About the project: In May, Vancouver City Council announced that "Canada Place" would be given a secondary, honorary street name of "Komagata Maru Place." This

decision - informed by community input and support - forms part of the City's ongoing efforts for cultural redress of historic discrimination against South Asian communities. On February 9, the four street signs, and street-level story boards, will be officially unveiled. Invited guests from the South Asian Canadian community will include members of the *Descendants of the Komagata Maru Society*, the *Khalsa Diwan Society*, *Punjabi Market Collective*, and

City of Vancouver's Historical Discrimination against People of South Asian Descent Community Advisory Group.
