SUBJECT: Q2 2024 public engagement schedule

Dear Mayor and Council,

The purpose of this memo is to provide a high-level overview of upcoming City-led public engagement projects in Q2 2024, excluding stakeholder engagement activities.

Notably, a coordinated communications and engagement process is planned for three Broadway Plan-related projects in early June. The public will have a chance to learn more about Broadway Plan implementation and share their thoughts on specific elements being considered.

The following table is meant to offer an approximation of engagement timelines for Q2; exact dates for each project are determined closer to the launch date. Generally, projects are actively open for input for three to four weeks from their launch date. All public-facing engagement projects are hosted on the City's public engagement portal, Shape Your City (shapeyourcity.ca).

Week of Project Description



April 1	ACCS Community Centre Service Review (ACCS)	Throughout Q2, ACCS will be seeking feedback from Carnegie, Evelyne Saller and Gathering Place community centre users, focusing on how programs and services can meet the changing needs of the community.
April 16	Seniors Housing Strategy (PDS)	Building on the first phase of engagement and subsequent planning work, the City is sharing the draft Seniors Housing Strategy for public feedback.
May 20	Addressing Anti-Black Racism (ACCS)	This second phase of engagement aims to validate the draft actions developed by the advisory committee by consulting more broadly with members of the Black and African Diaspora communities.
May 27	Historical Discrimination Against People of South Asian Canadian Descent (ACCS)	Engagement will focus on opportunities for the South Asian community to share their lived experience and suggest actions for the City to take as part of cultural redress.
June 3	Broadway Public Realm (PDS)	 Given geographic proximity, these projects will launch at the same time, through a coordinated communications and engagement process: Broadway Public Realm: Will seek feedback on public space ideas and "great street" concepts. Broadway Land Use Built Form: Will share information about proposed land use policy changes to reflect the new Provincial transitoriented area legislation, as well as proposed policy amendments based on early learnings from plan implementation. Civic District: will seek input on land use, built form, transportation and open space concepts for the Civic District (properties between Broadway and W 12th Ave and Cambie and Yukon).

June 3	Civic District (PDS)	
June 17	Granville Street Planning (PDS)	This second phase of engagement will seek feedback on the proposed look-and-feel of the street, including built-form, lighting and signage.
June 24	Rupert Renfrew Area Plan (PDS)	Engagement will provide an update and opportunity for community members to comment on the draft neighbourhood plan.

For additional context, engagement is typically led by project teams within each department with support from Civic Engagement and Communications. A summary of engagement findings will be shared with Council by way of Council reports produced by each department.
