The City Hive's City Shaper program offers facilitated classroom sessions in Vancouver High Schools and introduce students to their local government. The program helps students develop skills to engage effectively with the City.

As part of the program, students can tour Vancouver City Hall, meet members of City Council, experience a City consultation, and learn about local government. A similar event was held on June 5, 2023 for over 90 Vancouver high school students - over 80% of those students reported that meeting Council was the highlight of their day at City Hall and 75% of them said the visit to City Hall and meeting Council made them more likely to engage with the City in the future.

You are invited to provide a welcome address at the Joe Wai room in Vancouver City Hall on Friday, November 3 from 12:20-12:30 pm. Three classes of Grade 10-12 students from Vancouver Technical Secondary School will visit Vancouver City Hall for a half-day event to learn about the City of Vancouver's decision making processes, how the City of Vancouver functions, and ways that they can get involved with local government.

You are also invited to be a part of the City Council Panel taking place later in the program on Friday, November 3, 2023 from 2-3:15 pm in the Council Chamber. The agenda for the City Council Panel is as follows:

- Council Introduction (~2-3 minutes per Council member)
- Q&A with students (30-40 Minutes)

You will have 2-3 minutes to give a brief introduction about yourself, how and why you got into local politics, and any advice you would give young people interested in engaging with their local government. Students will then have an opportunity to ask Council questions.
