

Register in advance to vote by Tuesday, August 18

Are you registered to vote?

The Vancouver Election Office is preparing the voters list for the 2026 Vancouver Election to be held on October 17. The voters list includes all registered Vancouver voters, their names and residential addresses. Elections BC provides the list to the Vancouver Election Office. Everyone who voted in the last provincial election is automatically on Vancouver's voters list and does not need to register again.

Eligible resident voters registered with Elections BC by August 18 will be sent a voter information card before the election. Please make sure your information is up to date, including whether you moved or changed your name recently. Advance registration for City of Vancouver non-resident property electors (NRPE) will close on August 25.

To register or to update your information, go to **eregister.electionsbc.gov.bc.ca**.

Eligible voters in Vancouver must meet all the following requirements:

- Be 18 years old or older on Election Day (October 17, 2026)
- Be a Canadian citizen
- Have lived in B.C. for at least six months immediately before the day of registration
- Reside in Vancouver (no minimum days required)
- Not be disqualified by law from voting

Eligible voters may also register when they vote, whether you vote in person or by mail.

Voters who reside on UBC Lands and the University Endowment Lands are eligible to vote only for Vancouver School Board Trustees.

Voters list available for inspection

A copy of the voters list will be available for public inspection between 8:30 am and 5 pm, Monday to Friday (excluding statutory holidays) at the Vancouver Election Office (305 West 8th Avenue) and at the City Clerk's Department, Vancouver City Hall (453 West 12th Avenue) from September 1 to October 17, 2026,

Before looking at the list, you must sign a statement agreeing to only use it for voter and election purposes under the Vancouver Charter, and not to copy or use it for anything else.

Remove or hide your personal information in the voters list

You may request that the City remove or hide your address and/or name on the voters list to protect your privacy or security. Anyone that requests for their information to be removed or hidden before September 11 at 4 pm will not have their information provided to candidates. Find out more at **vancouver.ca/vote**.

Objecting to the registration of a voter

A qualified voter can object to another voter listed on the voters list by submitting a signed objection in writing to the Chief Election Officer at **election@vancouver.ca**. The deadline for submitting an objection is September 11 at 4 pm.
