Outlook & Situational Awareness

- VCH: Securing 301 E Hastings site went smoothly; evidence of inhabitant but no one found; building now secured; lots of appreciation for those who coordinated for event
- VCH outreach teams were out twice; lots of referrals and beginning to see "regular clients"; planning to have a RN be present along Hastings periodically
- VCH continues to look for an indoor space on Hastings to meet with people for triage
- Impoundment occurred for 122-142 Hastings and shelter was offered to everyone present.
- Notice given to 77 Hastings to be moved by Wednesday November 30th. The plan is for impoundment to occur November 30.



Significant changes/updates

- The process for referrals to Evelyne Saller TWS has been finalized (10 spaces)
- The process for 1660 E Hastings is being finalized with BC Housing and VAFC.
 Shelter expected to open approximately mid-December.









- December 7th debris removal at Crab Park. Residents helped and filled up an entire truck (4,360kg). Process went smoothly with paths cleared and access improved.
 Thirty (30) bins put in place so residents can continue to clean up. Will go back Jan to do another clean up.
 - Parks and Outreach did separate counts at Crab Park and both teams identified 52 tents with approximately 34-40 people residing in the park
 - Electricity at Crab Park is currently shut off as a safety precaution
- Seeing increase in combustible materials (propane tanks, jerry cans, generators etc.) in tents. VFRS has communicated to individuals that confiscated propane tanks will not be returned













Parks:

- Crab Park: There was a change in leadership at the Park in December 2022. The new leadership are living in the
 Park and embedded in the day to day activity. It is unclear whether they were involved in previous
































