Members of Vancouver's first ever Special Event Advisory Task Force announced Task force aims to make it easier to host festivals and events in Vancouver

In November 2023, the City of Vancouver issued a call for applications for a new Special Event Advisory Task Force. The Special Event Advisory Task Force will help identify key challenges and opportunities within the City's existing permitting processes, and work alongside City staff to make it easier to host festivals and events in Vancouver.

"We're excited to introduce the members of Vancouver's first ever Special Event Advisory Task Force," said Mayor Ken Sim.
