Good afternoon Mayor and Council,

As you know, today, Prime Minister Justin Trudeau<u>announced</u> a Cabinet shuffle. IGR has pulled together the summary below so you have the information all in one place:

New Ministers are:

- Nathaniel Erskine-Smith (Beaches—East York) was appointed as Minister of Housing, Infrastructure and Communities.
- Rachel Bendayan (Outremont) was appointed as Minister of Official Languages and Associate Minister of Public Safety. She previously served as Parliamentary Secretary to the Deputy Prime Minister and Minister of Finance.
- Élisabeth Brière (Sherbrooke) was appointed as Minister of National Revenue. She previously served as the parliamentary secretary to Minister of Families, Children and Social Development and to the Minister of Mental Health and Addictions and Associate Minister of Health.
- Terry Duguid (Winnipeg South) was appointed Minister of Sport and Minister responsible for Prairies Economic Development Canada. He previously served as Parliamentary Secretary to the Prime Minister.
- Darren Fisher (Dartmouth—Cole Harbour) was appointed as Minister of Veterans Affairs and Associate Minister of National Defence.
- David McGuinty (Ottawa South) was appointed as Minister of Public Safety.
- Ruby Sahota (Brampton North) was appointed as Minister of Democratic Institutions and Minister responsible for the Federal Economic Development Agency for Southern Ontario.
- Joanne Thompson (St. John's East) was appointed as Minister of Seniors.

Ministers with adjusted portfolios are:

- Anita Anand (Oakville) was appointed as Minister of Internal Trade and will remain Minister of Transport She previously served as President of Treasury Board.
- Gary Anandasangaree (Scarborough—Rouge Park) was appointed as Minister responsible for the Canadian Norther Economic Development Agency. He remains Minister of Crown-Indigenous Relations and Northern Affairs.
- Steven MacKinnon (Gatineau) was appointed as Minister of Employment, Workforce Development and Labour. He previously served as Served as Minister of Labour and Seniors.
- Ginette Petitpas Taylor (Moncton—Riverview—Dieppe) becomes president of the Treasury Board. She previously served as Minister of Employment, Workforce Development and Official Languages, and Minister of Veterans Affairs.

On December 16, 2024, the Honourable Dominic LeBlanc (Beauséjour) was sworn-in as Minister of Finance and Intergovernmental Affairs. He will also take on the position of Chair of the Canada-US Cabinet Committee.
