Each year on April 28, the City observes the [Day of Mourning](#) to pay our respects to and remember colleagues who have been killed, injured or suffered occupational illness while working.

To honour these people, WorkSafeBC, the BC Federation of Labour, and the Business Council of BC are coordinating a memorial service at Jack Poole Plaza on Sunday, April 28 at 10:30 am. You are welcome to attend this service to show your support for all workers who have lost their lives or became sick or injured on the job or watch the [livestream](#) that will be available on the Day of Mourning website.

This year, because the Day of Mourning is on Sunday, the City will also recognize the day on Friday, April 26, where we are all encouraged to observe a minute of silence at 11 am. The flag at City Hall will be flown at half-mast, and a commemorative wreath will be placed at the north steps of City Hall.

Safety is, and always will be, the City's top priority. Our Office of the Chief Safety Officer continues to review our current plans and policies, make systemic changes, and continually improve our safety performance across the organization.
