminder about the purpose while this began as a table to focus on alternatives to street cleaning we heard from community the need to have a much broader vision: putting people who are houseless in the centre and identifying and supporting all of their needs in a holistic way - from housing to washrooms, indoor drop in spaces, showers, food, connections, etcetera.

3. Updates from BC Housing - Allison

- MC: BC Housing has come in as a finical partner, they are supporting the space at 390 Main St and aiming to help support the gender safe space.
- We're starting to work together with the province to see how we can support people in the neighborhood.
- One of the focus for BC Housing has been getting more shelter spaces, refurbishing SRO space.
 - Sandy: This is an old idea, why are rehashing old ideas that didn't work.
 - April: The refurbished SROs then there is way to connect community within the in space, and just because things didn't work one way in the past doesn't mean we can't try new and learn from past mistakes.

- Ingrid: We have been trying to create community kitchens, but there is a lack of available space. Community kitchens have been shown to help community in positive ways.
- Sandy: Why is BC Housing working on shelter housing instead of more long term housing solutions?
 - Allison: Yes I agree this a solution we need to look at BC Housing. These conversations are always happening, but the work is far from done.
- Sandy: How much money is the city and province willing to put down to help people?
 - MC, Allison: We can share information that we have for funding at the next meeting.
- Vince: What is the group that meets with the city and BC Housing? We need names and communicate with?
 - Allison: Peoples Support Group? I'll get the information for you.
- Ryan: There was a communication that there was 40 people that were able to gain housing but then it turned out they were just interested, do you know more about that? Is the attitude that people of the encampment have to leave?
 - Allison: that was a miscommunication, the list of people interested is always in flux, at that time BC housing had identified 40 people who wanted to find better housing.
 - Mike: we are trying to be careful not to say anyone has to leave, we are focusing on people voluntarily taking down structures and removing debris combustibles.
- MC: We can look at creating a roundtable for this group so that the BC government table can meet with everyone here (based on questions from the group about how BC government would connect with community).
- Ingrid: This table should be referred to as a community table, not decriminalizing poverty
- Dave: Many people have poor quality housing, is here any way the city or BC Housing is able to support getting these fixed up or safer?
 - Allison: This is totally correct and is something BC Housing needs to focus on. If people are leaving their home because they don't feel safe, then it needs to be addressed.
- Momma Marcy: Many of SRO rooms are boarded up, but there aren't big issues with the units.
 - Vince: 40% of SROs have fire violations, the city and fire need to be more focused on that. The second thing that people want the most from the government is accountability from BC Housing.
- Momma Marcie: can we get more peers trained to learn how to help people complete housing applications as well as applications for income assistance.

- Ingrid: We need to make sure that people who are trained in supporting people in the camp can speak many languages. We also need to involve the community when they refurbishing the SROs, so that people want to get into the buildings.
- Sue Baker: Carnegie outreach has people who are working who has lived experience.
- Vince: We may need to extend the meeting a bit.
- Steve: Is there any update on the Regent and the Balmoral? The hotels that were taken by BC Housing, what are their status? Are they going back to the owners later?
- Vince: We have had several programs that are currently going and we have 4 new programs starting in the next couple of weeks.
 - The feedback in the block is that there is some fear about the possibility of the pressure washing happening this week. Is it possible that we can do the pressure washing via the community, so that their stuff will be respectfully? Can Engineering provide the supplies?
 - Mike: We will aim to be respectful no matter what, but we are open to a community lead pressure washing program.
 - There has been some reports of city crews slashing tents, we can't confirm it later.
 - Mike: If this is true then this is not being done at our direction, please let us know if you have any information so we can follow up. We are directing staff not to decamp people and defiantly not to attack people's belongings.


Hey there

Hi folks – pls see below and attached.

Would like to discuss the need to install some fencing in a few areas along the Hastings strip starting next week. Summary is below. I will be taking this to the People, Moves and Supports table next Tuesday for additional discussion and coordination, where it relates to impact to individuals sheltering in the locations we are looking at.

This meeting is to raise awareness on this work, priority locations, coordination needs, proposed timings/sequence and identify any additional impacts or planning considerations.

Regent Hotel – 160 E. Hastings

- Require fencing to keep 3 emergency exits and FDC clear. Fencing also required to allow REFM to remove broken glass and board windows for fire safety
- We can start with partial fencing where space is clear and expand as able may be able to begin as early as today.
- Needs to be done ASAP, and will require some additional support to assist Melody and Francesca in transitioning ++ belongings into storage
- If there is any accelerated housing that can be arranged for Melody &/or Francesca, hoping we can explore

Balmoral Hotel – 159 E. Hastings

- Require re-installation of fencing in front of building for fire safety purposes
- Fencing was in place prior to removal of sign but for some reason has not been reinstalled or kept in place
- Needs to be done ASAP, this should be fairly easy to implement given current conditions re: congestion
- Target date next Weds, Sept 14 or sooner
- There is one individual that has been sheltering in the alcove here who will potentially require some additional outreach/info and support

126 E. Hastings

- Vacant bldg. immediately adjacent and to the east of the garden, N. site 100 block
- Required for fire protection purposes

- Needs to be done ASAP

- Outreach will know current status of any people sheltering in this area. Additional engagement/supports may be required.

52-92 E. Hastings (Aboriginal Land Trust)

- Lane closure and fencing required to allow ITC Construction to install hoarding and sidewalk breezeway
- ALT and AFD have agreed to lead communication to individuals sheltering in this area re: project and what people are being asked to do.
- Outreach knows who is sheltering here and timeline for any housing. These folks may need additional supports to relocate temporarily or perhaps something can be expedited for them?
- Enhanced communication and outreach needs to start here early next week.
- Lane closure, TMP and fencing will need to be installed Sept. 16

Hi Everyone,

Our response to the Hastings Tent Encampment in assisting COV Sanitation to enforce the Fire Chief's Order has drawn more of our staff into the Downtown Eastside. This has put them in uncomfortable situations dealing with the challenges posed by carrying out this important work. Since the EOC has now been activated, there has been a mental health professional assigned to the incident in order to help staff deal with the ongoing stress of attending this site on a regular basis.

In speaking to some of our staff lately about their concerns, and stress that they have felt about attending the encampment, I felt that we would all benefit from a session with this resource. Jeff Cartwright is s former New Westminster Firefighter who is now a Certified Trauma Responder. He has been working with the COV Sanitation staff for a while now who themselves deal with a lot of urban issues involving DTES residents in the course of their duties.

I had lunch with Jeff yesterday at the EOC and he was more than happy to come and speak to our staff when asked. I have set up an in person session with him next week on Wednesday afternoon for all to attend. Attendance in person is not mandatory, but is STRONGLY encouraged.

Please respond and arrange your schedules accordingly. I really feel that this will be a beneficial support for our staff.

Dear City staff,

This is an update on the fire at the 39 unit Keefer Rooms (Friday, Sept 9) to the best of my knowledge.

Was anyone hurt in the fire? Thankfully no. This is a photo of the last two guys who got out of the hotel. Doug climbed down the fire escape. Brian (left) and his two kids who were sleeping on his floor, slept through the first part of the fire. Brian is an SRO Collaborative food coordinator and luckily we called him and woke him up and told him and his kids to get out of the hotel! He said to me that his luck is actually not luck and a direct benefit of being part of a community organizing program.


for the 39 tenants but thanks to the owner and his management team there, 23 out of 39 tenants were relocated into five other SROs in the owner's (Chris Wall) portfolio. The caretakers of these buildings organized to get beds and bedding, and showed up at the Keefer Rooms to escort tenants and pets to their new rooms. The other 16 tenants were relocated to the shelter at the UGM (7), the Walton shelter (2) or scattered with some refusing to leave and were camping out around the hotel (7). In the next few days, I can likely provide a list of the names of these 16 homeless tenants and we are hoping that UGM, Lookout (Walton Shelter) and Carnegie Outreach find them all and help them get a room. There was one tenant who speaks Chinese who needs a lot of mental health support and this tenant was relocated to the Walton Hotel shelter (hoping the Lookout Society can give him extra care) and four or five people are sleeping outside of the Keefer Rooms including Doug in the photo above - (hoping Carnegie Outreach can find them all and help them). I trust the management of Keefer Rooms will keep an eye out and advocate for the homeless tenants and we will do our best in that regard too. We are connected to the Buddhist Temple on the 300 block of East Hastings and they sent a huge donation of blankets, pillows, food and other necessities and the excellent caretakers distributed the items to the tenants. SRO-C will set up a fundraiser for the tenants and help negotiate, if possible, for some compensation for lost belongings under the owner's insurance.

What's next for the building? The fire started in Gain Wah restaurant and shot up the flue to the roof and was put out by the fire department before it could rip through the rooms upstairs. Thankfully according to the city engineers there is no structural damage to the building but there is significant smoke and water damage. I'm heard from the owner that

there is insurance to cover repairs and it will take two months to renovate. They are looking for a permit from the city to get going on this asap. I got a verbal commitment from the owner, that tenants who want to move back in, can do so, when the new rooms are ready. A silver lining in all this is the full renovation of rooms and bathrooms.

Tenants' belongings: The owner is arranging for coordinated access for tenants to retrieve any belongings that they can salvage in the coming week. The owner is paying for 24-7 security at the front and back end of the building to prevent theft. Unfortunately there was a security breach on the first night and rooms were ransacked. There might be insurance money to cover the loss of tenants' belongings and SRO-C will be pursuing this for the tenants. Many lost sentimental and valuable belongings because of the fire and theft. We're very sad about this but also just grateful that nobody was hurt.

Gain Wah restaurant: A fundraiser has been set up by the Youth Collaborative for Chinatown to help Gain Wah recover costs so that this historic, low income serving Chinatown restaurant can re-open, if possible. The SRO-C's Chinatown staff (Nick on the right in photo) will be working to ensure that this restaurant or something like it, remains on the site.



During COVID we provided bits of funding to Gain Wah so that they could serve meals to the tenants upstairs and one of the servers lived in the hotel. What did we learn?: The SRO Collaborative was deeply involved over the last few years in this building with the tenant and the restaurant through our programs: hot meals, grocery program, community kitchen, indigenous reconnections, maintenance, covid, TORO harm reduction, heat dome and BBQs tenant committee meetings. The intentional development of these relationships between SRO Collaborative staff with tenants and the landlord helped mitigate some of the trauma and contributed to the accountability of the landlord who knows about the <u>DTES Community Land Trust [cmhc-schl.gc.ca]</u> and is motivated to work with us. In other words, tenants are benefiting directly from being connected to a larger sector of community based support. We also learned a lot about what happens when there is a fire and how we can implement a fire safety program to help tenants be more ready for a future fire in this SRO and others (tenants disabling the fire alarm on their floor, what to do with deaf tenants, there is a model fire prevention program at the Silver Avalon Hotel created by a caretaker there that we need to check out, the need to have a regularly updated tenant phone list and floor captains, agreed upon place to marshall, incentives to participate in the preparation).

Thanks to the SRO-C staff and Chris Wall's staff who were there for the day and worked hard to ensure tenants had what they needed, including getting pet carriers and pet food, helping tenants with food and to settle into their new rooms.



Hi Chief Fry,

I have been pretty reoccupied with the Hastings Tent Encampment for a good part of the summer so have not had a chance to keep a close eye on the Firehall inspections data as much as other times. I had a quick look and here is a snapshot of what I found.

- We are doing better than last year in terms of Firehall inspections but last year was not a full year so it is difficult to make a good comparison.
- That being said, there are a number of Firehalls that could be doing better. #1 Firehall has really poor inspection numbers. They are trending much lower than most of the other halls, at about ½ of what most Firehalls accomplish. •
- #2 is not doing inspections, #8 is struggling to do some. #10 and #19 do not have very many inspections, that is why their numbers are so low.



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- This is the total # of Firehall inspections performed to date .
- Firehalls started to do inspections in the 2nd week of February, so this is about 7 months of data.
- 7,427/7 months equals around 1,000- 1,100 inspections per months. This is about where we should be although there is always room for improvement.
- We are over double the number of Firehall inspections from this time last year although last year was not a full year as we know due to COVID

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



Following up from our call this morning, below is the overall timeline we are aiming for to implement some fencing at key bldgs. On the Hastings strip. As mentioned, VFRS (Chiefs Meers and Renning) have approved and support the plan and we will be having some meetings today with a broader group to discuss implementation, impacts and sequencing. Once panels are set up we will be bracing them with the metal plates to keep them from being disassembled or moved.

TMP for 52-92 E. Hastings also attached for your ref.

Note that 2 of 3 doors at Regent plus the FDC were fenced yesterday as we were able to work with Melody to get a significant amount of her belongings into storage.

Regent Hotel – 160 E. Hastings

126 E. Hastings

- Vacant bldg. immediately adjacent and to the east of the garden, N. side 100 block. No fire protection systems in place.
- Required for fire protection purposes
- Needs to be done ASAP
- Outreach will know current status of any people sheltering in this area. Additional engagement/supports may be required.

52-92 E. Hastings (Aboriginal Land Trust)

- Lane closure and fencing required to allow ITC Construction to install hoarding and sidewalk breezeway
- ALT and AFD have agreed to lead communication to individuals sheltering in this area re: project and what people are being asked to do.
- Outreach knows who is sheltering here and timeline for any housing. These folks may need additional supports to relocate temporarily or perhaps something can be expedited for them?
- Enhanced communication and outreach needs to start here early next week.
- Lane closure, TMP and fencing will need to be installed Sept. 16



Fire Prevention Captain of Special Projects and Hazards

The Fire Prevention Captain of Special Projects and Hazards is responsible for fire prevention inspection and enforcement programs within the City, the University of British Columbia and the University Endowment Lands. The Fire Prevention Captain works with internal and external agencies; City of Vancouver, Property Use, Building, Vancouver Coastal Health, Architects and code Consultant, BC liquor, Builders and Developers, Special Events Planners, Fire hall Officers and others. The Captain Fire Prevention will work closely with the A/C Fire Protection Engineer to ensure that the Division is continually improving the Vancouver Fire By-Law with interpretive modifications and code changes. The reporting structure is through the A/C Fire Prevention to the Deputy Chief Community Safety Division.

As Captain of Fire Prevention (FPO), you are expected to provide expertise, leadership, coaching, guidance and mentoring to direct reports, other Fire Inspectors, seconded staff, modified and graduated return to work staff. The Fire Prevention Captain (FPO) is responsible for enforcement and administration of the B.C. Fire Code, City of Vancouver Fire Bylaw, B.C. Fire Services Act, and all applicable codes and standards and may work in a variety of Fire Prevention Portfolios as assigned.

We talked about compiling daily reports of the dangerous situations and acts of aggression encountered by your members. Chief Lemire and myself felt these records may be useful to your team, and Chief Fry in the future. Our initial thought is they would send an email or fill a basic form at the end of the day stating things like verbal threats, hazards to their safety, reports or sightings of weapons, etc. I know we all agree they should not have to deal with this as part of their job. Our hope is, if this list shows a large amount of consistent incidents, it may help to drive change on enforcement, and keep your members safer. What are your thought's on this? (side note)...I have worked a little with Owen when he was in the Firehall, and have spoken with Katherine before, and they both seem like stand up individuals. Good representatives to have down there.

I think it may come down to VFRS recommending or asking for this if VPD is resistant.. but honestly, strategic placement seems prudent. Regent is required to protect folks from fall hazards related to REFM boarding windows. ALT is required for the hoarding work. Balmoral had fencing so presumably it wasn't a problem before.. we should reinstall it. That leaves 126 E. Hastings.






Fire Prevention Captain of Special Projects and Hazards

The Fire Prevention Captain of Special Projects and Hazards is responsible for fire prevention inspection and enforcement programs within the City, the University of British Columbia and the University Endowment Lands. The Fire Prevention Captain works with internal and external agencies; City of Vancouver, Property Use, Building, Vancouver Coastal Health, Architects and code Consultant, BC liquor, Builders and Developers, Special Events Planners, Fire hall Officers and others. 

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Officers' Meeting September 13th 2022

Hiring Update:

• No external candidates in the process at this point.

Staff Movements:

- New Organizational Chart will be coming out at end of the month. We may wait until we onboard the new staff member coming from Suppression.
- Management is looking for volunteers to join the Problem Buildings Team. So far Inspector Naomi Wolf has put her name forward. We will be looking for at least 1 more staff member, if no one applies we will be choosing someone for this exciting challenge.

Fire Prevention Career OP(S):

• Justin Chelak was the successful candidate for one of the positions. He will be starting in Fire Prevention around the first week of October.

• There were no applicants for the re-posted Career Op for a Fire Inspector which closed on Sept. 2nd.

• Management has spoken with Local 18 and we are moving ahead with seconding a 3rd staff member from Suppression who has just finished their 1st year. Hoping to onboard them around the end of October/early November.

• We have finished all interviews for the Clerk 4 position and have chosen the top applicant. We are just finalizing some things with HR but will be sending them an offer letter very soon and try to onboard them as soon as possible.

Current Projects/Issues

- Hastings Tent Encampment. VPD discontinued street sweeps with Sanitation at beginning of July which has led to the current situation with the growth of tents, structures and combustible materials along the sidewalks on Hastings in DTES.
- These have been blocking the access to and from the various buildings as well as FDC's and creating a hazard on the sidewalks.
- Chief Fry issued an order on July 25th to the COV for the removal of the combustible materials under the VFBL.
- The missing piece here in destructuring this encampment is that there is very little if any housing available. There are many conversations happening at Sr. Levels of government trying to work out some viable housing solutions but the work is going slowly.

- The operation is running more smoothly now that the EOC is up and running and there is a better support structure in place.
- This is taking up a considerable amount of time for the Division and a lot of our other work has been put on hold. Numerous FOI requests have come in over the issuing of the FCO.
- Thanks to all staff who have helped out with this difficult work. It has been a strain on our division and on may other COV departments. We will need to continue supporting this effort as difficult as it is.
- On this subject, there was a training session held recently for psychological support for our staff for this operation as well as any other issues that our staff may be feeling. Management would appreciate some feedback on this as I heard from the counsellor Jeff Cartwright that the session went well. We would like to schedule more of these in the future if staff find these helpful. All staff should be aware that they may reach out to Jeff at any time if they would like to meet with him privately.
- All staff need to check their emails, NOV's, notebooks and any other correspondence if they had any involvement in the Winters Hotel at 203 Abbott. There is an FOI request in on this fire and a Coroner's Inquest.
- Overtime is available in #1 and #2's District on Mondays and Fridays in order to assist Prob. Buildings Team with their backlog of work. It has been organized by Captain Lee. On Mondays see the Office Captain for the assignments. Inspectors must ensure that all FDM entries are complete by the end of the day.
- Risk-based Inspections: Class D inspections are being divided into FPO and Firehall inspections. FPO Class D are mostly High-rise Office buildings and will have an inspection frequency of 365 days. Firehall Class D's are lower risk, low rise occupancies that will now switch to a 1095 day (3 year) inspection frequency. This is a more efficient use of our resources and is a move towards a more risk-based approach to inspections.
- A new NOV form with Fire Watch Procedures and a Fire Watch log attached is being finalized for the Firehalls. There are new translations, some new language around the issuing and posting of orders. We are waiting for an opinion from City Legal on the new language. We hope to be sending this to the printer soon and roll these out to the Firehalls soon.

Inspections by the Numbers

- As of September 1st our combined inspection totals are at 12,973
- 5,182 have been completed by FPO Staff
- 7,791 have been completed by the Firehalls.

- Firehalls are averaging 1100 inspections per month (started 2nd week in February)
- FPO averages around 800 per month.
- These are pretty decent numbers considering the late start of the Firehalls and staffing shortages in FPO.
- We should be on track to hit at least 20,000 inspections for the year

Hi Daniel,

Deputy Chief Renning and myself did a tour of the side streets adjacent to the Hastings Street Tent Encampment today and found tests and structures in front of the following addresses:

- 407 Gore Avenue, tents in front of LifeLabs building. Not currently blocking egress or access of FDC's
- 341 Gore Avenue, tents in front of Orange Hall as well as across the street on the east side of Gore Avenue.
- 300 and 400 Block of Dunlevy multiple tents along these blocks against buildings. One blocked doorway.
- 300 Block Columbia, both sides of the street, multiple tents, both sides of the street
- Main Street: 400 block has a chop shop but no tents on west side. 300 block has tents against a building. 319 Main street "The Imperial" has tents blocking a doorway. 200 Block Main on the west side has tents blocking exits.

I realize that this is not very scientific or comprehensive but it gives a bit of a picture of the issue. We did this from a car as we were a bit pressed for time. I estimate that there were approximately 20-25 tents in these areas. If you would like more detailed information we can follow up with pictures at some point. This might also be a good job for the folks that are doing the mapping to start including these areas as well. Let me know if you need anything further on this or anything else.

Hi Chief Fry,

I just spoke to ADC Connelly and On Duty AC Dan Nichols on scene at 222 Keefer street.

222 Keefer

- This building had 45 units of residential with approximately 39 of them occupied
- Unsure of the whereabouts of all occupants as not all were home at the time of the fire, however, Primary Search has been completed and there were no victims found
- Cause of fire is still under investigation but appears to have been a fire that stated in the kitchen of the adjacent restaurant at 218 Keefer and spread up the ducting to the roof of the building and ignited contents on roof
- Sprinklers were activated and fire alarm was as well
- Power has been shut off and there is extensive water damage throughout the building
- ESS is on scene trying to get an idea of how many people will be displaced and for how long
- Some will be displaced long term and some more short term
- Last inspected by Problem Buildings Team on August 11th with several violations found.

12 East Hastings

- 2 storey building, (Liberty Market)
- Fire apparently started from garbage being lit on the roof, possibly ignited by people from an adjacent building (this is unconfirmed)
- Upstairs was under renovation with lots of exposed walls and open framing so the potential for a greater fire loss was great. Roof had a skylight that was beginning to let in combustible material and could have started to spread to 2nd storey
- Crews did a great a great job gaining access under very tough conditions. Lots of tents, and people needed to be moved in order for crews to gain access and ladder the building.
- VERY DELAYED RESPONSE DUE TO LACK OF ACCESS FROM TENTS, STRUCTURES AND COMBUSTIBLES OUT FRONT. OUR FIRE CREWS STATE THAT THE PROPLE SHELTERING ON THE STREET WERE A HUGE PROBLEM AT THIS INCIDENT.

I will give these updates at the end of day EOC Meeting. Let me know if you need anything else.

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
