Dear Mayor and Council,

As you may already be aware, On July 17, 2025, Premier Eby announced "a strategic shift to his cabinet in order to centre jobs, the economy and the needs of British Columbians in their communities". The shuffle was intended to signal a targeted realignment of ministerial responsibilities to better reflect the province's current priorities and economic context.

The shuffle involves the following new cabinet roles:

- Ravi Kahlon (MLA – North Delta), Minister of Jobs and Economic Growth;
- Nina Krieger (MLA – Victoria-Swan Lake), Minister of Public Safety and Solicitor General;
- Jessie Sunner (MLA – Surrey-Newton), Minister of Post Secondary Education and Future Skills;
- Christine Boyle (MLA – Vancouver-Little Mountain) , Minister of Housing and Municipal Affairs;
- Diana Gibson (MLA – Oak Bay-Gordon Head), Minister of Citizens' Services;
- Anne Kang (MLA – Burnaby-Deer Lake), Minister of Tourism, Arts, Culture and Sport;
- Spencer Chandra-Herbert (MLA – Vancouver-Burrard), Minister of Indigenous Relations and Reconciliation; and
- Rick Glumac (MLA – Port Moody-Coquitlam), Minister of State for AI and New Technologies.

In addition, the following MLAs were moved into new Parliamentary Secretary roles:

- Amna Shah (MLA – Surrey-City Centre), parliamentary secretary for anti-racism initiatives, mental health and addictions;
- Garry Begg (MLA – Surrey-Guildford), parliamentary secretary for Surrey infrastructure;
- George Chow (MLA – Vancouver-Fraserview), parliamentary secretary for the Downtown Eastside and Chinatown; and
- Paul Choi (MLA – Burnaby-South Metrotown), parliamentary secretary for trade.
