What is the rezoning of 2030 Barclay Street?

The City of Vancouver has received an application to rezone the 2030 address of Barclay Street, in the heart of the West End. Introducing a mid-block 25-storey hotel tower with 248 rooms in a quiet residential neighbourhood.

The hotel, with its traffic, noisy street-level outdoor restaurant patio, and rooftop party pool offering food and liquor service, will be very noisy and disruptive to the quiet enjoyment of West End residences.

How does this impact the West End?

This project would be outside the zoning and is simply another developer seeking to maximize their profits, with no regard for the character of the West End Neighbourhood. The rezoning of 2030 Barclay Street would:


- Drastically alter the neighbourhood character we cherish
- Increase congestion and traffic, straining local infrastructure
- Transform a quiet neighbourhood into a de facto noisy commercial zone

What's at stake for Vancouver?

Allowing this development represents a profound threat to the liveability, safety, and established character of our residential neighbourhood. This proposal disregards existing policies and fundamental community expectations on tenancy rights, such as quiet enjoyment. Approving this hotel tower will open the floodgates to relentless high-rise construction and ignore the zoning that protects the West End and other residential neighbourhoods. The hotel's unacceptable scale and density will cause severe privacy impacts, reduced sunlight, and exacerbate wind and canyon effects due to insufficient separation.
