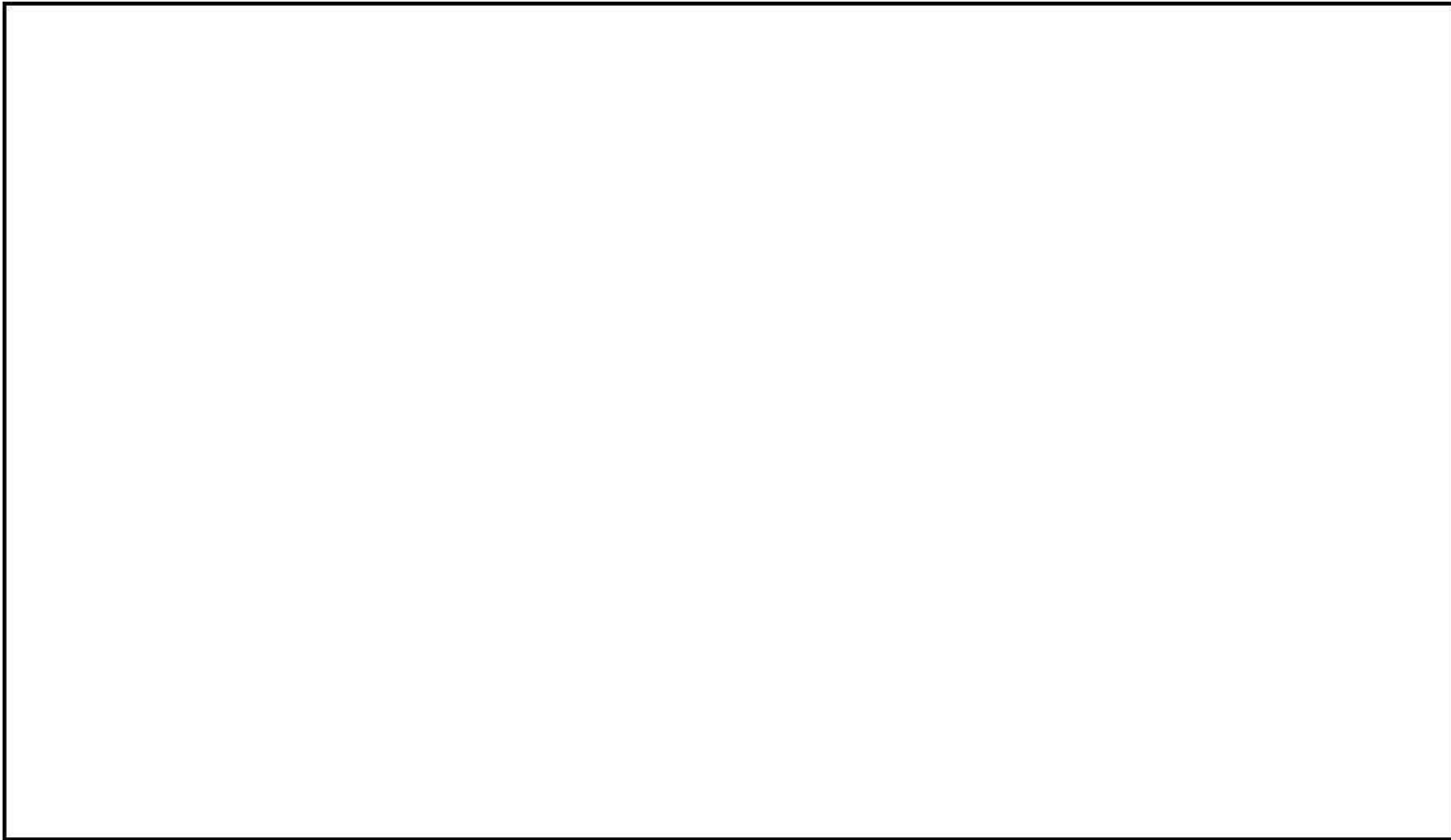

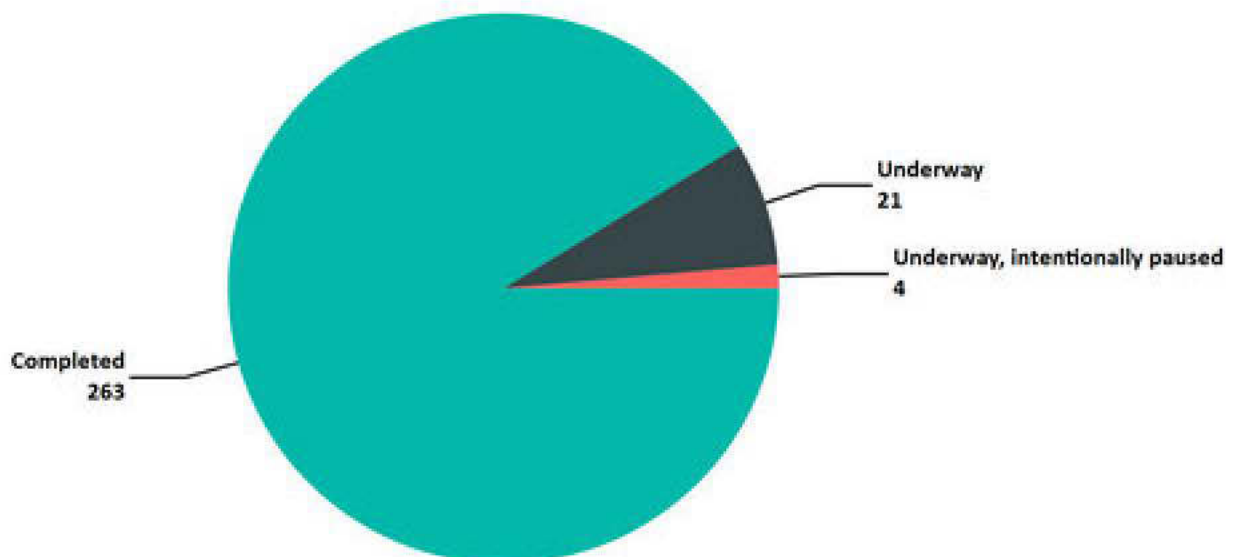
Key Theme by Number of Motions

- provide consistency of messaging to Council with respect to progress on member motions, and
- help Council understand the full picture of all the cumulative member motions they have passed.







The Council Member Motion Tracker is kept updated on SharePoint as new Council Member Motions are passed - the central repository is updated on a regular basis.
