Metro Vancouver is responsible for issuing air emissions permits within the region, and assessing whether our requirements and bylaws are being met. Environmental regulation and enforcement officers are on site assessing the situation and collecting information.

Parkland Refining holds a valid air quality permit with Metro Vancouver, and officers are assessing compliance with that permit, which will be an ongoing process.



 - o Between 8-10am we had 106 apparatus runs and 406 attendees in and out of the halls

This is what justified our notifications. See our call volume at 8am. Our first communication (via tweet) was at 8:57 am from my account.

I have spoken with the Burnaby Chief and we were on their list to contact, but recognizing that they have limited resources and the list for notifications was long. The wind blowing to Vancouver resulted in odour that Burnaby may not have been aware of (to the extent of). They are stating that Burnaby Corporate Comms will be prepared with early holding messages on an incident in the future.

Update on Air Quality Monitoring:

Metro Vancouver operates an extensive monitoring network with air quality monitoring stations capable of detecting emissions from the refinery. Three air contaminants emitted from Parkland Refinery that Metro Vancouver monitors are particulate matter, nitrogen dioxide, and sulphur dioxide. While there was an odour present and sulphur dioxide levels did increase, Metro Vancouver?s air quality objectives for those air contaminants were not exceeded at the monitoring stations during the event. These air contaminants are continuously measured at Metro Vancouver?s monitoring stations and data are available atairmap.ca [subscription.metrovancouver.org], along with current air quality information. Metro Vancouver received very few odour complaints related to the refinery today.

Metro Vancouver will continue to monitor air quality and work with the health authorities.

Subject: Odours across Vancouver

Good morning Council

As you may be aware, we have a strong odour across the City at the moment. Our VFRS crews initially covered all areas looking for the source.

We have learned that there was an event (fire) at the large hydro carbon facility (refinery) in Burnaby this morning. The fire is out, but the resulting odours continue to come into our City.

We are in the process of initiating a public advisory through our Alertable App.

I am in regular contact with the Burnaby fire chief as they monitor the air quality and determine the contents of combustion.

This is to give you some further information:

Our chiefs have spoken. We've got the direction from ours to issue an alert. It's general and going out soon.

It sounds like Burnaby will also be issuing one...?

We will adjust ours to point to yours when:if that happens.

Hi Charmaigne - apparently our FCs have just spoken and they'll be sending an email update to Vancouver via you. Just wanting to confirm it that's also your understanding (we're waiting on it to confirm cancelation of our alert).

Also, FYI - this event caused over 100 calls to Metro Vancouver on AQ and a significant number of calls to 911 (we had 17 fire trucks out hunting for the smell at one point, and the VFRS Duty Chief had to tell E-Comm to stop dispatching apparatus to odour calls...they were so flooded w calls that the Duty Chief even had a hard time getting hold of E-Comm!). Just info to support why our chief wanted to get broad communications out on this.

Charmaigne, we're going to cancel our alert at 14:30 given the indication from Burnaby Fire that there's no risk and the dissipation of the odour. Especially since Metro Vancouver has now issued an alert as well:).
