**Subject:** Integrity Commissioner investigation report

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Good afternoon Mayor and Council,

On the forthcoming agenda for the Regular Council meeting on October 31, you will see an item pertaining to the recent investigation report issued by the Integrity Commissioner in respect of a complaint against Councillor Boyle. As you will recall, the Commissioner found a breach of the Code of Conduct By-law but did not recommend any sanction.

In the case of a complaint that is substantiated by the Integrity Commissioner, Section 6.34 of the Code of Conduct provides that Council must consider the Commissioner's report within 30 days (or such longer period approved by a vote of Council) and decide on the appropriate measures, if any, that are warranted by the breach of the By-law. Section 6.36 of the By-law provides that Council must consider the matter in a public meeting.

Council is not obligated to impose any sanctions, nor is Council bound by recommendations provided by the Integrity Commissioner. The By-law also provides the respondent with the opportunity, in writing or in person, to comment on the decision and any recommended censure, sanctions or corrective actions.
