List of track deficiency observed during on-site meeting.

- Repair/ ensure track gauge tool is operational to ensure that monthly track gauge check can be completed as per manufactures requirements.
- 2. Inspected/ ensure that track ballast meets manufactures minimum requirements.
- 3. Check / verify that track gauge meets manufacturers operating parameters. Multiple areas identified to gauge issues at time of assessment. Second corner from loading platform. All three track switches.
- 4. Ensure that all track switch weld repairs, have corrosion protection to prevent cracking and fatigue.
- 5. Ensure that Fleet services inspected and check all hardware and fasteners that were involved in train major component overhaul. As well all major components on the carriages.
- 6. Ensure that all track rail joints meet manufacture min and maximum operating tolerances.

Please ensure that the following have be checked and repaired as required prior to the final inspection on November.27.2023.

## Report:

Julien Henley (AE), Jaime Yanez Rojas (AE), Krista Moyls (City of Vancouver), and Warren Falkenhagen (City of Vancouver) were on site from 12:00 pm – 1:00 pm.

### Activity:

- The project team conducted a walkthrough on site and identified the following items:
  - 1) Timber screws are missing in the bearing plate at pier bent No. 9 (see photograph 2)




- 1.) Timber to be DFin Not or better ACQ tracked
- 2) All connection bolts and rods to be ASTM A307 grade B and hot raip galucinized.
- 3) Both holes shall be bored with an auger to max 3.0 mm over 513e.
- 4) Provide malleable iron (timber) washers where connections are bearing on timber.
- 5) Timber ecrews shall be simpson strong-drive sows timber screw in exterior grade A
- 6) Field outing & fuld treating:
  - Field treat all field cuts, notches and holes with twee coats of copper naththonate containing a minimum 2% copper metal.
  - cut ends of timber to be treated with U-C coatings corporation anchor seal after hearing with copper raphentierate.
- 7) All Seel plates and sections to be CSA G40.21 300W hot up galvanized to ASTRA A123.


# B-46 Miniature Railway Bridge (short 1)




TIMBER POST EXTENDED TO UNDERSIDE OF STRINGERS

So my understanding is that however many carriages we have at the time of the final inspection, if FMS has gone over every inch of the units to ensure that components are torqued and compliant with the manufacturer's standards and HH has signed off on those units, we will be able to put them into service that week.

And whatever carriages do come online after that, the same conditions need to be in place prior to your inspection.

And we will track all driving hours for the units individually so we can make sure that they receive the 40 hour and 80 hour checks when we attain those thresholds.

Well, I hope we can get all of them back here before November 27, so we don't have to call you back for a third inspection.

Hi Dave,

Just looking for some clarity around the testing piece. I have a few questions for you about test-driving hours and what is the requirement to have carriages re-approved to operate...

Joe from A&B has informed me that the track work is probably not going to be completed until November 17.

We will be hard pressed to get sufficient driving hours on the equipment.

If we can find the staffing, we may get 40 hours before November 27 on the loco and whatever carriages we have when the track is done, but we are going to have to

scramble to do that. We're down some workers and trying to get hours in while doing the light setup is very challenging.

In regards to hours of running if you can get any where from 16-40 hours on the equipment then have Fleet go over with a fine tooth comb to ensure all major components torqued and in proper operating conditions to meet manufacture minimum operating requires.

Is there a minimum requirement for you to approve the units for use? No we will approved as many unit that you have on site at the time however once units start coming online we will need to re inspected before public operations.

On Monday, I heard that we should have mechanics recheck at 40 hours and then again at 80 hours. Are you needing this to happen before you give us an OK to operate? we can have them check the unit at these hour even if units are being used for public operation they should be checked over at theses hours to ensure no issues are arising. If less than 40 hours before public operation just have fleet go over before T.S.B.C inspection and have it documented.

And does the requirement apply to carriages as well as the locomotive? yes they do.

We are hoping to get two more carriages back in-house the last week of November, but maybe not by the  $27^{th}$ .

What would be your decision around putting those carriages into service right away knowing that Hedgehog will provide a stamped report for those units?
