Vaisakhi Festival and Parade this weekend in Vancouver

On Saturday, April 12, thousands of residents and visitors will gather in the heart of South Vancouver to celebrate Vaisakhi, an important religious occasion for the Sikh community.

Vaisakhi celebrates the creation of the Khalsa, a spiritual order founded by Guru Gobind Singh in 1699, a defining moment in Sikh history. Vaisakhi also marks the beginning of the spring harvest in Punjab. The Vancouver Vaisakhi Festival and Parade has been held annually since 1979, with a pause during the pandemic.

"We wish the Sikh community, along with all those joining in the celebrations, a joyful and safe Vaisakhi and Nagar Kirtan," said Mayor Ken Sim. "Vancouver's diversity is the foundation of our strength, vibrancy, and prosperity. This parade encourages all Vancouverites to unite in honouring the rich heritage of the Sikh community and celebrating this inclusive and meaningful event that brings us together."
