Thanks for the question, Mike.

The VEMA team is tracking this issue closely and is in contact with their counterparts at the Province. At this time, western Vancouver Island is the area considered to be at most risk from this weather system. The forecasted impact for Vancouver is expected to be largely typical for a fall storm event.

Winds are expected to peak tomorrow afternoon, continuing overnight. Forecast wind speeds for Vancouver are in the range of 60-70 km/h. Given tide levels and depending on wind direction, there is a moderate risk of coasting flooding.

VEMA is coordinating with our operational teams in Engineering, Parks, 311 and Communications regarding our response and we will provide further updates for Council with any developments tomorrow.
