Background

Constructed in 1954, Granville Bridge was originally designed as part of a freeway system that was never built. As a result, it was not accessible and presented a number of challenges for people to walk, bike or roll across the bridge.

In September 2020, Council endorsed the long-term design concept for the Granville Connector to transform the way the bridge is used by creating safer, more convenient access to active transportation and transit, while enabling future improvements.

Construction on the Granville Connector project began in February 2023. Once complete, the Granville Connector will transform the way we use the Granville Bridge by allowing safe, accessible, and convenient walking and cycling across the bridge.
