Please see the attached memo from Lon LaClaire regarding the **Adanac Street Upgrades (Boundary Rd to Rupert St) Engagement**. A short summary of the memo is as follows:

Purpose

This memo provides an overview of upcoming engagement for the Adanac Street Upgrades between Boundary Road and Rupert Street.

Project Overview

The Adanac Street project is an 800-metre street upgrade between Rupert Street and Boundary Road. The goal of the project is to improve safety, comfort and accessibility for all road users. The project will deliver upgraded infrastructure for walking, cycling, transit, and vehicle access, ensuring the corridor supports both local access and regional mobility needs.

Previous Community Feedback

During our 2023 Hastings-Sunrise (Adanac Overpass) Traffic Calming Plan engagement, we heard support for keeping the Adanac Overpass open for all road users. To ensure Adanac Street felt safe, comfortable and accessible for all users, we proposed a plan to upgrade Adanac Street between Boundary Road and Rupert Street. Given the route will continue to carry higher than typical vehicle volumes for a local street, the proposed plan included protected bike

lanes, raised crossings, improved transit stops and clearer separation between parked vehicles and sidewalk spaces.

Through engagement, community members shared feedback on the proposed design. Feedback included suggestions for improving crossings, cycling experiences, vehicle access, parking and more. This feedback informed updates to the current design. Further details of our 2023 engagement are available at shapeyourcity.ca/adanac-overpass.

Updated Design

The updated design includes key changes such as retaining more on street parking, improving safety and comfort at the Adanac Street and Rupert Street intersection, and accommodating crossings for people cycling at key intersections. See Appendix A for the updated project design.

Upcoming Community Engagement & Next Steps

In March 2026, community members will receive notification letters inviting them to share feedback about the updated design. In addition to a short online survey, we will conduct stakeholder meetings and door knocking. In particular, we will be seeking feedback on:

- Curbside regulations (e.g., loading zones)
- Signage/wayfinding (e.g., directional signs)
- Landscaping (e.g., planting, seating)
- Minor design considerations (e.g., curb ramps)

After engagement, staff will refine the design and begin implementation in 2027. We will continue to share project updates with Council. Please contact me directly if you have any questions.

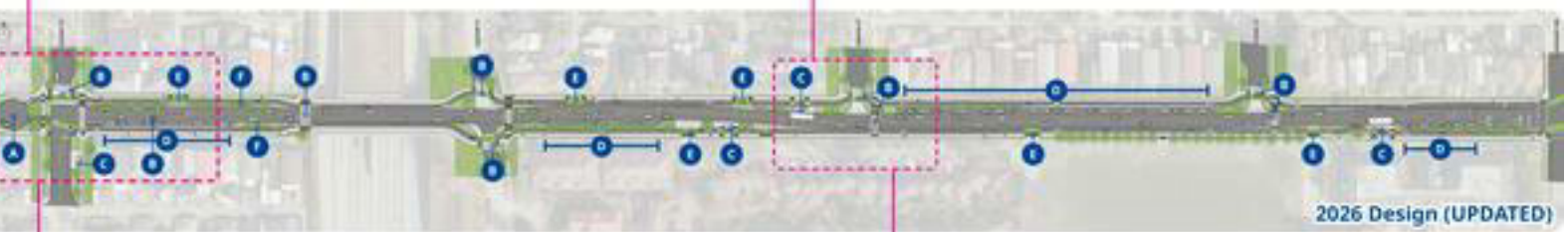
