Isasagawa ang 2022 Eleksyon sa Vancouver sa unceded (hindi isinuko) at minanang lupain ng mga nagsasalita ng hən'q'əmin'əm' at Skwxwú7mesh; ang x^wməθk^wəy'əm (Musqueam), Skwxwú7mesh (Squamish), at səlilwəta\ (Tsleil-Waututh) Nations). Pinangalagaan nila ang mga lupaing ito mula pa noong unang panahon.

Ang pagboto ay isang oportunidad para maipakita mo na minamahalaga mo ang iyong sarili, ang iyong mga minamahal sa buhay, at ang iyong komunidad. Ito'y pagkakataon para tayong lahat ay magkaroon ng pananagutan para sa nakaraan, sa kasalukuyan, at sa hinaharap na panahon ng Vancouver. Mahalaga ang iyong panahon at enerhiya, kaya't maraming salamat sa iyong kagandahang-loob na lumahok sa 2022 Eleksyon sa Vancouver.

Maghanda nang bumoto.

- **1. Planuhin ang iyong pagboto.** Gamitin ang iyong Plan Your Vote tool upang gumawa ng plano sa pagboto; ito'y available sa vancouver.ca/plan-your-vote o kaya'y gamitin ang worksheet sa likod ng booklet na ito. Tutulungan ka ng tool na pumili ng mga kandidatong iboboto mo, tandaan ang iyong mga sagot sa mga tanong sa Capital Plan borrowing, at pumili ng araw at lugar na mainam para sa pagboto.
- **2. Tandaan ang iyong mga gustong ibotong kandidato** at ang kanilang mga numero sa balota, at markahan nang tama ang iyong balota.
- **3. Maglaan ng sapat na panahon upang bumoto.** Piliin ang pinakamahusay na opsyon para ikaw ay makaboto: Bumoto nang advance para sa mas maikling panahon ng paghihintay, bumoto sa mail (libre ang return postage) para mas madali itong gawin, o kaya'y bumoto sa Araw ng Eleksyon sa Sabado, Oktubre 15.

Sa Sabado, Oktubre 15, 2022, ang mga botante sa Vancouver ay boboto para sa:

- 1 Mayor
- 10 City Councillors
- 7 Park Board Commissioners
- 9 School Trustees

Ang ating mga ibobotong opisyal ang siyang gagawa ng mga mahahalagang desisyon na tuwirang nakakaapekto sa ating mga pangaraw-araw na buhay.

Ano pa ang nasa balota

Ang mga botante ay tatanungin kung sinusuportahan nila ang paghiram ng Lungsod ng pera para sa tatlong malalaking capital projects, tulad ng nakabalangkas sa 2023-2026 Capital Plan. May karagdagang impormasyon tungkol dito sa pahina 22 o sa vancouver.ca/capital-plan.



Para kanino ka boboto?

Mayor at Councillors

Kabilang sa Vancouver City Council ang 1 Mayor at 10 Councillors. Inaaprubahan ng City Council ang taunang operating budget ng Lungsod (\$1.747 bilyon sa 2022). Ang budget ang nagpopondo sa mga serbisyo ng Lungsod; kabilang dito ang:

- Emergency services (kabilang ang sunog at pulis)
- Mga library
- Pangongolekta ng basura at recycling
- Water at sewer services
- Arts, culture, at civic theatres
- Mga daan, mga sidewalk, at mga ilaw sa daan

Ang Council ay gumagawa ng mga desisyon; kabilang dito ang:

- Mga patakaran at mga priyoridad para sa Vancouver
- Mga pangmatagalang plano para sa Vancouver at sa iba't-ibang mga komunidad nito
- By-laws na umaapekto sa mga negosyo, building, ingay, at paggamit ng lupa
- Development projects
- Property tax rate bawat taon

Ang Council ay nagpapasiya rin sa Capital Budget (\$2.8 bilyon 2019-2022), kabilang ang:

- Housing at childcare
- Water, sewer, at green infrastructure
- Mga parke, mga pasilidad para sa kultura at sa komunidad
- Transportasyon at mga daan
- Mga nagiging priyoridad





Park Board Commissioners

Ang Vancouver Park Board ay may 7 Commissioners.

Ang Park Board ay nagpapalakad ng:

- Mahigit sa 240 parks kabilang ang Stanley Park
- 24 community centres na may pools, rinks, fitness centres, at playing fields
- Mga puno sa kalye
- Public marinas
- Tatlong golf courses

School Board Trustees

Ang Vancouver School Board (School District Blg. 39) ay may 9 na School Trustees.

Ibinabahagi ng School Board ang mga sumusunod na serbisyo sa Vancouver, University of British Columbia (UBC) Lands and University Endowment Lands (UEL):

- Elementaryang edukasyon
- Sekondaryang edukasyon
- Komunidad na edukasyon
- Mga serbisyo sa specialized education

Pinopondohan ng pamahalaan ng province ang operational at capital budget ng School Board. Ang school taxes ay hiwalay na kasama sa property taxes.

Ikaw ba ay isang botante sa Vancouver?

Upang bumoto, dapat ay natutupad mo ang lahat ng mga sumusunod na kwalipikasyon:

- Ikaw ay 18-taong-gulang o mas matanda sa Araw ng Eleksyon (Oktubre 15, 2022)
- □ Ikaw ay isang Canadian citizen
- Ikaw ay dapat kahit anim na buwan man lamang naninirahan sa B.C. sa araw bago ka magrehistro
- Ikaw ay nakatira sa Vancouver (walang minimum days na required)
 Hindi ka disqualified ng batas na bumoto

Ang mga permanent resident na hindi pa naging Canadian citizens ay hindi maaaring bumoto.

Kung ikaw ay nakatira sa UBC o kaya sa University Endowment Lands (UEL) at hindi ka nagmamay-ari ng property sa Vancouver, maaari ka lamang bumoto para sa School Trustees sa eleksyon sa Vancouver. Sa halip na bumoto para sa isang Mayor at Councillors para sa Lungsod ng Vancouver, ikaw ay karapat-dapat din na bumoto para sa isang Director na kakatawan sa iyo sa Metro Vancouver Regional District Electoral Area A Election. Rehistrado ka ba para bumoto?

Alamin kung ikaw ay rehistrado

Kung ikaw ay bumoto sa huling B.C. provincial election (Oktubre 2020) at ikaw ay isang Vancouver resident, ikaw ay awtomatikong nasa listahan ng mga botante sa Vancouver at hindi mo kailangang magrehistro muli. Alamin kung ikaw ay rehistrado: bisitahin ang vancouver.ca/vote o kaya'y tumawag sa 3-1-1.

Kung ikaw ay nasa listahan na ng mga botante, matatanggap mo ang iyong voter information card na siyang maipapakita mo sa iyong lugar ng botohan.

May dalawang paraan upang magrehistro kapag ikaw ay boboto:

Opsyon 1. Magpakita ng **dalawang** identipikasyon (ID):

- Dapat ipakita ng dalawang ID ang iyong pangalan
- Dapat ipakita ng isa man lamang na ID ang iyong address
- Dapat ipakita ng isa man lamang na ID ang iyong pirma

- Utility bill



Kung iisa lamang ang iyong ID, maaari ka rin gumawa ng tapat na pahayag sa harap ng táong namamahala sa lugar ng botohan upang kompirmahin ang iyong identidad at ang iyong tirahan.

Kung wala kang fixed o permanenteng address

Kung nakatira ka sa Vancouver at wala kang fixed address o postal address, maaari kang magrehistro upang bumoto sa pamamagitan ng pagbigay ng pangalan at/o address ng isang shelter o social agency na pinupuntahan mo sa Vancouver, o kaya'y ang address ng iyong lugar ng botohan.

Kung ikaw ay estudyante

Kung ikaw ay estudyante at natutupad mo ang lahat ng mga kwalipikasyon na nakalista sa guide na ito, maaari kang magrehistro upang bumoto.

Kung ikaw ay isang Non-Resident Property Elector


Upang magrehistro bilang isang Non-Resident Property Elector (mayroon kang property sa Vancouver pero hindi ka nakatira sa Vancouver), kailangan mong magpakita ng karagdagang dokumentasyon sa lugar ng botohan. Bisitahin ang vancouver.ca/vote o kaya'y tumawag sa 3-1-1 para sa karagdagang impormasyon.

Voter information card

Kung naghirestro ka nang advance hanggang sa Agosto 15, 2022, makakatanggap ka ng isang voter information card sa bandang katapusan ng Setyembre 2022. Matatanggap ng lahat ng mga táong nasa parehong address at may parehong apelyido ang kanilang voter information cards sa iisang ipapadalang sobre. Hindi mo kailangan ng voter information card upang bumoto, pero maaaring mas mabilis ang proseso sa lugar ng botohan kung mayroon kang card.



Paano ka makakaboto?

Maaari mong piliin ang isa sa mga sumusunod na paraan ng pagboto:

1. Advance na bumoto

Sa Oktubre 1, 5, 8, 11 at 13, maaari kang bumoto sa anumang Vancouver advance voting na lugar sa pagitan ng 8 am at 8 pm. Para sa buong listahan ng mga lugar para sa advance voting, magpunta sa pahina 16.

2. Bumoto sa Araw ng Eleksyon

Sa Sabado, Oktubre 15, maaari kang bumoto sa anumang lugar ng botohan sa Vancouver sa pagitan ng 8 am at 8 pm. Kasama sa iyong voter information card ang mga lugar ng botohan malapit sa iyo. Para sa buong listahan ng mga lugar ng botohan, magpunta sa pahina 16.

3. Ipadala ang iyong boto sa mail – libreng return postage

Ang pagboto sa mail ay available na ngayon sa lahat ng mga eligible na botante. Maaari kang mag-request na bumoto sa mail hanggang sa Huwebes, Setyembre 29, 5 pm, upang matanggap mo ang iyong balota sa mail, para may sapat na panahon upang maipadala mo ito sa mail pabalik sa Vancouver Election Office.

Upang mag-request ng isang mail ballot, mag-apply online sa **vancouver.ca/vote-by-mail**. Kung wala kang access sa isang computer o kung kailangan mo ng tulong, tumawag sa 3-1-1 kung ikaw ay isang rehistradong botante, o kaya'y bisitahin ang Vancouver Election Office (305 West 8th Avenue) upang mag-apply nang personal.



Irequest ang pagboto sa mail simula sa Martes, Setyembre 6, 10 am, hanggang sa Martes, Oktubre 11, 5 pm.

May dalawang paraan kung paano makuha ang iyong vote by mail package:

- **1. Upang matanggap ang iyong package sa mail:** Ang deadline upang mag-apply ay Huwebes, Setyembre 29, 5 pm. Ipapadala ang mga package sa mail simula Martes, Setyembre 27.
- 2. I-pick up ang iyong package: Ang deadline upang mag-apply ay Martes, Oktubre 11, 5 pm. Ang mga package ay handa nang i-pick up sa Vancouver Election Office (305 West 8th Avenue) simula Martes, Setyembre 27, 8:30 am hanggang Biyernes, Oktubre 14, tanghali. Pagkatapos namin matanggap ang iyong aplikasyon para sa iyong package, aabutin nang dalawang araw ng negosyo upang ihanda ito para ma-pickup.

Kung nagpasiya kang i-pick up ang iyong package (o magtakda ng isang taóng magpi-pickup ng iyong package), mangyaring ihanda ang isang photo ID na mayroong iyong buong pangalan at pirma (o buong pangalan at pirma ng designadong tao).

Inirerekomenda namin na rebyuhin mo ang Canada Post mail at parcel delivery time standards upang tulungan kang magplano sa pagpapadala ng iyong balota. Ang mga balotang natanggap pagkatapos ng 8 pm ng Sabado, Oktubre 15, ay hindi isasama sa pagbilang. Ang mga postmark ay hindi ituturing na valid para sa pagsauli ng mga kinompletong balota.

Personal na pagmarka ng iyong balota

Mamarkahan mo ang iyong balota sa likod ng isang designadong privacy screen.

1. Sa balota ay may makikita kang isang oval na katulad ng na ito sa kaliwa ng pangalan ng bawat kandidato o tanong. Gamit ang special pen na inilaan, punan ang oval tulad ng ganito:

> Upang protektahan ang iyong pagka-pribado at panatilihing sikreto ang iyong balota, mangyaring huwag kunan ng retrato ang iyong balota at/o ang loob ng lugar ng botohan.



- 2. Iboto ang mga kandidatong gusto mo:
 - Hanggang sa 1 Mayor
 - Hanggang sa 10 City Councillors
 - Hanggang sa 7 Park Board Commissioners
 - Hanggang sa 9 na School Trustees

Maaari kang bumoto para sa mas kaunting bilang ng mga kandidatong nakapahayag, o hanggang sa bilang na ito, pero hindi ka maaaring bumoto nang mas marami pa dito.

- 3. Kung nagkamali ka sa pagmarka ng iyong balota, sabihin sa election official upang makakakuha ka ng bagong balota.
- 4. Kapag tapos ka nang markahan ang iyong balota, mangyaring ilagay ito sa loob ng folder upang panatilihing sikreto ang iyong boto, at pagkatapos ay dalhin ito sa voting machine. Tutulungan ka ng election official na ilagay ang iyong balota sa loob ng machine para mabilang ito pagkatapos magsara ng botohan.

Random o pasumala ang pagkakasunud-sunod ng mga pangalan sa balota

Tulad noong 2018, random o pasumala ang pagkakasunud-sunod ng mga pangalan sa balota; HINDI sila alphabetical. Ang mga pangalan ay may mga sunud-sunod na numero sa tabi nila upang tulungan kang matandaan at mahanap ang iyong mga gustong kandidato. Tingnan ang listahan ng mga kandidato at ang pagkakasunud-sunod ng kanilang mga pangalan sa pahina 27 nito, o kaya'y bisitahin ang vancouver.ca/vote.

Accessible na pagboto

Pag-access sa lugar ng botohan

Ang mga lugar ng botohan:

- Ay karaniwang accessible sa mga táong gumagamit ng mga wheelchair, mobility scooters, strollers, at mga baston. Ang mga botanteng hindi makapasok sa isang lugar ng botohan ay maaaring bumoto sa labas ng building (sa kurba ng kalsada o sa isang designadong lugar sa paradahan).
- Ang karamihan ay may universal washrooms (mga C.R. na magagamit ng lahat) sa loob o malapit sa botohan
- Ay may mga upuan
- Ay may priority line para sa mga sumusunod na tao, at walang anumang mga tanong tungkol dito
 - mga matatanda,
 - mga táong may disability,
 - mga táong immunocompromised,
 - mga babaeng buntis,
 - mga táong may kasamang mga bata, o kaya
 - mga táong nangangailangan ng low stimulation environment (halimbawa, dahil sa kanilang mental health, anxiety, at developmental at cognitive disabilities)

Mga paraan ng pagboto

Ang mga sumusunod na opsyon ay available para sa mga eligible na botanteng nangangailangan nito:

1. Ang pagboto sa mail.

Sa opsyon na ito'y makakaboto ka mula sa iyong tahanan. Mangyaring tingnan ang impormasyon tungkol sa pagboto sa mail sa pahina 8.

2. Bumoto sa curbside ng isang lugar ng botohan sa anumang advance voting days (Oktubre 1, 5, 8, 11, 13) o sa Araw ng Eleksyon (Oktubre 15).

Pagdating mo sa isang lugar ng botohan, pumarada sa isang designadong curbside voting na lugar at tawagan ang Vancouver Election Office sa 604-829-2010. Pagkatapos noon ay may lalabas na election official na tutulong sa iyo na bumoto. Mangyaring bisitahin ang vancouver.ca/vote upang i-check ang accessibility options para sa bawat lugar ng botohan at upang malaman kung aling mga lugar ng botohan ang may curbside voting.

3. Gumamit ng assistive ballot-marking device sa panahon ng advance voting.

Kung kailangan mo ng tulong upang markahan ang iyong balota at nais mong gumamit ng isang assistive ballot marking device, mangyaring magpunta sa Roundhouse Community Centre (181 Roundhouse Mews) o kaya sa Trout Lake Community Centre (3360 Victoria Drive) sa mga araw ng advance voting (Oktubre 1, 5, 8, 11, 13).

Ang device ay makakatulong sa iyo na markahan ang iyong balota gamit ang:

- Sip-and-puff, paddle, o iba pang accessibility devices
- Audio instructions at braille markings sa paddles at buttons
- Malalaking print o kaya high-colour contrast

Ang instructions para malaman kung paano gamitin ang device ay magiging available onsite, pati na sa braille.

Ang American Sign Language (ASL) ay magiging available sa video chat sa advance voting days.

4. Kapag pupunta ka na sa lugar ng botohan, magdala ng isang táong kilala mo na tutulong sa iyo, o kaya'y humingi ng tulong mula sa isang election official sa alinmang advance voting days o sa Araw ng Eleksyon.






