投票是您表达对自己、对您的亲人和社区的关心的机会。这是我们所有的人对温哥华的过去、现在和未来担负起责任的机会。您的时间和精力都非常宝贵——感谢您慷慨参与2022年温哥华市选。

准备投票

- 1. 计划您的投票。**可使用“Plan Your Vote”（计划您的投票）这个工具来制定投票计划，该工具可在vancouver.ca/plan-your-vote上获得，或使用在本小册子末尾的工作表。该工具将帮助您选出您将投票选举的候选人，并记住您对资本计划借款提问的回答，以及选择一个方便的日期和地点来进行投票。

- 3. 留出足够的时间进行投票。**选择最适合您的投票选项：提前投票以缩短等候时间，通过邮寄投票（免费回邮）以享有更多便利，或在10月15日星期六的选举日（Election Day）进行投票。

2022年10月15日星期六, 温哥华的选民将投票选举：

- 1位市长
- 10位市议员
- 7位公园局委员
- 9位学务委员

您投票选举谁？

市长及市议员

温哥华市议会包括1位市长和10位市议员。市议会批准本市的年度运营预算（2022年为\$17.47亿元）。该预算为市政服务提供资金，其中包括：

- 紧急服务（包括消防和警察）
- 图书馆
- 垃圾收集和回收
- 供水和下水道服务
- 艺术、文化和市民剧院
- 道路、人行道和路灯

市议会做出的决定包括：

- 温哥华的政策和优先事项
- 温哥华及其各个社区的长期规划
- 影响企业、建筑、噪音和土地使用的附则
- 开发项目
- 年度物业税率

市议会还决定资本预算（Capital Budget, 2019-2022年度的预算为\$28亿元），包括：

- 住房和托儿服务
- 供水、下水道和绿色基础设施
- 公园、文化和社区设施
- 交通和道路
- 新出现的优先事项



公园局委员

温哥华公园局包括7名委员。

公园局负责运作：

- 240多个公园 - 包括史丹利公园
- 24个设有游泳池、溜冰场、健身中心和运动场地的社区中心
- 街道树木
- 公共码头
- 三个高尔夫球场

教育局学务委员

温哥华教育局(第39学区)包括9位学务委员。

该教育局在温哥华、不列颠哥伦比亚大学土地(UBC Lands)和大学保留地(University Endowment Lands, 缩写为UEL)上提供以下服务：

- 小学教育
- 中学教育
- 社区教育
- 特殊教育服务

省政府为教育局的运营和资本预算提供资金。学校税单独包含在您的物业税中。



您是温哥华选民吗？

要投票, 您必须满足以下所有条件:

- 在选举日 (2022年10月15日) 年满18岁
- 为加拿大公民
- 在登记之日前, 您至少已在BC省居住了六个月
- 您住在温哥华 (没有最少天数要求)
- 法律并未取消您的投票资格



尚未成为加拿大公民的永久居民不能投票。

如果您居住在UBC或大学保留地 (University Endowment Lands, 缩写为UEL), 而且在温哥华没有物业, 那么您只能在温哥华市选中投票选举学务委员。虽然不能为温哥华市府投票选举市长和市议员外, 但您还有资格在大温哥华地区A选区选举 (Vancouver Regional District Electoral Area A Election) 中, 投票选出代表您的管理局成员。请访问metrovanancouver.org了解更多信息。

您是否已登记投票？



查看您是否已登记

如果您在上一次BC省的省选(2020年10月)中进行了投票,那么您将自动地被列入温哥华市的选民名单,无需再次登记。若要查看您是否已登记:请访问vancouver.ca/vote,或致电3-1-1。



如果您已在选民名单上,您将收到您的选民信息卡,您可能需要在投票地点出示该信息卡。

有两种方法可在投票时进行登记:

选项 2. 提供一个身份证件 (ID) 并作出郑重声明:

如果您只有一个身份证件,您也可以在投票地点负责人的面前作郑重声明,来确认您的身份和居住地。

如果您没有固定地址

如果您居住在温哥华但没有固定地址或邮政地址,您可以通过提供您在温哥华去的避难所或社会服务机构的名称和/或地址,或您投票地点的地址来登记投票。

如果您是学生

如果您是学生并且符合本指南中列出的所有资格要求,您可以登记投票。

如果您是非居民业主选举人

要作为非居民业主选举人 (Non-Resident Property Elector, 在温哥华拥有物业但并不住在温哥华) 进行登记,您则需要在投票地点提供额外的文件。请访问 Vancouver.ca/vote 或致电 3-1-1, 以了解更多信息。

选民信息卡



如果您在2022年8月15日之前提前登记,您将在2022年9月下旬收到一张选民信息卡。在同一地址、姓氏相同的每个人,将收到装在一个信封内的选民信息卡。您不需要选民信息卡亦可投票,但是您可以使用您的信息卡在投票地点获得更快的处理时间。

您能如何投票？

您可以选择以下方式之一来进行投票：

1. 提前投票

2. 于选举日 (Election Day) 投票

在10月15日星期六，早上8点至晚上8点之间，您可以在温哥华市的任何一个投票地点进行投票。您的选民信息卡上有您附近的投票地点。有关投票地点的完整列表，请参见第16页。

3. 邮寄投票—免费回邮

现在所有合格的选民都可以通过邮件投票。您可以在9月29日星期四下午5点之前，申请通过邮寄投票，以便通过邮寄收到您的选票，并有足够的时间将选票寄回到温哥华市选办公室。


要申请邮寄选票，请访问vancouver.ca/vote-by-mail进行在线申请。如果您无法使用电脑或需要帮助，并且如果您是已登记选民，请致电3-1-1，或者前往温哥华市选办公室 (305 West 8th Avenue) 亲自进行申请。



申请邮寄投票于9月6日上午10点开始, 直到10月11日下午5点截止。

有两种方法可以获得您的邮寄投票套件:

- 1. 通过邮寄收到您的套件:**您必须在9月29日星期四下午 5 点之前申请。套件将于9月27日星期二开始寄出。
- 2. 领取您的套件:**您必须在10月11日星期二下午5点之前申请。套件将于9月27日星期二早上8:30至10月14日星期五中午, 在温哥华市选办公室 (305 West 8th Avenue) 准备好以供领取。收到您的申请之后, 我们需要两个工作日才能准备好您的套件以供领取。



如果您决定领取您的套件 (或指定一个人来领取您的套件), 请提供有您的 (或指定人士的) 全名和签名的带照片的身份证件。

我们建议您查看加拿大邮政 (Canada Post) 的邮件和包裹递送时间标准, 以便帮助您计划回邮您的选票。10月15日星期六晚上8点之后收到的选票将不予计票。邮戳将不被视为回邮已填妥选票的有效时间。







亲自标记您的选票

您將會在指定的保密屏幕後面填寫選票。

1. 在选票上,您会在每位候选人姓名或提问的左侧看到一个类似于此  的椭圆形。请使用所提供的专用笔,像这样填涂该椭圆形:  。



为保护您的隐私并使您的投票保密,请勿将您的选票拍照,以及/或在投票地点内拍照。



2. 投票给您要选举的候选人：

- 最多1位市长
- 最多10位市议员
- 最多7位公园局委员
- 最多9名学务委员

您可以投票给少于或不超过指定数量的候选人,但不能多于。

3. 如果您在选票上标记错了,您可以通过让选举官员知道来获得新的选票。
4. 将选票标记好之后,请将选票放入文件夹内以便使您的选票保密,并将其带到投票机前。选举官员将帮助您将选票放入机器中,以便投票结束之后进行点票。

姓名在选票上随机排列

无障碍投票

进入投票地点

投票地点：

- 对于使用轮椅、代步车、婴儿车和拐杖的人来说通常都是无障碍的。无法进入投票地点的选民可以在建筑外面（路边或停车场内的指定位置）进行投票。
- 大多数投票地点内部或附近都设有通用洗手间
- 提供椅子
- 为以下人员设置优先排队—不会问任何问题
 - 老年人，
 - 残疾人，
 - 免疫功能低下的人，
 - 孕妇，
 - 带着小孩的人，或
 - 需要低刺激环境的人（例如，由于心理健康、焦虑、发育和认知障碍）



投票方式

以下选项可供有需要的合资格选民使用：

1. 邮寄投票。

这个选项将让您能在家中进行的投票。请参阅第8页有关邮寄投票的信息。

2. 在任何提前投票日(10月1日、5日、8日、11日、13日)或选举日(10月15日), 在投票地点的路边投票。

当您到达投票地点时, 将车停在指定的路边投票点, 并致电604-829-2010联系温哥华市选办公室。届时将有一名选举官员出来帮助您进行投票。请访问vancouver.ca/vote查看每个投票地点的无障碍选项, 并查看哪些投票地点提供路边投票。

3. 在提前投票期间使用辅助选票标记设备。

如果您需要帮助来标记选票并想使用辅助选票标记设备, 请在提前投票日期间(10月1日、5日、8日、11日和13日), 前往Roundhouse社区中心(181 Roundhouse Mews)或Trout Lake社区中心(3360 Victoria Drive)。

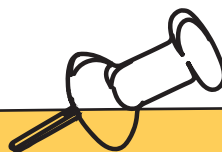

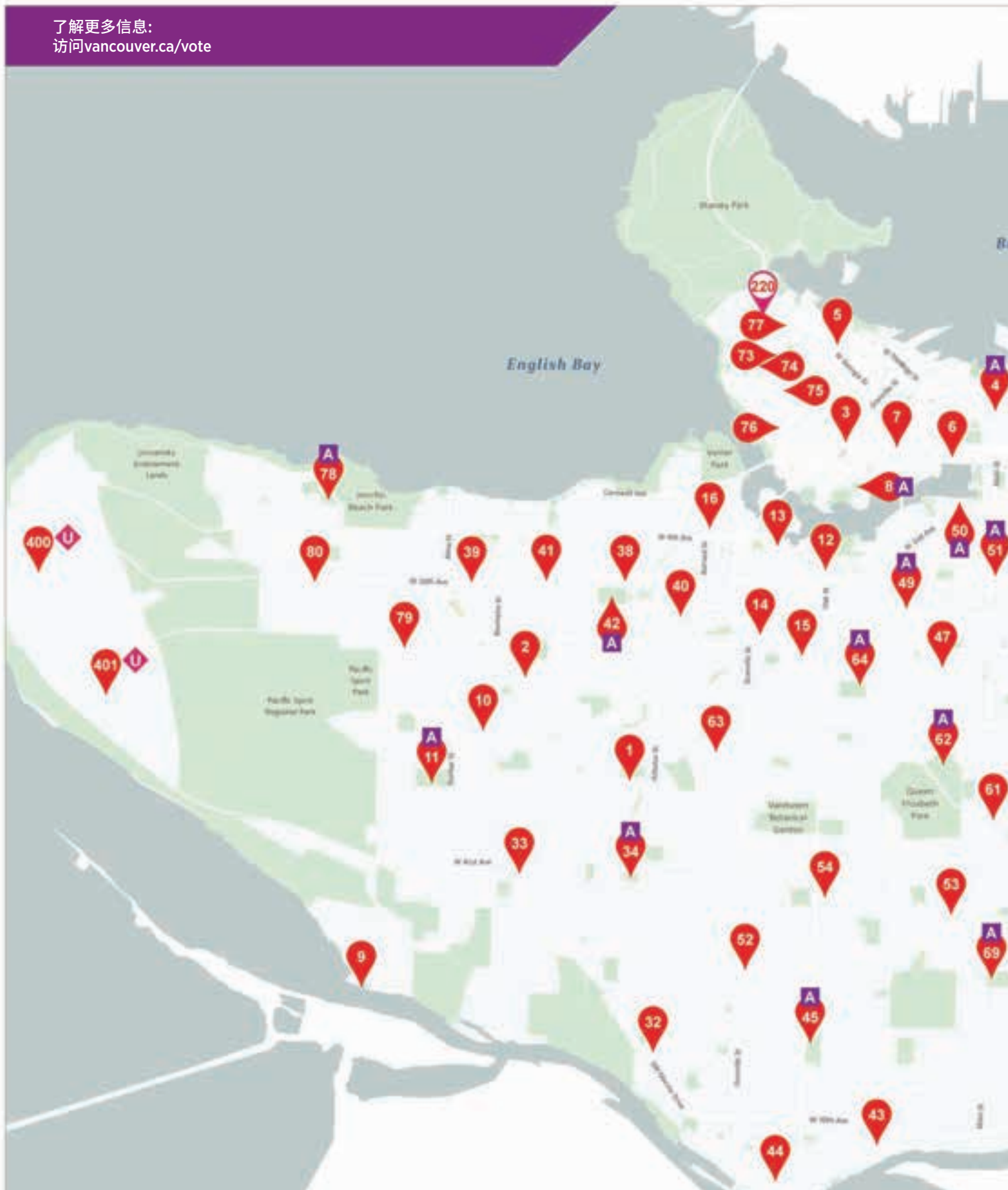

在COVID-19疫情期间安全地投票



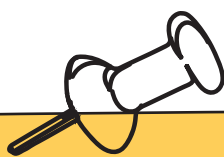
所有现行的BC省卫生令都将予以遵循。

为了将每个人的安全放在首位,您可预期在投票地点采取以下预防措施:

- 大多数投票地点都将是单向入口。
- 所有选举官员都将接受COVID-19安全培训。
- 根据温哥华市府的政策,所有选举官员都已接种COVID-19疫苗。
- 投票场所内将有同时允许人数的限制。
- 将对身体距离进行管控。
- 将免费提供一次性口罩、手套和洗手液。
- 将安装实体分隔物。
- 物体表面和笔将会进行频繁消毒。

以下是您可以在投票地点帮助保护自己、选举官员和其他选民的方法:

- 戴上口罩遮住口鼻。
- 尊重每个人的空间。
- 如果生病,请待在家里,并选择另一种方式进行投票。



请记住,您可以通过邮寄投票而不是亲自去投票。您也可以提前投票,以避免在选举日排队。



2023-2026年资本计划

资本计划是一项为期四年的投资计划，用于本市的市政设施和基础设施，包括

- 公园和海堤；
- 街道和人行道；
- 水管和下水道；
- 社区设施，例如托儿所、康乐中心和图书馆；
- 可负担住房（与省及联邦政府合作）
- 服务场等城市设施，以及消防站等公共安全设施；
- 以及更多。

投资于市政设施和基础设施有助于保持温哥华市的平稳运行，并有助于提高我们的生活质量——包括我们如何出行、享受公共空间、保持安全、减缓气候变化的影响并适应气候变化、以及获得清洁用水和其他核心服务。

资本计划的很大一部分侧重于维护和更新温哥华市内现有各项设施和基础设施方面的紧迫工作，以使这些设施保持良好的状态。资本计划还包括为推进减缓气候变化以及适应气候变化的工作提供资金，并且预留出资金以推动高级别政府合作伙伴关系。资本计划的其余部分将用于投资新的和扩建的各项市政设施和基础设施，以帮助服务于我们不断增长的人口和经济。



2023-2026年资本计划包括在市政设施和基础设施方面的\$35亿元投资。经过一轮有近4000名市民参与的公众参与后,该资本计划于2022年6月获得市议会的批准。

该资本计划的资金来源多种多样,包括物业税、公用事业费、开发缴款以及合作机构的捐款。考虑到该计划的债务能力以及维持其AAA信用评级,市府在我们的财务战略中将资本储备的使用、现收现付和债务融资方面保持平衡。市府在能够借钱之前,必须获得选民的批准,这就是为什么在市政选举的选票上有资本计划方面提问。

总计\$4.95亿元(在\$35亿元中的)拟通过借款提供资金,而这需要在10月15日的市政选举中获得选民的批准。

将会有三个提问:
