Découvrez ce que nous faisons pour assurer votre sécurité

Les élections municipales de Vancouver 2022 se dérouleront sur les territoires non cédés et ancestraux des peuples de langue hən'q'əmin'əm' et Skwxwú7mesh : les peuples xʷməθkʷəy'əm (bande de Musqueam), Skwxwú7mesh (nation Squamish) et səliłwətaɬ (nation Tsleil-Waututh). Ces nations sont les gardiennes de ces terres depuis des temps immémoriaux.

Voter est une occasion pour vous de montrer que vous prenez soin de vous-même, de vos proches et de votre collectivité. C'est l'occasion pour nous tous de nous montrer responsables du passé, du présent et de l'avenir de Vancouver. Votre temps et votre énergie sont précieux – merci de votre générosité et de votre participation aux élections municipales de Vancouver 2022.

Préparez-vous à voter

- 1. Planifiez votre vote.** Utilisez l'outil Planifiez votre vote pour créer un plan de vote, accessible à l'adresse vancouver.ca/plan-your-vote ou utilisez la feuille de travail à la fin de cette brochure. L'outil vous aidera à choisir les candidats pour lesquels vous voterez, n'oubliez pas vos réponses aux questions sur les emprunts dans le cadre du plan d'investissement et choisissez le jour et l'endroit qui vous conviennent pour voter.
- 2. Prenez note de vos candidats préférés et de leurs numéros sur le bulletin de vote** et marquez correctement votre bulletin de vote.
- 3. Prévoyez suffisamment de temps pour voter.** Choisissez la meilleure option de vote pour vous : votez par anticipation pour réduire le temps d'attente, votez par la poste (port de retour gratuit) pour plus de commodité ou votez le jour du scrutin le samedi 15 octobre.

Guide de l'électeur de Vancouver

Ce guide contient des renseignements qui vous aideront à vous préparer aux élections municipales de Vancouver 2022 pour la ville de Vancouver, le Vancouver Park Board et le Vancouver School Board.

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Pourquoi voter?



Le samedi 15 octobre 2022, les électeurs de Vancouver voteront pour élire :

- 1 maire
- 10 conseillers municipaux
- 7 commissaires au Vancouver Park Board
- 9 conseillers scolaires

Nos élus prennent des décisions importantes qui ont une incidence directe sur notre vie quotidienne.

Aussi sur le bulletin de vote

Les électeurs devront également indiquer sur leur bulletin de vote s'ils sont favorables à ce que la Ville emprunte de l'argent pour trois domaines de grands projets d'investissement, comme l'indique le plan d'investissement 2023-2026. Pour qui voterez-vous?

Maire et conseillers

Le conseil municipal de Vancouver se compose d'un maire et de dix conseillers. Il approuve le budget de fonctionnement annuel de la Ville (1,747 milliard de dollars en 2022). Le budget sert à financer les services municipaux, comme :

- les services d'urgence (y compris les pompiers et la police)
- les bibliothèques
- la collecte des ordures et le recyclage
- les services d'aqueduc et d'égouts
- les arts, la culture et les théâtres municipaux
- les routes, les trottoirs et l'éclairage public

Le conseil prend des décisions sur :

- les politiques et les priorités pour Vancouver
- les plans à long terme pour Vancouver et ses différents arrondissements
- les décrets relatifs aux entreprises, à la construction, au bruit et à l'aménagement du territoire
- les projets de développement
- le taux annuel de la taxe foncière

Le conseil décide également du budget d'investissement (2,8 milliards de dollars de 2019 à 2022) pour :

- le logement et les services de garde d'enfants
- l'eau, les égouts et les infrastructures vertes
- les parcs, la culture et les installations communautaires
- les transports et les routes
- les priorités émergentes



Commissaires du Vancouver Park Board

Le Vancouver Park Board se compose de sept commissaires.

Le Park Board gère :

- plus de 240 parcs, dont le parc Stanley
- 24 centres communautaires avec piscines, patinoires, centres de conditionnement physique et terrains de jeu
- les arbres de rue
- les marinas publiques
- trois terrains de golf

Conseillers scolaires

Le Vancouver School Board (conseil scolaire no 39) se compose de neuf conseillers scolaires.

Le conseil scolaire offre les services suivants à Vancouver, ainsi que sur le territoire de l'Université de la Colombie-Britannique (UBC) et les University Endowment Lands (UEL) :

- enseignement primaire
- enseignement secondaire
- éducation communautaire
- services de formation spécialisés

Le gouvernement provincial finance les budgets de fonctionnement et d'investissement du conseil scolaire. Les taxes scolaires sont incluses séparément sur le relevé de taxes foncières.



Êtes-vous un électeur admissible à Vancouver?

Pour voter, vous devez remplir toutes les conditions suivantes :

- ☐ avoir 18 ans ou plus le jour du scrutin (15 octobre 2022);
- ☐ être un citoyen canadien;
- ☐ vivre en Colombie-Britannique depuis au moins six mois immédiatement avant le jour de votre inscription;
- ☐ habiter à Vancouver (pas de temps minimum requis);
- ☐ ne pas être visé par une interdiction de voter en vertu de la loi.



Les résidents permanents qui ne détiennent pas encore la citoyenneté canadienne ne peuvent pas voter.


Si vous vivez sur le territoire de l'UBC ou sur les University Endowment Lands (UEL) et que vous ne possédez pas de propriété à Vancouver, vous ne pouvez voter que pour les conseillers scolaires lors des élections municipales de Vancouver. Au lieu de voter pour un maire et des conseillers pour la ville de Vancouver, vous pouvez également voter pour un directeur qui vous représentera aux élections dans la zone électorale A du district régional de Metro Vancouver. Êtes-vous inscrit sur la liste électorale?

Vérifiez si vous êtes inscrit

Si vous avez voté lors des dernières élections provinciales en Colombie-Britannique (octobre 2020) et que vous êtes un résident de Vancouver, vous êtes automatiquement inscrit sur la liste électorale de Vancouver et n'aurez pas besoin de vous réinscrire. Pour savoir si vous êtes inscrit, consultez vancouver.ca/vote ou composez le 3-1-1.



Si vous êtes déjà inscrit sur la liste électorale, vous recevrez une carte d'information de l'électeur que vous pourrez présenter au bureau de vote.

Il y a deux façons de vous inscrire le jour du vote :

Option 1. Fournissez **deux** pièces d'identité :

- votre nom doit être inscrit sur les deux pièces;
- votre adresse doit être indiquée sur au moins une pièce;
- votre signature doit figurer sur au moins une pièce.

Option 2. Fournissez **une** pièce d'identité et **faites une déclaration solennelle** :

Si vous n'avez qu'une seule pièce d'identité, vous pouvez également faire une déclaration solennelle devant la personne responsable du bureau de vote pour confirmer votre identité et votre lieu de résidence.

Si vous n'avez pas d'adresse fixe

Si vous vivez à Vancouver et que vous n'avez pas d'adresse fixe ou d'adresse postale, vous pouvez vous inscrire pour voter en donnant le nom et/ou l'adresse d'un refuge ou d'un organisme de services sociaux que vous fréquentez à Vancouver ou l'adresse de votre bureau de vote.

Si vous êtes étudiant

Si vous êtes étudiant et que vous remplissez toutes les conditions énumérées dans ce guide, vous pouvez vous inscrire pour voter.

Si vous êtes un électeur propriétaire foncier non résident

Pour vous inscrire en tant qu'électeur propriétaire foncier non résident (propriétaire d'une propriété à Vancouver, mais n'y vivant pas), vous devrez fournir des documents supplémentaires au bureau de vote. Consultez vancouver.ca/vote ou composez le 3-1-1 pour de plus amples renseignements.

Carte d'information de l'électeur



Si vous vous êtes inscrit avant le 15 août 2022, vous recevrez une carte d'information de l'électeur à la fin de septembre 2022. Toutes les personnes qui résident à la même adresse et qui ont le même nom de famille recevront leur carte d'information de l'électeur dans une seule enveloppe. Vous n'avez pas besoin de cette carte pour voter, mais vous pourriez accélérer le traitement au bureau de vote avec votre carte.

Comment pouvez-vous voter?

Vous pouvez voter de l'une des façons suivantes :

1. Vote par anticipation

Les 1^{er}, 5, 8, 11 et 13 octobre, vous pouvez voter dans n'importe quel bureau de vote par anticipation de Vancouver, de 8 h à 20 h. Pour obtenir une liste complète des bureaux de vote par anticipation, consultez la page 16.

2. Vote le jour des élections

Le samedi 15 octobre, vous pouvez voter dans n'importe quel bureau de vote de Vancouver, de 8 h à 20 h. Votre carte d'information de l'électeur comprend les bureaux de vote près de chez vous. Pour obtenir une liste complète des bureaux de vote, consultez la page 16.

3. Vote par la poste – port de retour gratuit

Le vote par la poste est maintenant offert à tous les électeurs admissibles. Vous pouvez demander de voter par la poste jusqu'au jeudi 29 septembre à 17 h afin de recevoir votre bulletin de vote par la poste, ce qui vous laisse suffisamment de temps pour le retourner au bureau des élections de Vancouver.

Pour demander un bulletin de vote par la poste, présentez une demande en ligne à **vancouver.ca/vote-by-mail**. Si vous n'avez pas accès à un ordinateur ou si vous avez besoin d'aide, composez le 3-1-1 si vous êtes un électeur inscrit ou rendez-vous au bureau des élections de Vancouver (305 West 8th Avenue) pour présenter votre demande en personne.



Demandez de voter par la poste à partir du mardi 6 septembre à 10 h jusqu'au mardi 11 octobre à 17 h.

Il y a deux façons d'obtenir votre trousse de vote par la poste :

- 1. Recevez votre trousse par la poste :** Vous devez présenter une demande d'ici le jeudi 29 septembre à 17 h. Les troussees seront envoyées par la poste à compter du mardi 27 septembre.
- 2. Ramassez votre trousse :** Vous devez présenter une demande d'ici le mardi 11 octobre à 17 h. Les troussees pourront être ramassées au bureau des élections de Vancouver (305 West 8th Avenue) à compter du mardi 27 septembre à 8 h 30 jusqu'au vendredi 14 octobre à midi. Il faudra deux jours ouvrables après la réception de votre demande pour que votre trousse puisse être ramassée.

Si vous décidez de ramasser votre trousse (ou de désigner une personne pour le faire), veuillez présenter une pièce d'identité avec photo portant votre nom complet et votre signature.



Nous vous recommandons de passer en revue les normes de livraison du courrier et des colis de Postes Canada pour vous aider à planifier le retour de votre bulletin de vote. Les bulletins de vote reçus après 20 h le samedi 15 octobre ne seront pas comptés. Les cachets de la poste ne seront pas considérés comme valides pour le retour des bulletins de vote remplis.

Marquage de votre bulletin de vote en personne



Vous marquerez votre bulletin de vote derrière un isoloir désigné.

1. Sur le bulletin de vote, vous verrez un ovale semblable à celui-ci  à gauche du nom de chaque candidat ou question. En utilisant le stylo spécial fourni, noircissez l'ovale comme suit : .



Pour protéger votre vie privée et garder votre vote secret, veuillez ne pas prendre de photo de votre bulletin de vote et/ou à l'intérieur du bureau de vote.



2. Votez pour les candidats que vous voulez :

- un maximum d'un (1) maire
- un maximum de dix (10) conseillers municipaux
- un maximum de sept (7) commissaires du Vancouver Park Board
- un maximum de neuf (9) conseillers scolaires

Vous pouvez voter pour un nombre inférieur de candidats à celui indiqué ou égal à celui-ci, mais pas plus.

3. Si vous faites une erreur en marquant votre bulletin de vote, vous pouvez en obtenir un nouveau en informant le fonctionnaire électoral.

4. Une fois que vous aurez terminé de marquer votre bulletin de vote, veuillez le déposer dans la chemise pour garder votre vote secret et l'apporter dans la machine à voter. Le fonctionnaire électoral vous aidera à déposer votre bulletin de vote dans la machine pour le compter après la clôture du scrutin.

Noms dans un ordre aléatoire sur le bulletin de vote

Comme en 2018, les noms sur le bulletin de vote seront dans un ordre aléatoire, et NON par ordre alphabétique. Les noms seront numérotés pour vous aider à vous souvenir de vos candidats préférés et à les trouver. Vote accessible

Accéder au bureau de vote

Les bureaux de vote :

- sont généralement accessibles aux personnes qui utilisent des fauteuils roulants, des scooters électriques, des poussettes et des cannes. Les électeurs qui ne peuvent pas entrer dans un bureau de vote peuvent voter à l'extérieur du bâtiment (sur le trottoir ou à l'endroit désigné dans le parc de stationnement).
- ont, pour la plupart, des toilettes universelles à l'intérieur ou à proximité.
- disposent de chaises pour les électeurs.
- ont une file prioritaire pour les personnes suivantes (sans justification nécessaire) :
 - les adultes âgés
 - les personnes handicapées
 - les personnes immunodéprimées
 - les personnes enceintes
 - les personnes qui ont des enfants avec elles
 - les personnes qui nécessitent un environnement soumis à peu de stimulation (par exemple, en raison de problèmes de santé mentale, d'anxiété, de troubles du développement et de troubles cognitifs)



Façons de voter

Les électeurs admissibles peuvent voter des façons suivantes :

1. Vote par la poste

Cette option vous permettra de voter chez vous. Veuillez consulter les renseignements sur le vote par la poste à la page 8.

2. Vote sur le trottoir d'un bureau de vote les jours de vote par anticipation (les 1^{er}, 5, 8, 11 et 13 octobre) ou le jour du scrutin (15 octobre)

Lorsque vous arrivez à un bureau de vote, stationnez votre véhicule à l'emplacement de vote sur le trottoir désigné et appelez le bureau des élections de Vancouver au 604-829-2010. À ce moment-là, un fonctionnaire électoral viendra à l'extérieur pour vous aider à voter. Veuillez consulter vancouver.ca/vote pour vérifier les options d'accessibilité pour chaque bureau de vote et quels bureaux de vote offrent le vote sur le trottoir.

3. Utiliser un dispositif d'assistance servant à marquer le bulletin de vote lors du vote par anticipation

Si vous avez besoin d'aide pour marquer votre bulletin de vote et que vous souhaitez utiliser un dispositif d'assistance servant à marquer le bulletin de vote, veuillez vous rendre au centre communautaire Roundhouse (181 Roundhouse Mews) ou au centre communautaire Trout Lake (3360 Victoria Drive) les jours de vote par anticipation (les 1^{er}, 5, 8, 11 et 13 octobre).

Le dispositif pourra vous aider à marquer votre bulletin de vote avec :

- un contacteur au souffle, des manettes à bascule et d'autres dispositifs d'accessibilité;
- des instructions audio et des inscriptions en braille sur les manettes et les boutons;
- des gros caractères ou un contraste élevé des couleurs.

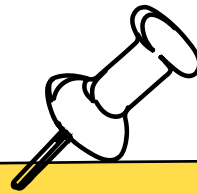
Des instructions sur la façon d'utiliser le dispositif seront offertes sur place, y compris en braille.

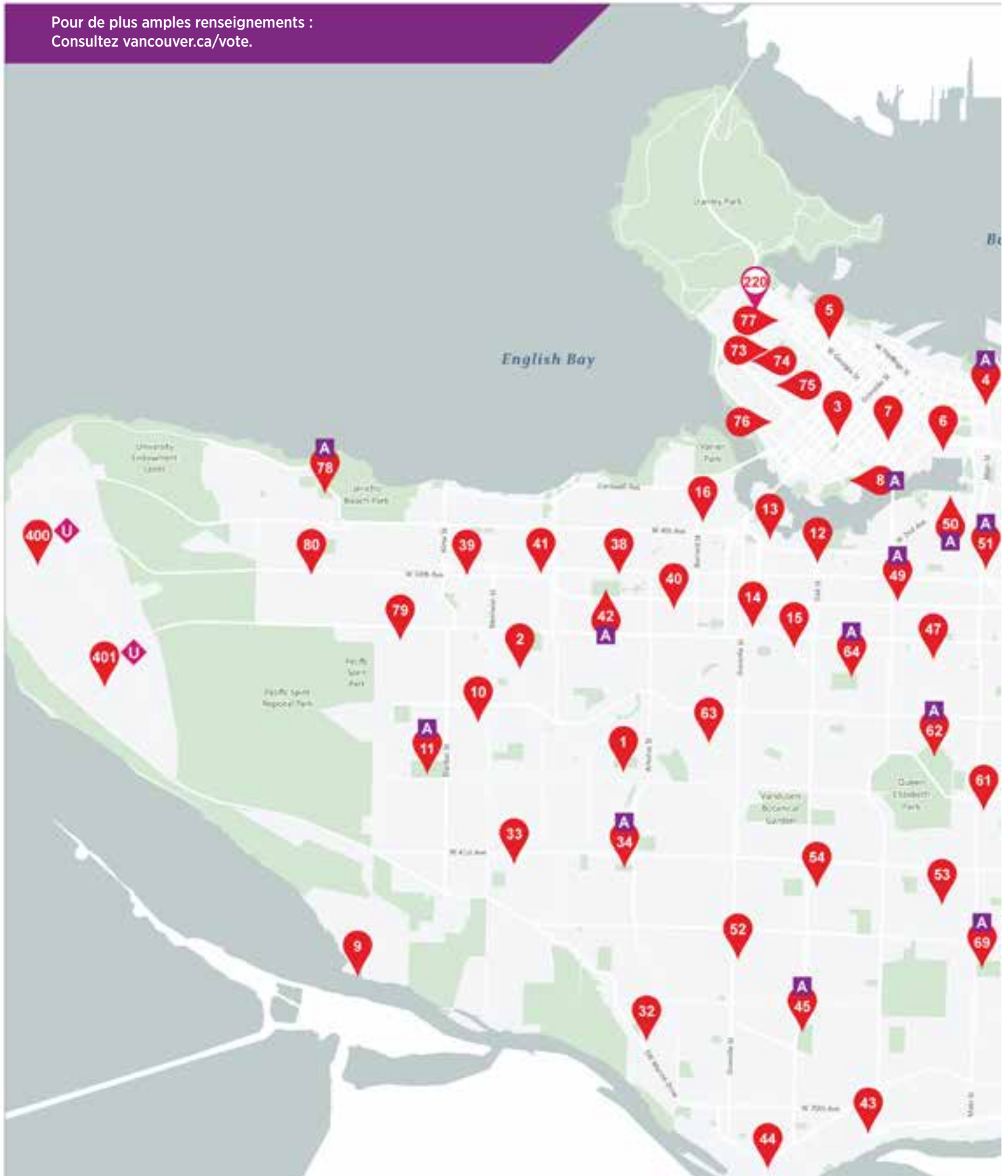
Vous pouvez choisir :

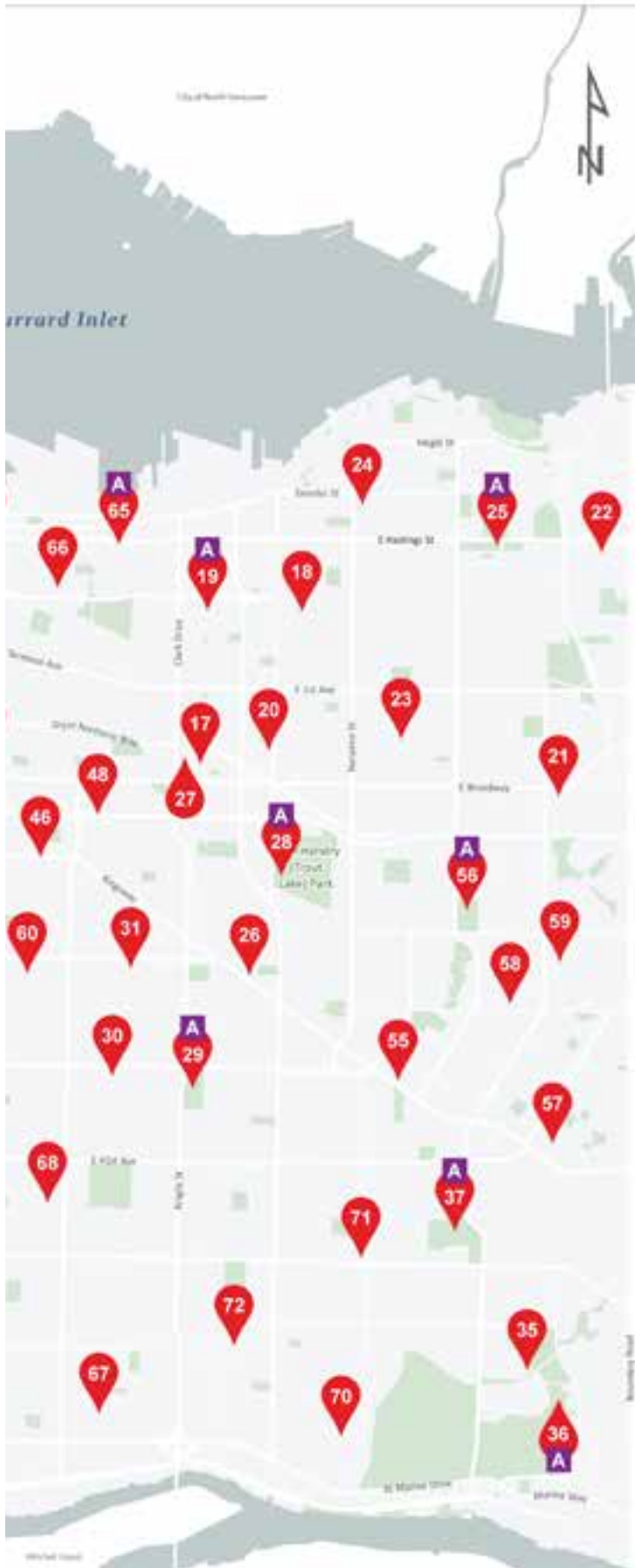

Un plan d'investissement est un plan d'investissement quadriennal pour les commodités et les infrastructures de la Ville, notamment

- les parcs et les digues;
- les rues et les trottoirs;
- les conduites d'eau et d'égout;
- les installations communautaires comme les garderies, les centres de loisirs et les bibliothèques;
- le logement abordable (en partenariat avec les gouvernements provinciaux et fédéral);
- les installations municipales comme les cours de services et les installations de sécurité publique comme les casernes de pompiers;
- et plus encore.
