



We noticed during a recent site visit on Nov.22 that the trees are still in the Green Streets garden along with some memorial pieces on display in the gingko tree.

These trees are all too tall and/or planted too close to the intersection corner, consequently blocking sightlines.

Please respectfully relocate the memorial pieces before removing the trees.

If you are not able to remove the trees, we will send a crew to in to do the work.

Just as reminder, the trees in question include the:

- Gingko tree
- Two (2) oak trees
- · One (1) pine tree
- Plus the sumac seedling by the gingko (recently noticed on the last site visit)

Please also remove any other tree seedings missing from this list.

Let me know if you'd like some pots to transplant any of the tree seedlings.

Hi s.22(1)

I'm following up about the removal of excess trees and concerns about the height of vegetation in the Green Streets garden at Guelph St and E 5th Ave.

Attached is a street view screenshot of the garden with the trees in need of removing as well as the overly tall vegetation that should be trimmed or replaced to meet the height restrictions.

Leave the tree circled in green as this is a street tree planted by the Parks Board.

The photo is from a few years ago so we understand if the garden is different from what is shown. If there are additional trees than what I have circled or overly tall plants, please remove and/or trim them.

I've been informed that the gingko tree has been of concern since 2018 and you were asked to remove it. Trees over many valuable ecosystem services to the city and we try our best to maintain the health of our trees so long as they do not cause safety issues. Unfortunately, the gingko tree was planted too close to the intersection and while it is currently not causing sightline issues, it will in the future as the truck thickens with age. Its roots will also start uplifting the sidewalk resulting in tripping hazards. If the tree had been removed earlier perhaps could have been replanted elsewhere, but it is now thoroughly established and it is very unlikely to transplant successfully.

If you would like to donate any of the trees that can be successfully transplanted to the city, I can see about picking them up and transporting them to the city nursery for planting in more suitable areas. They will just need to be potted up for us to transport.

Please let us know once you have completed this or if you are unable to resolve this issue and require some assistance. Thank you so much for your cooperation, have a great day, and happy gardening as always!

We have received a complaint from a citizen about the Green Streets garden at Guelph St and E 5th Ave. They are concerned by the number of trees in the garden and the obstruction of sight lines they present.

As part of the <u>Green Streets gardening care tips</u>, we ask that you do not plant trees in the garden s.22(1) and to ensure the plants in the garden do not exceed 60cm (24 inches).

Please remove any trees you have planted or that have self seeded in the garden and trim any plants that are above this height restriction. There appears to be one street tree planted in the garden by the Parks Board that matches the rest of the trees on the street. Do not remove this tree.

Unfortunately this tree was flagged as a sightline concern and must be removed for pedestrian safety. It is too large to transplant. It was not planted by Park Board or with prior review by City Staff, and appears to have been planted around 2012-2013. Our team has asked the s.22(1) and who we assume to have planted the tree, to remove it and others planted at the corner. The next step will be to request that Urban Forestry or a contractor remove it to address the safety concern as soon as possible. Please let us know if you have further questions.



Hi Maria

Ideally all the trees at a height between 0.75m- 1.3m in the bulge should be removed. The idea of a bulge is to block cars from parking too close to the intersection so drivers can see pedestrians crossing. But by planting trees on the bulge, this traffic calming tool has become obsolete. So my recommendation is to remove the trees as per the diagram below (all purple areas in the bulge).

Hi Liliana,

Would you be able to assess whether the trees at the corner of Guelph and E5th (SE corner) are a safety hazard?

The trees are in a Green Streets garden.

The oaks and pine were volunteers while the gingko was planted by the member of the public roughly 10 years ago without our knowing. Once we were aware of them, we asked the sponsor gardener to remove the trees as is our policy of sightline concerns. The sponsor gardener pruned part of the gingko but was stopped by a member of the public who wanted to save the tree. The other trees have been left untouched for the most part but the gardener has been trying to keep them low the last few years.

We would like a definitive answer as to whether the trees are a safety concern, particularly the gingko tree as it grows.

Hello,

site in particular is rapidly becoming a tree farm. The plot at the corner of Guelph and 5th now contains 5 trees! One is a city tree or seems to be, as is identical species to other trees planted along that stretch of 5th. The city tree is the one doing the poorest, maybe by design of whomever is tending that plot? The trees are all jammed together and if left to mature will produce a huge wall of wood blocking out light and making the growth of more attractive plants difficult. All of these trees far exceed the 24" to 36" height restriction.

Suggestions:

- The city tree needs a water bag, the same as city trees planted along the opposite side of 5th.
- Removal of all the other illegally(?) planted trees to open up the space and make it more attractive. At present it is not very attractive. Perhaps the care of that plot needs to be transferred to a person who can vastly improve on what at times is a bit of an eyesore..

Basically 1 tree in this plot is plenty, the others should be removed and planted elsewhere.
