The Pride Parade is on the horizon ... this email contains important details on how you can take part on Sunday, August 6th.

This year's theme is #Reconnect, a reminder of the Vancouver Pride Society's commitment to amplify QTBIPOC voices and nurture community care. Elected officials and staff across various departments will march together, embracing this spirit.

We'll have two City fully electric vehicles: An electric DJ truck led by Lon LaClaire, General Manager of Engineering, and an electric SUV driven by John Odong. This year, instead of t-shirts, we'll carry 'VanProud' signs.

## Key Details for August 6th:

- Staging Area: Pendrell Street, between Bidwell and Denman. Exact Location: B on Pendrell, just east of Denman (see maps below). To access the staging area please walk west down Pendrell or south down Bidwell as there is no access from Denman or Davie streets.
- Arrival Time: Between 11:00-11:30am sharp. Note that access becomes challenging after 11:30 am due to fencing.
- Parade Route: Approximately 3.1km, lasting 45-60 minutes.
- Parade End: Vehicle traffic disperses on Pacific and Griffiths Way (South Side) and marchers on Carrall Street.


