누구를 뽑는 건가요?

시장과 시 의원

밴쿠버 시 의회에는 1명의 시장과 10명의 시 의원이 있습니다. 시 의회는 시의 연간 운영 예산(2022년: 17억 4천7백만 달러)을 승인합니다. 이 예산은 시에서 제공하는 다음 서비스에 쓰입니다.

밴쿠버의 투표자이신가요?

투표하려면 다음 자격을 모두 충족하여야 합니다.

- □ 선거일(2022년 10월 15일)에 만 18세 이상
- □ 캐나다 시민권자
- □ 등록일 직전까지 최소한 6개월간 BC주에 거주
- □ 현재 밴쿠버에 거주(최소 거주 일수 없음)
- □ 법으로 투표 자격을 상실하지 않음

아직 캐나다 시민권자가 되지 않은 영주권자는 투표할 수 없습니다.



UBC 또는 대학 기부 토지(UEL)에 살며 밴쿠버에 소유 주택이 없는 사람은 밴쿠버 선거에서 교육 위원에게만 투표할 수 있습니다. 밴쿠버시의 시장과 시 의원에게 투표하는 대신 메트로 밴쿠버 지역구(MVRD)의 A 선거 구역 선거에서 자신을 대표하는 디렉터에게 투표할 자격도 있습니다. 자세히 알아보기: metrovancouver.org.

투표자 등록을 하셨나요?

등록 여부 확인

지난 BC주 선거(2020년 10월)에서 투표했고 밴쿠버 거주자인 사람은 밴쿠버의 선거인 명부에 자동으로 등록되며 다시 등록하지 않아도 됩니다. 등록 여부 확인: 웹 사이트 vancouver.ca/vote 또는 전화 3-1-1.



선거인 명부에 이미 등록되어 있으면 투표자 정보 카드를 받으며, 이를 투표소에서 보여주면 됩니다.

투표 시 등록 방법은 다음 두 가지입니다.

옵션 2. 한 가지 신분증(ID) 제시 및 **엄숙 선언**

ID 가 하나만 있으면 투표소 담당자 앞에서 엄숙히 선언하여도 본인의 신원과 거주지를 확인할 수 있습니다.

정해진 주소가 없는 경우

밴쿠버에 사는데 정해진 주소나 우편 주소가 없다면 자신이 밴쿠버에서 가는 쉼터나 사회 복지 기관의 이름 및/또는 주소 또는 해당 투표소의 주소를 제시하여 투표자 등록을 할 수 있습니다.

학생인 경우

학생이면서 이 안내서에 나와 있는 자격을 모두 충족하면 투표자 등록을 할 수 있습니다.

비거주자 주택 소유 선거인인 경우

비거주자 주택 소유 선거인(밴쿠버에 주택을 소유하고 있으나 밴쿠버에 거주하지 않는 선거인)으로 등록하려면 투표소에서 추가 서류를 제공하여야 합니다. 자세한 사항은 vancouver.ca/vote를 보거나 전화 3-1-1로 문의하세요.

투표자 정보 카드

2022년 8월 15일까지 미리 등록한 사람은 2022년 9월 말에 투표자 정보 카드를 받습니다. 한 주소지에 사는 성이 같은 사람들의 투표자 정보 카드는 하나의 봉투에 모두 담겨 우송됩니다. 투표자 정보 카드가 있어야 투표하는 것은 아니지만, 이 카드가 있으면 투표소에서 처리 시간이 더 빨라질 수 있습니다.

2. 본 투표일 투표

10월 15일 토요일 오전 8시에서 오후 8시 사이에 밴쿠버의 어느투표소에서든 투표할 수 있습니다. 투표자 정보 카드에는 가까운투표소가 기재되어 있습니다. 전체 투표소 목록은 16 페이지를보세요.

3. 우편 투표 - 반송 요금 무료

이제 유자격 투표자는 누구나 우편 투표를 할 수 있습니다. 우편 투표는 9월 29일 목요일 오후 5시까지 신청하여야 투표용지를 우편으로 받아 밴쿠버 선거 사무소로 다시 우송할 시간 여유가 있습니다.

우편 투표 신청은 vancouver.ca/vote-by-mail에서 온라인으로 하세요. 컴퓨터가 없거나 도움이 필요하시면 등록된 투표자는 3-1-1로 연락하거나 밴쿠버 선거 사무소(305 West 8th Avenue)를 방문하여 직접 신청하세요.



우편 투표 신청은 9월 6일 화요일 오전 10시부터 10월 11일 화요일 오후 5시까지입니다.

우편 투표 패키지를 받는 방법은 두 가지입니다.

- 1. 패키지 우편 수령: 반드시 9월 29일 목요일 오후 5시까지 신청하셔야 합니다. 패키지는 9월 27일 화요일부터 우편으로 발송됩니다.
- 2. 패키지 직접 수령: 반드시 10월 11일 화요일 오후 5시까지 신청하셔야 합니다. 패키지는 9월 27일 화요일 오전 8:30부터 10월 14일 금요일 정오까지 밴쿠버 선거 사무소(305 West 8th Avenue)에서 받아갈 수 있습니다. 패키지 신청 접수 후 직접 수령까지 평일기준으로 2일이 걸립니다.

본인이 패키지를 직접 수령하는 경우 (또는 지정된 사람이 대신 수령하는 경우) 본인(이나 대리인)의 이름, 서명, 사진이 있는 ID를 지참하시기 바랍니다.

COVID-19 대유행병 기간 중 안전하게 투표하세요

모든 현행 BC 주 정부 보건 책임관의 명령을 따릅니다.
