
Good afternoon Mayor and Council,

Further to the information shared this week on safety and security at City Hall, please find below some updates:

1. Emergency Egress

- Third Floor Evacuation Route
 - The evacuation route outlined in the map below (red arrows) provides egress to the Mayor's elevator for all Councillors, at all times, in the event of an emergency.
 - All Councillor's have access to exit all four doors. Access has been tested and verified as of 2024-10-10
 - Signage on the doors will indicate the emergency egress route. Signs will be added ASAP.
 - Access through door #1 and #2 is for "Emergency Egress Only".
 - Access from the Mayor's elevator back into the Mayor's Office is restricted.
- Shelter-in-Place
 - Council meeting days: Grouse Room
 - The Grouse Room (Council Operations shelter-in-place).
 - The door does currently not have a card reader and is currently looked via key.
 - Access to the room during Council meetings is provided by CPS. This access will be verified by CPS prior to all Council meetings.
 - Non-Council days: Council Kitchen
 - Please see the updated map below.
 - Staff are adding a card reader to the door into the kitchen next week.
 - A review of an alternative access to the Grouse Room and/or access to an alternative shelter-in-place space is currently underway.
- We understand that Councillors will want to test passes to ensure they work. CPS will coordinate a time with the Mayor's Office to do a walk through so that everyone can test their access with the least disruption to the Mayor's office. We will aim to do this as soon as feasible.

2) City Hall Campus Safe Walk

- City Protective Services (CPS) provides a 24/7 Safe Walk service for all City of Vancouver employees and elected officials at the City Hall Campus.
- This service ensures personal safety by offering an escort when walking from their workplace to their vehicle, to transit stops, or between designated buildings.
- To ensure availability, employees and elected officials are encouraged to request Safe Walk escorts at least 30 minutes before the desired time.
- To request a Safe Walk, please contact the City Hall Security Operations Centre.

3) City Hall Exempt Parking

- Parking exemptions for the City Hall upper deck are available to Elected Officials.
- We have verified that the Mayor and all Councillors except Clir. Zhou are currently listed as exempt.
- Cllr Zhou, if you provide your license plate number to City Protective Services, we can add you to the list.
 Exemption requests for changes in license plates can be submitted to City Protective Services by thisonline form.
- Exemption requests for charges in license plates can be submitted to City Protective Services by INISONINE form
