Subject:	Congestion and curbside management permit - legal challenge

Good morning Mayor and Council,

I am writing to advise that Uber Canada has filed a petition with the BC Supreme Court challenging the legality of the City's permit requirements for ride-sharing services. As you will recall, ride-sharing companies are required to hold a permit to pick up/drop off passengers in the Metro Core between 7am and 10pm. That permit requires payment of a \$0.50 fee per pick-up and drop-off in the Metro Core area during those times.

Uber is arguing that the imposition of the CCMP permit requirement and associated fees are outside the City's jurisdiction.

Legal Services received the petition yesterday and is presently reviewing Uber's submission. We will provide further updates as this matter proceeds.
