Re: Request for Access to Records under the Freedom of Information and Protection of Privacy Act (the "Act")

- 1. Reports regarding media access during the City's work cleaning up homeless camps on Hastings Street in April 2023 and in CRAB Park on March 25 to April 6, 2024; and
- 2. Record of emails to and from the Communications Official overseeing communications of each of these actions by the City, Park Board, and VPD regarding media access. Date range: March 31 to April 8, 2023 and March 15 to April 8, 2024.

Highlights & key themes

- in Broad coverage across all major outlets including Global, CTV, CityNews1130 and CBC, with media in-person attendance from 9 separate outlets.
- ia Tone of questions during press conference mirrored in coverage; mostly neutral despite sensitive nature of the subject, becoming more negative into the day as protest activity increased
- Topics of note: local traffic cameras being down, lack of shelter space
- Key messages picked up:
 - City requesting support from police to bring the East Hastings encampment to a close following a steady deterioration in public safety
 - Increase in fires in the area and the encampment zone

Summary of Media Q&A

CityNews - Hana Mae Nassar: Only one media camera was allowed inside the encampment area and City street cameras were turned off at that intersection for a bit of time. Why wasn't there more transparency?

Paul Mochrie: There was an inadvertent technical error where the traffic camera at Main and Hastings was disabled for roughly half hour at approximately 9:15 a.m. Once that came to our attention, we remedied the situation and the cameras are back online now. We are working to provide as much transparency as possible, including a pool camera that is directly accessible to the work that is happening.

Chief Palmer: There is a pool camera down there for media to monitor what's going on. Lots of people down there with smart phones taking video and coverage right now for main stream and social media.

Follow-up question: We saw tension and clashing last time this happened. Any learnings from the last time? Seems like we are doing the same thing over and over again.

Paul Mochrie: The VPDs presence today has been requested by the City. The primary objective is to ensure that our staff doing this work are safe, and that all the people in the neighbourhood remain safe during the day. There is significant amount of criminal activity there from people who are not seeking homes and the emphasis today is on keeping people safe.

CTV - Penny Daflos: We keep hearing from people at the site there is not enough housing and people have no where to go. If you keep kicking people out, aren't they just going to go around the block – what is the plan?

Paul Mochrie: We continue to encourage people to take any option available to come inside. It is safer, connects people with services and gives them the best chance to move on to more permanent housing. This encampment in its current form is unsafe. That is what we have to deal with today and that is not going to solve the issue of homelessness. That is a long-term challenge and we are going to do our best to keep working to resolve that. In the meantime, it's this particular encampment we're focused on.

Follow-up question: The Premier acknowledged there are deplorable conditions in many SROs, yet that is the path towards permanent housing. What is the City's role to make sure these places are habitable?

Paul Mochrie: The SRO housing stock is a very important, particularity for people with low income. Much of that stock is very old, was constructed for a different purpose as hotels, and needs significant reinvestment and redevelopment. That is a very expensive and long term challenge. Not one the City can resolve on our own. In the meantime, the City inspects SROs on an ongoing basis, along with VFRS and SRO owners. We are also working with private SROs to make sure people living there are adequately supported.

CBC: The National – Lyndsay Duncombe: What tactically is different about what is happening on the ground today as opposed in the summer when people were told to leave?

Chief Palmer: Our role is to support City staff and make sure that people are safe and make sure people in the encampment are safe. There has been a deterioration in public safety in the area. We're there to restore some public safety and protect the City workers while they do their job, and we're there at the City's request.

Paul Mochrie: For months, City staff have been enforcing city by-laws and carrying out tasks under the Fire Chiefs Order. That has been relatively small scale, moving a few structures per day. In many cases people have moved their tents voluntarily. Today the effort is to remove the remaining structures and bring the encampment to a close.

Follow-up question: How will you make sure people don't take the problems and dangers you described to another area if they don't have anywhere to go because there isn't enough housing?

Chief Palmer: Once encampments become entrenched they become dangerous and volatile. Living on the street is a risky endeavor. We are there to help them get to a better place and keep the city safe.

Paul Mochrie: The issues we're dealing with here are due to the size and magnitude of this encampment, and it having been entrenched in one place as long as it has. We will continue to support people who are sheltering outdoors, not only in the DTES but across the city. Homelessness is a regional problem. It's not a problem that can be solved in Vancouver or the DTES alone. We will continue working with people who are sheltering outside to keep them safe and look to prevent larger, entrenched encampments.

- Globe and Mail Frances Bula: How many shelter spaces are available? How much new housing is coming online and when? Paul Mochrie: Re: shelter spaces, that's a dynamic picture. Our teams are in touch with BC Housing everyday to know where capacity exists. Efforts have been made over the last eight months to preserve shelter options for people on Hastings St, but day-to-day that number fluctuates. Re: housing coming online, over 300 units are coming over the next couple of months.
- Glacier Media Mike Howell: How many people are currently on the street? Is there enough shelter to accommodate them? Paul Mochrie: That is a fluid number. Today, if everyone who we understand to be homeless wants to take shelter it's likely we would not have sufficient shelter space for everyone. But we know not everyone is not going to take shelter. Many of those people have been offered shelter for months and have declined that option for various reasons. If someone on Hastings wants shelter today and it's not available we will stay connected to get them indoors as quickly as we can.
- Follow-up question: You said the goal today is to shut down the encampment, does this extend to Crab Park? If not, when will you deal with Crab Park? Paul Mochrie: Today's goal is to remove the structures from East Hastings encampment. No, we are not dealing with Crab Park today. The situation there is different. There is an existing court ruling that applies to Crab Park that allows people to maintain structures during the day in one area of the park. The Park Control By-law allows people to shelter in parks overnight if they have no other options. We don't see permanent, long-term encampments as a solution and we're working with the Province to bring that to an end, it's just not what we're dealing with today.
- Global News Crista Dao: How are you going to reconcile wanting people gone, but you don't have space to house them? Paul Mochrie: We aren't looking for them to be gone. What we need to do today is remove the structures from the Hastings encampment because the safety risks there are so sever. Optimal situation is they voluntarily take down their structure and move their belongings to a location where it is safe and legal to shelter overnight. We would continue to work with them as housing/shelter space comes online.
- Follow-up question: Has everyone been offered shelter? How many spaces are accessible for today?

Paul Mochrie: Outreach staff have been on Hastings for months. We've made every possible effort to provide options for people who are there. For various reasons some have turned them down. We're not solving homelessness here today. That's not what this is about. This is about dealing with a very serious public safety issue.

Postmedia – Derrick Penner: How come your efforts to gain cooperation from people haven't worked?

Paul Mochrie: There has been a lot of voluntary departures. Over 600 structures have been moved. Vast majority of those moved upon request. What we face now is that the people who remain are much less incline to cooperate and we need to bring it to a close in a way that is respectful, non-confrontational and resolves the safety issues.

Follow-up question: Mayor Sim said this represents a turning point. When was the turning point reached?

Mayor Sim: There's a different attitude at the City now where all our team members are supported and this is a City-led initiative. We are one unified team that has a common purpose and we want to see better outcomes, especially in the downtown east side. Since the election this year we've identified public safety, mental health and addictions, and supporting our most vulnerable residents as primary concerns of the city.

Second Round

CityNews - Hana Mae Nassar: What are you getting from province to ensure any rehousing is successful? Mayor Sim: We have conversations with the Province and it's a priority to provide housing stock for all sectors, including supportive housing. With the Province, we approved a number of new housing units to come online in Vancouver. I believe we will start to see improvements on the housing front sooner rather than later

CTV - Penny Daflos: What is your plan to keep people from considering living in a tent or SRO as affordability gets worse? How will you keep them from being left on the street?

Mayor Sim: At the City of Vancouver, we can work to make it easier to get a permit to build more housing. That's the stuff we can do to make it more affordable, less costly and faster to build so we can catch up to provide housing for everyone. We are going to Ottawa to lobby for more social housing and co-ops. We continue to have conversations with all levels of government. These are examples of things we're doing in the short term to triage the situation as we look towards longer term solutions.

Globe and Mail – Frances Bula: What is the long-term plan to ensure the encampment doesn't restart on Hastings or another area? Paul Mochrie: Engineering crews will continue the work they do everyday to support people who have erected structures on public spaces, and enforce the Street and Traffic By-Law. There may be more of that work in the short term, as necessary. We may need support from VPD again to ensure everyone is safe.

CityNews - Hana Mae Nassar: How long will this work take? How many staff are down there with police officers?

Paul Mochrie: Our hope is to get this done today in a respectful, measured, non-confrontational way. There might be about 50 city staff there today, but I need to confirm that number.

Chief Palmer: We don't release the exact number, but there are dozens of officers there today.

Glacier Media - Mike Howell: Who made the decision to do this work today?

Mayor Sim: This has been an ongoing issue. Today's work is a City-led initiative, supported by VPD and VFRS.

Follow-up question: So it was the City. Was this supported by Council? Mayor Sim: Everything has been fully supported. The encampment in the DTES is untenable and we want to deal with the situation in an empathetic

way, and that's what we are going today.

I am following up to advise you on activities along East Hastings Street since on my earlier afternoon update.

The 000, 100, 200 and 300 blocks of East Hastings and Carrall Street have been cleared and the work to clear structures on the 300 block of Main Street will continue until approximately 6:30 pm. As of 6 pm, crews have taken down 67 of 81 structures, removed 49 propane tanks and impounded and stored 42 totes. Engineering crews will return to the area tomorrow with VPD support.

Generally, City crews have seen a great deal of compliance and cooperation from the people sheltering on East Hastings and the distribution of backpacks was appreciated. Slower progress was primarily due to protest activity at site.

The City and its partners, BC Housing and the Ministry of Housing, can confirm there are shelter spaces available tonight for those sheltering along East Hastings. As of 6 pm today, eight people along East Hastings have requested shelter and have been accommodated. Shelter space availability is fluid in nature and we will continue to work with partners to identify additional capacity for those sheltering along East Hastings as it becomes available.

Addi onal media outlets were given access to the encampment area a er 10 am this morning. This was to balance the need to protect peoples' privacy and ensure everyone's safety, with the media's desire to access the working area. The general tone of the media coverage ranged from neutral to nega ve as the day progressed with increased protests in the afternoon. A media roundup follows my email.

Summary of Media Q&A

CityNews - Hana Mae Nassar: Only one media camera was allowed inside the encampment area and City street cameras were turned off at that intersection for a bit of time. Why wasn't there more transparency?

Paul Mochrie: There was an inadvertent technical error where the traffic camera at Main and Hastings was disabled for roughly half hour at approximately 9:15 a.m. Once that came to our attention, we remedied the situation and the cameras are back online now. We are working to provide as much transparency as possible, including a pool camera that is directly accessible to the work that is happening.

Chief Palmer: There is a pool camera down there for media to monitor what's going on. Lots of people down there with smart phones taking video and coverage right now for main stream and social media.

Follow-up question: We saw tension and clashing last time this happened. Any learnings from the last time? Seems like we are doing the same thing over and over again.

Paul Mochrie: The VPDs presence today has been requested by the City. The primary objective is to ensure that our staff doing this work are safe, and that all the people in the neighbourhood remain safe during the day. There is significant amount of criminal activity there from people who are not seeking homes and the emphasis today is on keeping people safe.

CTV - Penny Daflos: We keep hearing from people at the site there is not enough housing and people have no where to go. If you keep kicking people out, aren't they just going to go around the block – what is the plan?

Paul Mochrie: We continue to encourage people to take any option available to come inside. It is safer, connects people with services and gives them the best chance to move on to more permanent housing. This encampment in its current form is unsafe. That is what we have to deal with today and that is not going to solve the issue of homelessness. That is a long-term challenge and we are going to do our best to keep working to resolve that. In the meantime, it's this particular encampment we're focused on.

Follow-up question: The Premier acknowledged there are deplorable conditions in many SROs, yet that is the path towards permanent housing. What is the City's role to make sure these places are habitable?

Paul Mochrie: The SRO housing stock is a very important, particularity for people with low income. Much of that stock is very old, was constructed for a different purpose as hotels, and needs significant reinvestment and redevelopment. That is a very expensive and long term challenge. Not one the City can resolve on our own. In the meantime, the City inspects SROs on an ongoing basis, along with VFRS and SRO owners. We are also working with private SROs to make sure people living there are adequately supported.

CBC: The National – Lyndsay Duncombe: What tactically is different about what is happening on the ground today as opposed in the summer when people were told to leave?

Chief Palmer: Our role is to support City staff and make sure that people are safe and make sure people in the encampment are safe. There has been a deterioration in public safety in the area. We're there to restore some public safety and protect the City workers while they do their job, and we're there at the City's request.

Paul Mochrie: For months, City staff have been enforcing city by-laws and carrying out tasks under the Fire Chiefs Order. That has been relatively small scale, moving a few structures per day. In many cases people have moved their tents voluntarily. Today the effort is to remove the remaining structures and bring the encampment to a close.

Follow-up question: How will you make sure people don't take the problems and dangers you described to another area if they don't have anywhere to go because there isn't enough housing?

Chief Palmer: Once encampments become entrenched they become dangerous and volatile. Living on the street is a risky endeavor. We are there to help them get to a better place and keep the city safe.

Paul Mochrie: The issues we're dealing with here are due to the size and magnitude of this encampment, and it having been entrenched in one place as long as it has. We will continue to support people who are sheltering outdoors, not only in the DTES but across the city. Homelessness is a regional problem. It's not a problem that can be solved in Vancouver or the DTES alone. We will continue working with people who are sheltering outside to keep them safe and look to prevent larger, entrenched encampments.

Globe and Mail – Frances Bula: How many shelter spaces are available? How much new housing is coming online and when? Paul Mochrie: Re: shelter spaces, that's a dynamic picture. Our teams are in touch with BC Housing events day to for the space of the Efforts have been made over the last eight months to preserve shelter options for people on Hastings St, but day-to-day that number fluctuates. Re: housing coming online, over 300 units are coming over the next couple of months.

Glacier Media – Mike Howell: How many people are currently on the street? Is there enough shelter to accommodate them?

Paul Mochrie: That is a fluid number. Today, if everyone who we understand to be homeless wants to take shelter it's likely we would not have sufficient shelter space for everyone. But we know not everyone is not going to take shelter. Many of those people have been offered shelter for months and have declined that option for various reasons. If someone on Hastings wants shelter today and it's not available we will stay connected to get them indoors as quickly as we can.

Follow-up question: You said the goal today is to shut down the encampment, does this extend to Crab Park? If not, when will you deal with Crab Park?

Paul Mochrie: Today's goal is to remove the structures from East Hastings encampment. No, we are not dealing with Crab Park today. The situation there is different. There is an existing court ruling that applies to Crab Park that allows people to maintain structures during the day in one area of the park. The Park Control By-law allows people to shelter in parks overnight if they have no other options. We don't see permanent, long-term encampments as a solution and we're working with the Province to bring that to an end, it's just not what we're dealing with today.

Global News – Crista Dao: How are you going to reconcile wanting people gone, but you don't have space to house them?

Paul Mochrie: We aren't looking for them to be gone. What we need to do today is remove the structures from the Hastings encampment because the safety risks there are so sever. Optimal situation is they voluntarily take down their structure and move their belongings to a location where it is safe and legal to shelter overnight. We would continue to work with them as housing/shelter space comes online.
 Follow-up guestion: Has everyone been offered shelter? How many spaces are accessible for today?

Paul Mochrie: Outreach staff have been on Hastings for months. We've made every possible effort to provide options for people who are there. For various reasons some have turned them down. We're not solving homelessness here today. That's not what this is about. This is about dealing with a very serious public safety issue.

Postmedia - Derrick Penner: How come your efforts to gain cooperation from people haven't worked?

Paul Mochrie: There has been a lot of voluntary departures. Over 600 structures have been moved. Vast majority of those moved upon request. What we face now is that the people who remain are much less incline to cooperate and we need to bring it to a close in a way that is respectful, non-confrontational and resolves the safety issues.

Follow-up question: Mayor Sim said this represents a turning point. When was the turning point reached?

Mayor Sim: There's a different attitude at the City now where all our team members are supported and this is a City-led initiative. We are one unified team that has a common purpose and we want to see better outcomes, especially in the downtown east side. Since the election this year we've identified public safety, mental health and addictions, and supporting our most vulnerable residents as primary concerns of the city.

Second Round

CityNews - Hana Mae Nassar: What are you getting from province to ensure any rehousing is successful?

Mayor Sim: We have conversations with the Province and it's a priority to provide housing stock for all sectors, including supportive housing. With the Province, we approved a number of new housing units to come online in Vancouver. I believe we will start to see improvements on the housing front sooner rather than later.

CTV - Penny Daflos: What is your plan to keep people from considering living in a tent or SRO as affordability gets worse? How will you keep them from being left on the street?

Mayor Sim: At the City of Vancouver, we can work to make it easier to get a permit to build more howsing not have it stop and to make it

more affordable, less costly and faster to build so we can catch up to provide housing for everyone. We are going to Ottawa to lobby for more social housing and co-ops. We continue to have conversations with all levels of government. These are examples of things we're doing in the short term to triage the situation as we look towards longer term solutions.

Globe and Mail – Frances Bula: What is the long-term plan to ensure the encampment doesn't restart on Hastings or another area? Paul Mochrie: Engineering crews will continue the work they do everyday to support people who have erected structures on public spaces, and enforce the Street and Traffic By-Law. There may be more of that work in the short term, as necessary. We may need support from VPD again to ensure everyone is safe.

CityNews - Hana Mae Nassar: How long will this work take? How many staff are down there with police officers?

Paul Mochrie: Our hope is to get this done today in a respectful, measured, non-confrontational way. There might be about 50 city staff there today, but I need to confirm that number.

Chief Palmer: We don't release the exact number, but there are dozens of officers there today.

Glacier Media – Mike Howell: Who made the decision to do this work today?

Mayor Sim: This has been an ongoing issue. Today's work is a City-led initiative, supported by VPD and VFRS.

Follow-up question: So it was the City. Was this supported by Council?

Mayor Sim: Everything has been fully supported. The encampment in the DTES is untenable and we want to deal with the situation in an empathetic way, and that's what we are going today.
