市长及市议员

温哥华市议会包括1位市长和10位市议员。市议会批准本市的年度运营预算(2022年为\$17.47亿元)。该预算为市政服务提供资金,其中包括:

- 紧急服务(包括消防和警察)
- 图书馆
- · 垃圾收集和回收
- 供水和下水道服务
- 艺术、文化和市民剧院
- 道路、人行道和路灯

市议会做出的决定包括:

- 年度物业税率

市议会还决定资本预算(Capital Budget,2019-2022年度的预 算为\$28亿元),包括:

- 新出现的优先事项

公园局委员

温哥华公园局包括7名委员。

公园局负责运作:

- · 240多个公园 包括史丹利公园
- 24个设有游泳池、溜冰场、健身中心和运动场地的社区中心
- 街道树木
- 公共码头
- 三个高尔夫球场

教育局学务委员

温哥华教育局(第39学区)包括9位学务委员。

该教育局在温哥华、不列颠哥伦比亚大学土地(UBC Lands)和大学保留地(University Endowment Lands,缩写为UEL)上提供以下服务:

- 小学教育
- 中学教育
- 社区教育
- 特殊教育服务

省政府为教育局的运营和资本预算提供资金。学校税单独包含在您的物业税中。



要投票,您必须满足以下所有条件:

- □ 在选举日(2022年10月15日)年满18岁
- □ 为加拿大公民
- □ 在登记之日前,您至少已在BC省居住了六个月
- □ 您住在温哥华(没有最少天数要求)
- □ 法律并未取消您的投票资格

尚未成为加拿大公民的永久居民不能投票。

如果您居住在UBC或大学保留地(University Endowment Lands, 缩写为UEL),而且在温哥华没有物业,那么您只能在温哥华市选 中投票选举学务委员。虽然不能为温哥华市府投票选举市长和 市议员外,但您还有资格在大温哥华地区A选区选举(Vancouver Regional District Electoral Area A Election)中,投票选出代表您 的管理局成员。请访问metrovancouver.org了解更多信息。



查看您是否已登记

如果您在上一次BC省的省选(2020年10月)中进行了投票,那么 您将自动地被列入温哥华市的选民名单,无需再次登记。若要查 看您是否已登记:请访问vancouver.ca/vote,或致电3-1-1。



如果您是非居民业主选举人

要作为非居民业主选举人(Non-Resident Property Elector,在温哥华拥有物业但并不住在温哥华)进行登记,您则需要在投票地 点提供额外的文件。请访问Vancouver.ca/vote或致电3-1-1,以了 解更多信息。



如果您在20已22年8月15日之前提前登记,您将在2022年9月下 旬收到一张选民信息卡。在同一地址、姓氏相同的每个人,将收到 装在一个信封内的选民信息卡。您不需要选民信息卡亦可投票, 但是您可以使用您的信息卡在投票地点获得更快的处理时间。





您可以选择以下方式之一来进行投票:

1. 提前投票

3. 邮寄投票—免费回邮

现在所有合资格的选民都可以通过邮件投票。您可以在9月 29日星期四下午5点之前,申请通过邮寄投票,以便通过邮寄 收到您的选票,并有足够的时间将选票寄回到温哥华市选办 公室。

有两种方法可以获得您的邮寄投票套件:

- 2. 领取您的套件: 您必须在10月11日星期二下午5点之前申请。 套件将于9月27日星期二早上8:30至10月14日星期五中午, 在 温哥华市选办公室(305 West 8th Avenue) 准备好以供领取。 收到您的申请之后, 我们需要两个工作日才能准备好您的套 件以供领取。

如果您决定领取您的套件(或指定一个人来领取您的 套件),请提供有您的(或指定人士的)全名和签名的带 照片的身份证件。

我们建议您查看加拿大邮政(Canada Post)的邮件和包裹递送时间标准,以便帮助您计划回邮您的选票。10月15日星期六晚上8点之后收到的选票将不予计票。邮戳将不被视为回邮已填妥选票的有效时间。




所有现行的BC省卫生令都将予以遵循。

为了将每个人的安全放在首位,您可预期在投票地点采取以下预 防措施:

- •大多数投票地点都将是单向入口。
- •所有选举官员员都将接受COVID-19安全培训。
- 根据温哥华市府的政策,所有选举官员都已接种COVID-19 疫苗。
- •投票场所内将有同时允许人数的限制。
- •将对身体距离进行管控。
- •将免费提供一次性口罩、手套和洗手液。
- •将安装实体分隔物。
- •物体表面和笔将会进行频繁消毒。

2023-2026年资本计划

资本计划是一项为期四年的投资计划,用于本市的市政设施和 基础设施,包括

- ·公园和海堤;
- ·街道和人行道;
- ·水管和下水道;
- •社区设施,例如托儿所、康乐中心和图书馆;
- ·可负担住房(与省及联邦政府合作)
- ·服务场等城市设施,以及消防站等公共安全设施;
- ・以及更多。

投资于市政设施和基础设施有助于保持温哥华市的平稳运行, 并有助于提高我们的生活质量——包括我们如何出行、享受公共 空间、保持安全、减缓气候变化的影响并适应气候变化、以及获 得清洁用水和其他核心服务。

资本计划的很大一部分侧重于维护和更新温哥华市内现有各项 设施和基础设施方面的紧迫工作,以使这些设施保持良好的状态。资本计划还包括为推进减缓气候变化以及适应气候变化的工 作提供资金,并且预留出资金以推动高级别政府合作伙伴关系。 资本计划的其余部分将用于投资新的和扩建的各项市政设施和 基础设施,以帮助服务于我们不断增长的人口和经济。



2023-2026年资本计划包括在市政设施和基础设施方面的\$35亿 元投资。经过一轮有近4000名市民参与的公众参与后,该资本计 划于2022年6月获得市议会的批准。

该资本计划的资金来源多种多样,包括物业税、公用事业费、开发 缴款以及合作机构的捐款。考虑到该计划的债务能力以及维持其 AAA信用评级,市府在我们的财务战略中将资本储备的使用、现 收现付和债务融资方面保持平很。市府在能够借钱之前,必须获 得选民的批准,这就是为什么在市政选举的选票上有资本计划方 面提问。

总计\$4.95亿元(在\$35亿元中的)拟通过借款提供资金,而这需 要在10月15日的市政选举中获得选民的批准。

将会有三个提问:

- 1. 交通与核心运营技术: \$1.7345亿元
- 2. 社区设施: \$1.6207亿元
- 3. 公园、公共安全和其他市政设施; 气候变化适应和其他新出现的优先事项: \$1.5947亿元

选票上相关提问的确切措辞如下(英文):

1. TRANSPORTATION AND CORE OPERATING TECHNOLOGY

Are you in favour of Council having the authority, without further assent of the electors, to pass by-laws between January 1, 2023 and December 31, 2026 to borrow an aggregate \$173,450,000 for the following purposes?

A. Street and Bridge Infrastructure

To provide for major maintenance, reconstruction and enhancement of the arterial and neighbourhood transportation networks, sidewalks, greenways and cycle routes and to undertake major maintenance of bridges and other structures, including repairs and structural work on the Granville Bridge and Cambie Bridge.

\$94,250,000

 B. Traffic Signals and Street Lighting To provide for major maintenance, replacement and enhancement of traffic signals and street lighting that are beyond economical repair or no longer meet operational requirements. \$54,300,000

C. Electrical Services in Public Spaces To provide for increased availability of electrical services in public spaces including uses such as electrical vehicle and bike charging, electrical kiosks for food trucks, filming and events, and lighting in public gathering spaces. **\$8,500,000**

D. Core Operating Technology

To provide for renewal and enhancement of the City's core operating information technology systems such as fiber, data centres, servers and applications that are critical to the delivery of and access to City services and programs. **\$16,400,000**

If this question receives the assent of the electors, Council has the power, without further assent of the electors, to pass by-laws, as and when Council considers appropriate, to borrow money for the projects described up to \$173,450,000.







EXPLANATORY NOTE FOR QUESTIONS 2 AND 3:


