Road closures for Punjabi Market area on Saturday, April 13

# Traffic impacts and road closures

- Fraser St closed from E 41st Ave to SE Marine Dr
- Westbound SE Marine Dr closed from Knight St to Main St
- Westbound SE Marine Dr closed from Knight St to Main St
- 57th Ave closed from Knight St to Ontario St
- 57th Ave closed from Ontario St to Knight St
