Purpose

This simple SharePoint tool maintains a list of all approved and referred Council Member Motions and corresponding status.

It will:

- serve as a central repository of all current Council member motions – a single list we can all work with,
- provide Council, the City Leadership Team and staff a clear view of the status of the work being planned/done in response to each approved motion,
- help staff ensure efforts on related motions are appropriately coordinated,
- provide consistency of messaging to Council with respect to progress on member motions, and
- help Council understand the full picture of all the cumulative member motions they have passed.

Reporting Process

The Council Member Motion Tracker is kept updated on SharePoint as new Council Member Motions are passed - the central repository is updated on a regular basis.

Staff Leads will provide updates on the status of work completed or anticipated for each motion assigned to them on a quarterly basis, via an online form provided on SharePoint. Please note, for completed motions staff have not been asked to provide further information beyond the 'complete' status.

Following this, a quarterly Council Member Motion Tracker Report will be generated and distributed to the City Leadership Team, Council and Staff Leads.

This quarterly report contains:

- 1) Council Member Motion Dashboard - high level metrics to provide a holistic view of the status of current Council Member Motions;
- 2) Council Member Motion Dashboard (November 2018 to November 2022) – to show high level metrics and progress on motions passed by previous Council.
- 3) Council Member Motion Report - full list of approved and referred Council Member Motions and corresponding status updates, sorted by date in Council.
