March 15 — Nolan Gray: How Zoning Broke the City and How to Fix It

Hello and welcome to the Alice MacKay Room at the Vancouver Public Library. My name is Jorge Amigo and I'm the Head of Cultural Programming here at VPL.

Before we begin, I want to **acknowledge** that we are hosting this event from the traditional, ancestral, and unceded territories of the Musqueam, the Squamish and the Tsleil-Waututh. I want to share that I'm an **immigrant from Mexico** and therefore a **settler in these lands**, which means I have a responsibility to continually learn about the ongoing effects of colonialism in this part of the world, and to take **sincere actions towards decolonization**, especially in my work as a public servant.

I cannot tell you how thrilled I am to see a full house tonight for this event. This is exactly what a library is for. To be a **forum for new ideas**, and to bring people **together** to discuss the most important issues of our time. This is exactly why I got into public programming, so it's an absolute pleasure for me to welcome you here tonight.

Quick show of hands: who is here for the very first time? And who has been to a library event in the last year?

Now, a couple housekeeping notes:

If you need to exit the room during the event, please use either of these doors. You can leave and re-enter anytime. The closest washrooms are located to the right of these doors.

And PLEASE take a moment right now to silence your phones...you don't need to turn them off. In fact: I encourage you to take photos or videos during the event, and share them on your social media. Please please tag VPL and tell the world you came to a cool library event!

Tonight we're here to talk about something that affects all of us: **zoning laws**. Now, I know this might not sound like the most riveting thing to discuss, especially for those of us who are not urban policy nerds, but the implications of zoning are enormous for the shape of our cities. So whichever side of this debate you're on, **whether you love or hate zoning**, my hope is that tonight you'll leave with a better understanding of how zoning affects your life, and the lives of everyone you know.

Now, I want to thank two organizations that made it possible for Nolan to be in Vancouver today: **Abundant Housing Vancouer**, and **Happy Cities**. Thank you so much for your support.

On that note, I'm going to hand over the mic to **Brendan Dawe**, who is an economist and urban planning consultant, and one of the co-founders of **Abundant Housing Vancouver**.

Thanks Brendan. And now it's my pleasure to introduce tonight's speakers:

Nolan Gray is a professional city planner and an expert in urban land-use regulation. He is currently completing a Ph.D. in urban planning at UCLA. Gray previously worked on the front lines of zoning as a planner in New York City. He now serves as an Affiliated Scholar with the Mercatus Center at George Mason University, where he advises state and local policymakers on land-use policy. He is a widely published author, whose work has appeared in top publications like The Atlantic, Bloomberg Citylab, and The Guardian.

Frances Bula is a journalist specializing in urban issues and city politics in the Vancouver region, which she's covered since 1994. She's an urban affairs contributor to The Globe and Mail, and has written regularly for many publications, including the Vancouver Sun (where she worked for 20 years). Frances also teaches at the UBC School of Journalism.

They're going to talk for about 40 minutes, and then we'll open it up to questions from the audience. Frances, take it away!

closing remarks –

Thank you everyone for being here. Thank you to Frances and Nolan for this conversation.

And thank you Frances for translating and summarizing audience questions.

I have to say, I've hosted more than 300 events in my career, and this was the most sophisticated, knowledgeable Q&A I've ever witnessed. So thank you for enriching the discussion, and thanks for sharing some important personal stories!

I want to take back something I said earlier. It turns out that a discussion about zoning can be riveting. Who knew?!

Now, our friends from Book Warehouse are here selling copies of the book. So if you want to dive deeper into this conversation, go get yourself a copy. Nolan will be sitting at the table over there signing books.

Also, if you want to keep chatting with Nolan, the folks from Abundant Housing are hosting a pub night right after this event, at 9pm at Brown's at the QE Theatre.

Before I let you go, I want to tell you about a couple events coming up soon here at VPL.

Next Wednesday, March 22, we're hosting a conversation between two doctors who are also authors: Vincent Lam and Daniel Kalla. This event will be about Vincent Lam's new novel, which deals with the opioid epidemic and the impact of addictions. This event is in partnership with the Vancouver Writers Festival, as part of a series we host here at VPL called INCITE.

And the Wednesday after that, March 29, we're hosting a conversation with Governor General Award winning Inuk writer **Norma Dunning**, about her new memoir *Kinauvit?*, where she uncovers the history of the Eskimo Disk System, which was a tool of colonization that reduced Inuit identity to a mere number. She'll be in conversation with another Governor General Award winner, Darrel McLeod.

And then starting in April, we'll kick off our Uplift Asian series, which celebrates Asian cultures and perspectives, and serves to push back against anti-Asian racism in our communities. So stay tuned for the full lineup coming in a few days.

I hope you can join us again! That's all I got. Thanks for coming, and have a good night!

Hello **Nolan** and **Frances** and happy Friday! I'm excited about our event next Wednesday, and hope you are, too.

I'll be hosting the event, and my colleagues **Candie** and **Dylan** (copied) will be producing it with me.

I'm writing to share three important next steps:

1) Event agenda

I'm attaching the event agenda. Please read it so we're all familiar with the format. It'll be very straightforward: **Frances**will interview **Nolan** about *Arbitrary Lines* for about 40-50 mins, and then we'll take questions from the audience for about 15-20 mins. Please note: the times on the agenda are not meant to be exact...just a general roadmap.

2) Arrival at Central Library

On March 15, please aim to arrive at the <u>Central Library</u> by 6:15 pm (45 mins before the event). Please meet me at the Alice MacKay Room in the Lower Level. You'll see a sign with the event poster inside the covered Atrium, at the top of the stairs that lead down to the venue.

We'll take you to a green room, so you can all connect before the event. At 6:50, I'll give us a run-through of the event, before we go on stage.

If you have any trouble or delays arriving at the library, please call me: s.15(1)(l)

If you're driving, the closest place to park is the EasyPark parkade right under the library. The entrance is on Hamilton Street.

3) Promotion and audience management

The event is sold out, with lots of people on the waitlist. The event capacity will be 220 seats, with very little standing room.

If people contact you about extra spots, please encourage them to join the waitlist. The day before the event, we send an automated message to registrants, which usually leads to about 20% of people letting go of their spots. So we'll be able to

assign those spots to people on the waitlist.

We ask that you please don't encourage people to show up without registration, to avoid having to turn people away. We oversold the event based on our no-shows data from past events, and are already accounting for a certain portion of the audience to be walk-ins in this calculation.

Also, we will be recording the event and uploading that recording to the VPL's YouTube<u>channel</u>, for people who can't attend. We do not have the capacity to livestream this event, in case people ask you.

March 15 — Nolan Gray: How Zoning Broke the City and How to Fix It

Hello and welcome to the Alice MacKay Room at the Vancouver Public Library. My name is Jorge Amigo and I'm the Head of Cultural Programming here at VPL.

Before we begin, I want to **acknowledge** that we are hosting this event from the traditional, ancestral, and unceded territories of the Musqueam, the Squamish and the Tsleil-Waututh. I want to share that I'm an **immigrant from Mexico** and therefore a **settler in these lands**, which means I have a responsibility to continually learn about the ongoing effects of colonialism in this part of the world, and to take **sincere actions towards decolonization**, especially in my work as a public servant.

I cannot tell you how thrilled I am to see a full house tonight for this event. This is exactly what a library is for. To be a **forum for new ideas**, and to bring people **together** to discuss the most important issues of our time. This is exactly why I got into public programming, so it's an absolute pleasure for me to welcome you here tonight.

Quick show of hands: who is here for the very first time? And who has been to a library event in the last year?

Now, a couple housekeeping notes:

If you need to exit the room during the event, please use either of these doors. You can leave and re-enter anytime. The closest washrooms are located to the right of these doors.

And PLEASE take a moment right now to silence your phones...you don't need to turn them off. In fact: I encourage you to take photos or videos during the event, and share them on your social media. Please please tag VPL and tell the world you came to a cool library event!

Tonight we're here to talk about something that affects all of us: **zoning laws**. Now, I know this might not sound like the most riveting thing to discuss, especially for those of us who are not urban policy nerds, but the implications of zoning are enormous for the shape of our cities. So whichever side of this debate you're on, **whether you love or hate zoning**, my hope is that tonight you'll leave with a better understanding of how zoning affects your life, and the lives of everyone you know.

Now, I want to thank two organizations that made it possible for Nolan to be in Vancouver today: **Abundant Housing Vancouer**, and **Happy Cities**. Thank you so much for your support.

On that note, I'm going to hand over the mic to **Brendan Dawe**, who is an economist and urban planning consultant, and one of the co-founders of **Abundant Housing Vancouver**.

Thanks Brendan. And now it's my pleasure to introduce tonight's speakers:

Nolan Gray is a professional city planner and an expert in urban land-use regulation. He is currently completing a Ph.D. in urban planning at UCLA. Gray previously worked on the front lines of zoning as a planner in New York City. He now serves as an Affiliated Scholar with the Mercatus Center at George Mason University, where he advises state and local policymakers on land-use policy. He is a widely published author, whose work has appeared in top publications like The Atlantic, Bloomberg Citylab, and The Guardian.

Frances Bula is a journalist specializing in urban issues and city politics in the Vancouver region, which she's covered since 1994. She's an urban affairs contributor to The Globe and Mail, and has written regularly for many publications, including the Vancouver Sun (where she worked for 20 years). Frances also teaches at the UBC School of Journalism.

They're going to talk for about 40 minutes, and then we'll open it up to questions from the audience. Frances, take it away!

Also, if you want to keep chatting with Nolan, the folks from Abundant Housing are hosting a pub night right after this event, at 9pm at Brown's at the QE Theatre.

Before I let you go, I want to tell you about a couple events coming up soon here at VPL.

Next Wednesday, March 22, we're hosting a conversation between two doctors who are also authors: Vincent Lam and Daniel Kalla. This event will be about Vincent Lam's new novel, which deals with the opioid epidemic and the impact of addictions. This event is in partnership with the Vancouver Writers Festival, as part of a series we host here at VPL called INCITE.

And the Wednesday after that, March 29, we're hosting a conversation with Governor General Award winning Inuk writer **Norma Dunning**, about her new memoir *Kinauvit?*, where she uncovers the history of the Eskimo Disk System, which was a tool of colonization that reduced Inuit identity to a mere number. She'll be in conversation with another Governor General Award winner, Darrel McLeod.

And then starting in April, we'll kick off our Uplift Asian series, which celebrates Asian cultures and perspectives, and serves to push back against anti-Asian racism in our communities. So stay tuned for the full lineup coming in a few days.

Hello Brenan and Nolan, and great to connect!

Nolan: great to hear you're willing to come to Vancouver, and that the dates work.

I also have a slight preference for March 15, so let's agree on this date.

I've just reserved our events venue for this, so we're good to start planning next steps:

Format:

I propose we do an author interview, between Nolan and a suitable local moderator. The general agenda that we usually aim for is a 60 min event, broken up like this:

- 5 min intro
- 40 min conversation with author
- 15 mins of audience Q&A

We can expand this to a 75 min event, and either have a longer Q&A, or have you do a 10 min presentation at the beginning.

My sense is that for a complex topic like zoning, it would be more valuable for the audience to hear a presentation from Nolan, so everyone in the room is introduced to the same knowledge/concepts, and then we move to a conversation between the author and moderator, and end with a Q&A.

Let me know how this all sounds. Here's a <u>playlist</u> with similar recent events we've done.

Moderator:

In consultation with Brendan, I'll work on finding a suitable moderator. We usually aim for journalists or broadcasters who can translate specialize knowledge to a general audience, and move along a conversation.

We could also look for an academic from one of our local planning schools, or someone who has worked for the city planning department. Or an advocate whose work is related to zoning. Other than familiarity with the topic, the skill I'm really looking for is their stage presence and ability to interview someone live.

Event promotion:

Nolan: when you have a sec, please send over a headshot and the cover image of your book. And let me know if this bio on your publisher page is good for me to use.

Once I have those and we confirm a moderator, I'll create an event listing on the VPL website and will keep you posted.

That's all I got for now! Looking forward to hosting you in Vancouver, Nolan, and partnering with you on this, Brendan!

I'll be hosting the event, and my colleagues **Candie** and **Dylan** (copied) will be producing it with me.

I'm writing to share three important next steps:

1) Event agenda

I'm attaching the event agenda. Please read it so we're all familiar with the format. It'll be very straightforward: **Frances**will interview **Nolan** about *Arbitrary Lines* for about 40-50 mins, and then we'll take questions from the audience for about 15-20 mins. Please note: the times on the agenda are not meant to be exact...just a general roadmap.

2) Arrival at Central Library

Also, we will be recording the event and uploading that recording to the VPL's YouTube<u>channel</u>, for people who can't attend. We do not have the capacity to livestream this event, in case people ask you.


