Las elecciones en Vancouver 2022 se llevarán a cabo en los territorios ancestrales y no cedidos de los pueblos de habla hən'q'əmin'əm' y Skwxwú7mesh: los pueblos x<sup>w</sup>məθk<sup>w</sup>əy'əm (Nación Musqueam), Skwxwú7mesh (Nación Squamish) y səlilwəta<del>1</del> (Nación Tsleil-Waututh). Ellos han administrado y custodiado estas tierras desde tiempos inmemoriales.

Votar es una oportunidad para demostrar que se preocupa por usted mismo, por sus seres queridos y por su comunidad. Es una oportunidad para que todos rindamos cuentas sobre el pasado, el presente y el futuro de Vancouver. Su tiempo y energía son muy valiosos – le agradecemos su generosidad al participar en las elecciones de Vancouver 2022.

## Prepárese para votar.

- **1. Planee su voto.** Use la herramienta Plan Your Vote para crear un plan de votación, disponible en vancouver.ca/ plan-your-vote, o use la hoja de trabajo que está en la parte de atrás de este cuadernillo. La herramienta le ayudará a elegir los candidatos por los que votará, a recordar sus respuestas a las preguntas sobre préstamos para los planes de infraestructura (*Capital Plan*) y a elegir el día y el lugar que le sea conveniente para votar.
- **2. Tome nota de sus candidatos preferidos** y sus números en la boleta electoral, y marque su boleta correctamente.
- **3. Deje tiempo suficiente para votar.** Seleccione la mejor opción de voto para usted: Vote con anticipación para que sus tiempos de espera sean más cortos, vote por correo (porte de devolución gratuito) si desea más conveniencia o vote el día de las elecciones el sábado 15 de octubre.

## Guía para el Elector de Vancouver

Esta guía contiene información que le ayudará a prepararse para las elecciones de Vancouver de 2022 y elegir candidatos para la ciudad de Vancouver (*City of Vancouver*), la Junta Directiva de Parques de Vancouver (*Vancouver Park Board*) y el Consejo Escolar de Vancouver (*Vancouver School Board*).

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# ¿Para qué votar?

El sábado 15 de octubre de 2022, los electores de Vancouver emitirán su voto para elegir:

- 1 alcalde
- 10 concejales
- 7 comisionados de la Junta Directiva de Parques
- 9 síndicos del Consejo Escolar

Nuestros funcionarios electorales toman decisiones importantes que afectan directamente nuestra vida cotidiana.

#### También en la boleta electoral

Se preguntará a los electores si apoyan que el gobierno solicite un préstamo para tres áreas de proyectos importantes de infraestructura, descritos en los planes de infraestructura (*Capital Plan*) para el período 2023-2026. ### ¿A quiénes va a elegir con su voto?

#### Alcalde y concejales

El ayuntamiento de la ciudad de Vancouver (*Vancouver City Council*) incluye a 1 alcalde y a 10 concejales. El ayuntamiento de la ciudad aprueba el presupuesto anual de operación de la ciudad (1747 millones de dólares en 2022). El presupuesto financia los servicios que proporciona la ciudad, incluyendo:

- Servicios de emergencia (incluyendo bomberos y policía)
- Bibliotecas
- Recolección de basura y reciclado
- Servicios de agua y drenaje
- Arte, cultura y teatros públicos
- Calles, banquetas (aceras) y alumbrado público

El ayuntamiento toma decisiones que incluyen:

- Políticas y prioridades para Vancouver
- Planes a largo plazo para Vancouver y sus distintas comunidades
- Reglamentos administrativos locales que afectan a los negocios, la construcción, el ruido y el uso del terreno
- Proyectos de desarrollo
- Tasa anual del impuesto a la propiedad

El ayuntamiento también toma decisiones sobre el presupuesto de capital (*Capital Budget*, de 2800 millones de dólares durante el período 2019-2022), incluyendo:

- Vivienda y cuidado infantil
- Agua, drenaje e infraestructura ecológica
- Parques, cultura e instalaciones comunitarias
- Transporte y calles
- Prioridades emergentes





#### Comisionados de la Junta Directiva de Parques

La Junta Directiva de Parques de Vancouver incluye a 7 comisionados.

La Junta Directiva de Parques opera:

- Más de 240 parques incluyendo a Stanley Park
- 24 centros comunitarios con piscinas, pistas de patinaje, centros de acondicionamiento físico y canchas deportivas
- Árboles en las calles
- Embarcaderos públicos
- Tres campos de golf

#### Síndicos del Consejo Escolar

El Consejo Escolar de Vancouver (*Vancouver School Board*, distrito escolar No. 39) incluye a 9 síndicos escolares.

El Consejo Escolar ofrece los siguientes servicios en Vancouver, en los terrenos de la Universidad de Columbia Británica (*UBC Lands*) y en las tierras de dotación de la Universidad (*University Endowment Lands*, UEL):

- Educación primaria
- Educación secundaria/bachillerato
- Educación comunitaria
- Servicios de educación especializada

El gobierno de la provincia provee los fondos para los presupuestos de operación y capital del Consejo Escolar. Los impuestos escolares se incluyen por separado en los impuestos a la propiedad.

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# ¿Es usted elector de Vancouver?

#### Para poder votar, debe cumplir con todos los siguientes requisitos:

Tener al menos 18 años de edad cumplidos al día de las elecciones (15 de octubre de 2022)

- Tener la ciudadanía canadiense
- □ Haber vivido en B.C. durante un mínimo de seis meses inmediatamente antes del día que se registre
- □ Vivir en Vancouver (no se requiere un mínimo de días)
- □ No haber sido descalificado por ley para votar

#### Los residentes permanentes que todavía no tienen su ciudadanía canadiense no pueden votar.

Si usted vive en UBC o en las tierras de dotación de la Universidad (*University Endowment Lands*, UEL) y no posee una propiedad en Vancouver, solo podrá votar por síndicos escolares en las elecciones de Vancouver. En vez de votar por un alcalde y concejales para el gobierno de la ciudad de Vancouver, también tiene derecho a elegir a un director que le represente en las elecciones del área electoral A del distrito regional del área metropolitana de Vancouver (*Metro Vancouver Regional District Electoral Area A*). ## ¿Está usted registrado para votar?

#### Verifique si está registrado

Si emitió su voto en las últimas elecciones provinciales en B.C. (octubre de 2020) y reside en Vancouver, automáticamente estará en la lista de electores y no necesitará registrarse otra vez. Para saber si está registrado, consulte en vancouver.ca/vote o llame al 3-1-1.

## Si ya está en la lista de electores, recibirá su tarjeta de información del elector (*voter information card*), que podrá mostrar en la casilla electoral que le corresponda.

Hay dos formas de registrarse al momento de votar:

**Opción 1.** Proporcione **dos** documentos de identificación (ID):

- Ambos documentos deben mostrar su nombre
- Al menos uno de los documentos debe mostrar su dirección
- Al menos uno de los documentos debe incluir su firma

#### Ejemplos de documentos de identificación aceptables

- Tarjeta de afiliación a una banda indígena canadiense (*Band membership card*) y/o certificado de estatus indígena canadiense (*Certificate of Indian Status*)
- Tarjeta del servicio médico de B.C. (*BC CareCard*)
- Licencia de conducir de B.C.
- Tarjeta de identificación de B.C. (BCID)
- Licencia de conducir combinada con la cédula del servicio médico (*BC Services Card*)
- Cédula de ciudadanía canadiense
   (*Canadian Citizenship Card*)

- Pasaporte canadiense
- Tarjeta de débito o crédito
- Cheque o talón de cheque del gobierno
- Tarjeta de identificación del programa de seguro de vejez (Old Age Security Identification Card)
- Recipientes de medicamentos de receta médica
- Determinación y/o notificación del impuesto predial
- Tarjeta del número de seguro social (Social Insurance Number Card)
- Tarjeta de estudiante
- Recibo de servicios



## **Opción 2.** Proporcione **un** documento de identificación (ID) y **haga una declaración solemne:**

Si solo tiene un documento de identificación, también puede hacer una declaración solemne frente a la persona encargada de la casilla electoral para confirmar su identidad y el lugar donde vive.

#### Si no tiene dirección fija

Si vive en Vancouver y no tiene dirección fija o dirección postal, puede registrarse para votar proporcionando el nombre y/o la dirección del albergue o de la institución de ayuda social a la que usted acude en Vancouver, o la dirección de su casilla electoral.

#### Si es estudiante


Si usted es estudiante y cumple con todos los requisitos enumerados en esta guía, puede registrarse para votar.

#### Si es Elector Propietario No Residente

Para registrarse como Elector Propietario No Residente (tiene una propiedad en Vancouver, pero no vive en Vancouver), tendrá que proporcionar documentos adicionales en la casilla electoral. Para más información, visite vancouver.ca/vote o llame al 3-1-1.

#### Tarjeta de información del elector

Si se registró con anticipación antes del 15 de agosto de 2022, recibirá una tarjeta de información del elector (*voter information card*) a finales de septiembre de 2022. A todas las personas que tengan la misma dirección y el mismo apellido se les enviarán sus tarjetas de información del elector en un solo sobre. No necesita tener una tarjeta de información del elector para poder votar, pero si la lleva, el tiempo de procesamiento podría ser menor en la casilla electoral.



¿Cómo puede votar?

#### Puede elegir una de las siguientes formas para emitir su voto:

#### 1. Votar por anticipado

Los días 1, 5, 8, 11 y 13 de octubre podrá votar en cualquier casilla de votación anticipada (*advance voting*) en Vancouver entre las 8:00 a.m. y las 8:00 p.m. Para consultar una lista completa de las casillas de votación anticipada, vea la página 16.

#### 2. Votar el día de las elecciones

El sábado 15 de octubre, podrá votar en cualquier casilla electoral en Vancouver entre las 8:00 a.m. y las 8:00 p.m. Su tarjeta de información del elector incluye las casillas electorales cercanas a usted. Para consultar una lista completa de las casillas de votación, vea la página 16.

#### 3. Votar por correo - porte de devolución gratuito

Ahora, todos los electores inscritos podrán votar por correo. Podrá solicitar votar por correo hasta el jueves 29 de septiembre a las 5 p.m. para poder recibir su boleta electoral por correo, y tener tiempo suficiente para devolverla por correo a la Oficina Electoral de Vancouver (*Vancouver Election Office*).

Para emitir su voto por correo, solicite su boleta en línea en **vancouver.ca/vote-by-mail**. Si no tiene acceso a una computadora o si necesita ayuda, llame al 3-1-1 si es un elector registrado, o visite la Oficina Electoral de Vancouver (305 West 8th Avenue) para solicitarla en persona.



## Solicite votar por correo desde el martes 6 de septiembre a las 10:00 a.m. hasta el martes 11 de octubre a las 5:00 p.m.

Hay dos formas de obtener su paquete para votar por correo:

- **1. Reciba su paquete por correo:** Haga su solicitud antes del jueves 29 de septiembre a las 5:00 p.m. Los paquetes se empezarán a enviar por correo a partir del martes 27 de septiembre.
- 2. Recoja su paquete: Solicítelo antes del martes 11 de octubre a las 5:00 p.m. Podrá recoger su paquete en la Oficina Electoral de Vancouver (305 West 8th Avenue) desde el martes 27 de septiembre a las 8:30 a.m. hasta el viernes 14 de octubre al mediodía. Podrá recoger su paquete dos días hábiles después de que hayamos recibido su solicitud.

Si decide recoger su paquete (o designar a una persona para que lo recoja), lleve una identificación con foto que incluya su nombre completo y su firma (o de la persona que haya designado para recoger el paquete).

Le recomendamos que revise los estándares de tiempos de entrega de correo y paquetes de Canada Post para que pueda planear la devolución de su boleta. Las boletas recibidas después de las 8:00 p.m. del sábado 15 de octubre no serán contabilizadas. Los sellos de correo (matasellos) no serán considerados válidos para devolver las boletas completadas.

#### Marcar su boleta electoral en persona

Usted marcará su boleta detrás de una mampara específica de privacidad.

1. En la boleta, verá un óvalo similar a este  $\bigcirc$  a la izquierda del nombre de cada candidato o pregunta. Use la pluma especial que le dieron para rellenar el óvalo, así:

Para proteger su privacidad y para mantener su voto secreto, por favor no tome ninguna foto de su boleta electoral ni del interior de la casilla electoral.



- 2. Vote por los candidatos que quiera:
  - Hasta 1 alcalde
  - Hasta 10 concejales
  - Hasta 7 comisionados de la Junta Directiva de Parques
  - Hasta 9 síndicos del Consejo Escolar

Puede votar por un número menor o igual al número de candidatos indicado, pero no puede elegir más.

- 3. Si comete un error al marcar su boleta, podrán darle una nueva boleta si le avisa al funcionario electoral.
- 4. Al terminar de marcar su boleta, por favor póngala dentro del fólder para mantener su voto secreto y llévela a la máquina de votación. El funcionario electoral le ayudará a meter la boleta dentro de la máquina para el conteo que se hace al terminar la votación.

#### Nombres en orden aleatorio en la boleta electoral

Al igual que en el 2018, los nombres en la boleta estarán en orden aleatorio, NO en orden alfabético. Los nombres tendrán números en orden junto a ellos para ayudarle a recordar y encontrar a sus candidatos preferidos. ## **Voto accesible**

#### Acceso a la casilla electoral

Casillas electorales:

- Suelen ser accesibles para las personas que usan sillas de ruedas, sillas motorizadas (*scooters*) para ayudar con la movilidad, cochecitos de bebé (carriolas) y bastones. Los electores que no puedan entrar a la casilla electoral podrán votar afuera del edificio (en la acera o en un lugar designado en el estacionamiento).
- La mayoría tienen baños universales dentro o cerca de las instalaciones
- Cuentan con sillas
- Ofrecen una fila para dar prioridad a las siguientes personas sin hacer preguntas
  - adultos mayores,
  - personas con discapacidades,
  - personas inmunocomprometidas,
  - personas embarazadas,
  - personas que vienen acompañadas por niños, o
  - personas que necesitan un ambiente con bajos niveles de estimulación (por ejemplo, por motivos de salud mental, ansiedad, discapacidades cognitivas y de desarrollo)

## Formas de votar

Las siguientes opciones están disponibles para los electores inscritos que las necesiten:

#### 1. Vote por correo.

Esta opción le permitirá votar desde casa. Por favor consulte la información para emitir su voto por correo en la página 8.

2. Vote en la acera afuera de la casilla electoral cualquiera de los días de votación anticipada (1, 5, 8, 11, 13 de octubre) o el día de las elecciones (15 de octubre).

Cuando llegue a una casilla electoral, estaciónese en uno de los lugares designados para votar en la acera (*curbside voting*) y llame a la Oficina Electoral de Vancouver al 604-829-2010. En ese momento, un funcionario electoral saldrá para ayudarle a votar. Por favor visite la página vancouver.ca/vote para conocer las opciones de accesibilidad de cada casilla electoral y para saber cuáles ofrecen el servicio de *curbside voting*.

#### 3. Uso de dispositivo de asistencia para marcar la boleta durante el período de votación anticipada.

Si necesita ayuda para marcar su boleta y quiere usar un dispositivo de asistencia para marcarla, por favor acuda a Roundhouse Community Centre (181 Roundhouse Mews) o Trout Lake Community Centre (3360 Victoria Drive) durante los días de votación anticipada (1, 5, 8, 11, 13 de octubre).

El dispositivo puede ayudarle a marcar su boleta con:

- Dispositivos de accesibilidad de inhalación y exhalación (*sip-and-puff*), de pedales (*paddle*), etc.
- Instrucciones de audio y en Braille en los pedales y botones
- Letra grande o en colores de alto contraste

Habrá instrucciones sobre cómo usar el dispositivo en el lugar, incluyendo en Braille.

Habrá lenguaje de señas norteamericanas (ASL) por videochat en los días de votación anticipada.

#### 4. Pídale a una persona conocida que le acompañe a la casilla electoral para que le ayude, o pida ayuda a algún funcionario electoral en cualquiera de los días de votación anticipada o el día de las elecciones.


Tendrá las siguientes opciones:



## Plan de Infraestructura 2023-2026

El Plan de Infraestructura (*Capital Plan*) consiste en un plan de inversión a cuatro años para las instalaciones e infraestructura de la ciudad, e incluye:

- Parques y el dique (seawall);
- Calles y banquetas (aceras);
- Tuberías de agua y drenaje;
- Instalaciones comunitarias para el cuidado infantil, centros recreativos y bibliotecas, entre otras;
- Vivienda de bajo costo (en alianza con el gobierno provincial y el federal);
- Instalaciones municipales, como astilleros para el mantenimiento de vehículos marinos, e instalaciones para la seguridad pública, como estaciones de bomberos;
- Y más.

La inversión en instalaciones e infraestructura ayuda a que Vancouver funcione sin problemas y contribuye a nuestra calidad de vida: cómo nos movemos, cómo disfrutamos de los espacios públicos, cómo mantenemos nuestra seguridad, cómo mitigamos los impactos del cambio climático y nos adaptamos a él y cómo recibimos agua limpia y otros servicios básicos.

Gran parte del Plan de Infraestructura se centra en las obras fundamentales y necesarias de mantenimiento y renovación de las instalaciones e infraestructura existentes en Vancouver para conservarlos en buen estado. El Plan de Infraestructura también incluye financiamiento para fomentar la labor de mitigación y adaptación al clima, y reserva fondos para aprovechar las alianzas con niveles altos del gobierno. El resto del Plan de Infraestructura se destina a inversiones en instalaciones e infraestructura nuevas y ampliadas para ayudar a servir a nuestra creciente población y economía. El Plan de Infraestructura 2023-2026 consta de 3500 millones de dólares de inversión en instalaciones e infraestructura. El Plan de Infraestructura fue aprobado por el ayuntamiento de la ciudad en junio de 2022, tras una ronda de participación pública en la que intervinieron cerca de 4000 ciudadanos.

El financiamiento del Plan de Infraestructura procede de diversas fuentes, incluyendo los impuestos sobre la propiedad (predial), las tarifas de los servicios públicos, las contribuciones de desarrollo y las aportaciones de organismos asociados. Al considerar su capacidad de endeudamiento y para mantener su calificación crediticia AAA, la estrategia financiera del gobierno de la ciudad equilibra el uso de reservas de capital, el pago por uso y el financiamiento de la deuda. 
