SUBJECT: Council Priorities for the 2023 Engineering Operating Budget – Q2 Update

This memo provides a progress update on the service areas that received an increase when Council approved the budget for 2023. Council added funding to some of the services categories in Engineering Services.

The following amendments were approved at the Special Council Meeting on Feb 28, 2023:

- Pothole Repair & Road Maintenance:
 - \$0.3 million to increase the number of pothole crews from 5 to 6 to increase road maintenance and pothole repair
 - \$0.13 million in one-time funding for a vehicle & equipment
- Street Horticulture: \$0.6 million to increase street horticulture service levels
- Micro-cleaning: \$0.18 million for micro-cleaning grants to support plazas and parklets

The additional funds were allocated in March 2023. Below is progress update for each of the priority areas as of June 30, 2023. Expenditures to June 30 for each of the programs are provided in detail in Appendix A.

Pothole Repair & Road Maintenance

A new crew was trained and deployed in Q2-2023, and a vehicle has been secured for use until the new City-owned vehicle is deployed. Delivery and commissioning of the new vehicle is expected in first half of 2024. The average case duration for 311 reported cases in potholes is expected to improve over time, and the metric on pothole response time is being developed.



However, there has been an increased in the number of potholes filled and a reduction in the number of 311 potholes services request. It should be noted that City pavement assets have been deteriorating as a result of aging, weather, traffic loading and other damage. This degradation trend has contributed to a growing need for pothole repairs.

Service impact (2023 up to Q2):

- 36,371 potholes filled vs. 29,680 same period last year
- 3,228 no. of 311 potholes service requests vs. 4,716 same period last year

Street Horticulture

For improved horticulture maintenance, the City hired one landscape designer and added three seasonal staff for the Parks crews. This fall the Parks team expects to hire four additional full-time staff to support this work moving forward year-round. The new staff for median and local crews were deployed in June 2023.

Service impact (up to Q2):

- 89 median gardens maintained vs. 50 same period last year
- 56% median gardens maintained vs. 32% same period last year

Micro-Cleaning Grants

In June 2023, Council approved a grant to allocate the additional funds to support plazas & parklet micro-cleaning. Starting in Q3, Mission Possible will increase weekly micro-cleaning, seasonal power washing, and leaf removal.

Residential Waste Collection

Although not part of the additional funding allocation for 2023, Council has expressed an interest in status of residential waste collection. Staffing shortages and old equipment have resulted in a high number of missed collections.

Staffing

Following a significant hiring push, staffing levels are now sufficient to run the operation, address staff burnout, and provide vacation coverage. We are currently exploring ways to address the on-going challenges with staff recruitment and retention in Sanitation.

Equipment

Truck reliability remains the biggest challenge and will continue until the aging fleet is fully replaced, which won't be complete until 2025 as a result of the global fleet shortage. The impact of daily truck breakdowns means overtime work is still needed to finish scheduled collections. A handful of leased and new trucks are now providing some relief and the situation will continue to improve as we gradually bring more trucks online.

Operational Improvements

The foundational work on route optimization has been completed, however efforts have slowed recently due a to key staff departures and due to the reallocation of remaining resources to support the deployment of our new trucks.

In summary, work on these initiatives is advancing well and staff will continue to monitor and report out on these initiatives at the end of each quarter.
