市長和市議員

溫哥華市議會包括1位市長和10位市議員。市議會審批市政府的 每年營運預算(2022年為17.47億元)。這預算為市政府各項服務 提供經費,包括:

- 緊急服務(包括消防和警務)
- 圖書館
- · 垃圾收集和廢料回收
- 供水和污水處理等服務
- · 藝術、文化及公民劇院
- 道路、人行道及街燈

市議會作出的決定包括:

- · 溫哥華的政策和優先事項
- · 溫哥華及其各個社區的長期計劃
- 影響商業、建築物、噪音和土地利用的附例
- 發展項目
- 每年物業稅率

市議會也決定資本預算(Capital Budget)(2019年至2022年為28億元),當中包括:

- 房屋和託兒
- 水務、污水處理及綠色基建
- 公園、文化及社區設施
- 運輸及道路
- 新出現的優先事項

公園局委員

溫哥華公園局包括7位委員。

公園局營運:

- ・超過240個公園——包括史丹利公園 (Stanley Park)
- 24個社區中心,連同泳池、溜冰場、健身中心及運動場
- 街道樹木
- 公眾遊艇碼頭
- 三個高爾夫球場

學務委員

溫哥華學校局(第39學校區)包括9位學務委員。

學校局在溫哥華、卑詩大學(UBC)校園區及大學保留地(UEL)提供以下服務:

- 小學教育
- 中學教育
- 社區教育
- 專科教育服務

省政府為學校局的營運和資本等預算提供經費。學校稅單獨包括 在物業稅內。

您必須符合以下所有條件才可以投票:

- □ 在選舉日(2022年10月15日)您是18歲或以上
- □ 您是加拿大公民
- □ 您在緊接登記那一天之前在卑詩省居住了至少六個月
- □ 您是住在溫哥華(不限日數)
- □ 在法律上您沒有被取消投票資格

還未成為加拿大公民的永久居民不能投票。

您如住在UBC或大學保留地(UEL)而在溫哥華沒擁有物業,在 溫哥華市選中您只能投票選出學務委員。您沒有資格投票選出 溫哥華市政府的市長和市議員,但也會有資格投票選出一名主 任(Director),在溫哥華都會區域A選區選舉(Metro Vancouver Regional District Electoral Area A Election)中代表您。詳情請 瀏覽metrovancouver.org。



查看一下您是否登記了

如果您在上一次卑詩省選(2020年10月)有投票,並且是溫哥華 居民,您就會自動列入溫哥華的選民名單上,不必再登記。想知道 自己是否登記了:瀏覽vancouver.ca/vote,或致電3-1-1。

如果您已經在選民名單上,您將會收到您的選民資料卡,您可 以在投票地點出示這張卡。


如果您是學生並符合本指南所列的全部條件,您可以登記投票。

如果您是非居住物業選民(Non-Resident Property Elector)

想登記成為非居住物業選民(在溫哥華擁有物業但不是住在溫 哥華),在投票地點您將需要提供額外文件證明。詳情請瀏覽 vancouver.ca/vote,或致電 3-1-1。



如果您在2022年8月15日或以前預先登記了,在2022年9月下旬 您會收到選民資料卡。在同一個地址的所有同姓的人士,將會收 到他們的選民資料卡,這些卡是以一個信封寄來的。您不必有選 民資料卡都可以投票,不過如有這張卡,可加快在投票地點的辦 理時間。





您可選擇以下其中一種方法來投票:

1. 提前投票

在10月1日、5日、8日、11日及13日,您可以在上午8時至晚上8時, 到任何溫哥華提前投票地點投票。想找列出提前投票地點的完 整清單,請參看第16頁。

2. 在選舉日當天投票

在10月15日星期六,您可以在上午8時至晚上8時,到任何溫哥 華投票地點投票。您的選民資料卡包括了您就近的投票地點。 想找投票地點的完整清單,請參看第16頁。

3. 郵寄投票——免付回郵郵資

所有合資格的選民現在都可以使用郵寄投票。您可以在9月 29日星期四下午5時之前提出郵寄投票的要求,才會收到郵 寄來的選票,讓您有充分時間將選票寄回溫哥華選舉辦公室 (Vancouver Election Office)。

想索取郵寄選票,請上網到vancouver.ca/vote-by-mail申請。您 如沒有電腦可用或需要協助,而您是登記選民的話,請致電3-1-1, 或者您可以親臨溫哥華選舉辦公室(305 West 8th Avenue)進行 申請。



要求郵寄投票的時間由9月6日星期二上午10時開始,直 至10月11日星期二下午5時。

有兩種方法可拿到郵寄投票套件:

- 1. **套件郵寄給您:**您必須在9月29日星期四下午5時或以前申 請。套件將於9月27日星期二開始寄出。
- 2. 自行領取套件:您必須在10月11日星期二下午5時或以前申請。套件將會準備好,從9月27日星期二上午8:30開始,直至10月14日星期五中午,您可到溫哥華選舉辦公室(305 West 8th Avenue)領取。我們收到您的申請後,需要兩個工作天才可準備好您的套件,供您領取。

如果您決定自行領取套件(或指派人來領取套件), 請準備好一個身分證明文件,上面有您的(或該名指定 人士的)全名和簽名。

我們建議您審視一下加拿大郵務公司(Canada Post)的郵件和 包裹遞送時間標準,以幫助您安排將選票交回。在10月15日星 期六晚上8時之後收到的選票,將不會被點算。郵戮不會視為 交回填妥選票的時間的有效憑證。

無障礙投票

進入投票地點

投票地點:

- 有椅子可供使用

 - 免疫功能低下的人士,





在COVID-19疫情大流行期間安全地投票

所有現行的卑詩省衛生命令都要遵守。

為了以每個人的安全為優先,您可預期在您的投票地點會有以下 的預防措施:

- •大部分投票地點均會有一個單向入口。
- •所有選舉官員都受過COVID-19安全訓練。
- •所有選舉官員都已接種了COVID-19疫苗,與溫哥華市政府的政策一致。
- •在投票地點內同一時間只允許有限數目的人。
- •要保持肢體距離。
- •將會有拋棄式口罩、手套及搓手液免費提供。
- •將會設有隔板。
- •將會經常消毒各處表面和筆。

2023-2026資本計劃

資本計劃是針對本市的便利設施和基建的四年投資計劃,當中 包括

- ·公園和海堤;
- ·街道和人行道;
- ·供水管和污水管;
- · 社區設施,例如託兒所、康樂中心及圖書館;
- 可負擔房屋(與省和聯邦兩級政府合作)
- ·城鎮設施,例如維修場和諸如消防局等公共安全設施;
- ·以及其他。

投資於便利設施和基建,有助確保溫哥華運作暢順及提升生活 質素——這包括我們可如何出行、享受公共空間、保持安全、減 輕氣候變化的影響和適應氣候變化,以及獲得潔淨食水和其他 核心服務。

資本計劃其中一大部分是著重於極需要的工程,去保養及翻新溫 哥華各處現有的便利設施和基建,以確保其狀態良好。資本計劃 還包括資助那些促進氣候變化減緩和調適的工程,並且留出撥款 去借助上兩級政府合作之力。資本計劃的餘下部分是用針對新增 和擴建的便利設施和基建的投資,來幫助滿足日益增加的人口和 不斷發展的經濟所需。



2023-2026資本計劃包含針對便利設施和基建的35億元投資。經過一輪有近4,000名市民參加的公眾參與活動之後,資本計劃於2022年6月獲市議會批准。

資本計劃的融資來源有多個,包括物業稅、公用事業費、開發商的 捐款,以及合作伙伴機構的捐款。考慮到其舉債能力及要維持其 AAA信貸評級,市政府在其財務策略中平衡了資本儲備的運用、 現收現付及債務融資。市政府必須得到選民同意才可以舉債;正 因如此,在今次市選的選票上才會有關於資本計劃的問題。

建議通過舉債來融資合共4.95億元(35億元的其中一部分),而 舉債需要在10月15日的市選中得到選民同意[。]

將會提出三條問題:

- 1. 運輸和核心營運技術: 1.7345億元
- 2. 社區設施: 1.6207億元
- 3. 公園、公共安全及其他公民設施;氣候變化調適以及其他新 出現的優先事項: 1.5947億元

選票上的問題的確切措詞如下(英文):

1. TRANSPORTATION AND CORE OPERATING TECHNOLOGY

Are you in favour of Council having the authority, without further assent of the electors, to pass by-laws between January 1, 2023 and December 31, 2026 to borrow an aggregate \$173,450,000 for the following purposes?

A. Street and Bridge Infrastructure

To provide for major maintenance, reconstruction and enhancement of the arterial and neighbourhood transportation networks, sidewalks, greenways and cycle routes and to undertake major maintenance of bridges and other structures, including repairs and structural work on the Granville Bridge and Cambie Bridge.


