RE: 49th Avenue Transit Improvements

Dear resident or business owner,

We are writing to provide an update about the bus lanes on 49th Avenue between Fraser Street and Boundary Road. These changes will help buses move smoothly through traffic and support faster and more reliable bus service for thousands who take transit on the corridor every day.

Starting in late summer 2026, the City plans to begin installing bus lanes on both sides of 49th Avenue.

- Installation will be completed in phases
- The first phase will take place in the section between Knight Street and Kerr Street after roadway paving is complete
- Additional phases are planned to be installed in 2026 and 2027
- The City will coordinate this work with other projects in the area, where possible

New bus lane hours (see map on page 2)

- Fraser St to Tyne Street: 7am to 7pm, Monday to Saturday
- Tyne Street to Boundary Road: 7am to 7pm, 7 days a week

What we heard

In May 2026, we asked the public and businesses for feedback on the proposed bus lane hours along 49th Avenue between Fraser and Boundary Road. Feedback highlighted several priorities, including maintaining access to parking, addressing accessibility considerations, extending bus lane operating hours, and reducing delays caused by left-turn movements in the area.

What we're doing

Based on feedback received, we plan to add loading zones on some side streets next to 49th Avenue where the need is greatest. Loading zones can be used for up to 3 minutes to load and unload passengers or up to 30 minutes to load and unload goods.

Staff will also look at areas where permit parking zones would support residents of 49th Avenue and continue to work with residents with specific accessibility needs.
