If I am reading the plans correctly, it seems that this new scheme has lost a connection through the northern edge of the site to a future pedestrian connection that will link to Dunsmuir, which is unfortunate given the scheme's potential to forge more connectivity to the city. This is contradicted by the plans and diagrams on PP. 19/20 that shows it still present. Following this theme of mid-block connectivity...if I am reading the plans correctly on the ground floor plan (p.34), the plan suggests pedestrian connections off of Beatty but the NE one seems to have a wall blocking it and the other one is through doors and so does this mean that they'll be periodically locked? I understand the need for security, etc. but want to encourage the DP process to ensure that those mid-block connectors are still available during the day. It seems that there aren't any midblock connectors on the Cambie side, except through programmed spaces. Given the scheme's encouragement to forge stronger eventual links to a revised plaza at the QE, I find that side unexplored in terms of forging an entry that can respond to that larger urban initiative. If I was designing the project I would have situated the entire courtyard main entry at the corner of Georgia and Cambie, rather than the mid block choice because, although it reaffirms the classicism of the project (being on centre), in truth it faces one of the most unappealing buildings in the city (the Sandman Hotel) and does not address a future plaza coming in from the west (the aforementioned QE).

The Gallery in Larwell Park will become an energy bridge between the traditional east and west geographical constructs of our city and accessible by transit with a Sky Train stop a block away. Joining with the plaza activity at the Queen Elizabeth Playhouse, the Gallery can be a new centre of gravity and public engagement. Art, design and creative enterprises are at the core of Vancouver's future. There has been an enormous effort by many people for over 20 years now to move into a real 21st century, purpose-built facility. I write to you as a citizen who knows the project well, having followed it since I was on the Board of Directors (2000-2002). I am also a well known visual artist (Governor General's Award in Visual and Media Arts, 2017) and educator in our city. I also know 'back of house', as I had a two

person show with Emily Carr (b1871) in 2014-15 that drew 160,000 visitors. From my many roles, I know first hand how we will love the new Gallery. There is careful attention to the flow from room to room for meaningful experiences by viewers; a hallmark of vast experience by the design architects. Gallery on the Larwill Park site on West Georgia Street. This new location will become a destination that will enhance its immediate surroundings and with its close proximity to the Skytrain will provide easy access to more attendees and with serve to enhance this growing cultural precinct. Over many years, I have watched as the Vancouver Art Gallery has grown, not only in local, and international significance but also in its role as a key cultural institution within our city. It is clear this important cultural centre has outgrown its current facility and is in desperate need of a new building. I was fortunate to be included on an early Artist Advisory Committee in 2015 and in that capacity, met with the original Herzog & de Meuron architectural team to review and comment on their original design concept. More recently, the Committee was presented with the proposed building program and I was impressed by the architect's care and attention to the variety of ways that historical and contemporary art will be displayed in order to maximize its impact while adhering to international museum standards. I love how the latest Perkins + Will design feels warmer - with its copper colour and the use of wood creates a more friendly approach at street level. This new Vancouver Art Gallery will help Vancouver continue to be an internationally recognized world-class city for art and this new Gallery will be a beacon of a contemporary social infrastructure that our city and province will be proud of.


